

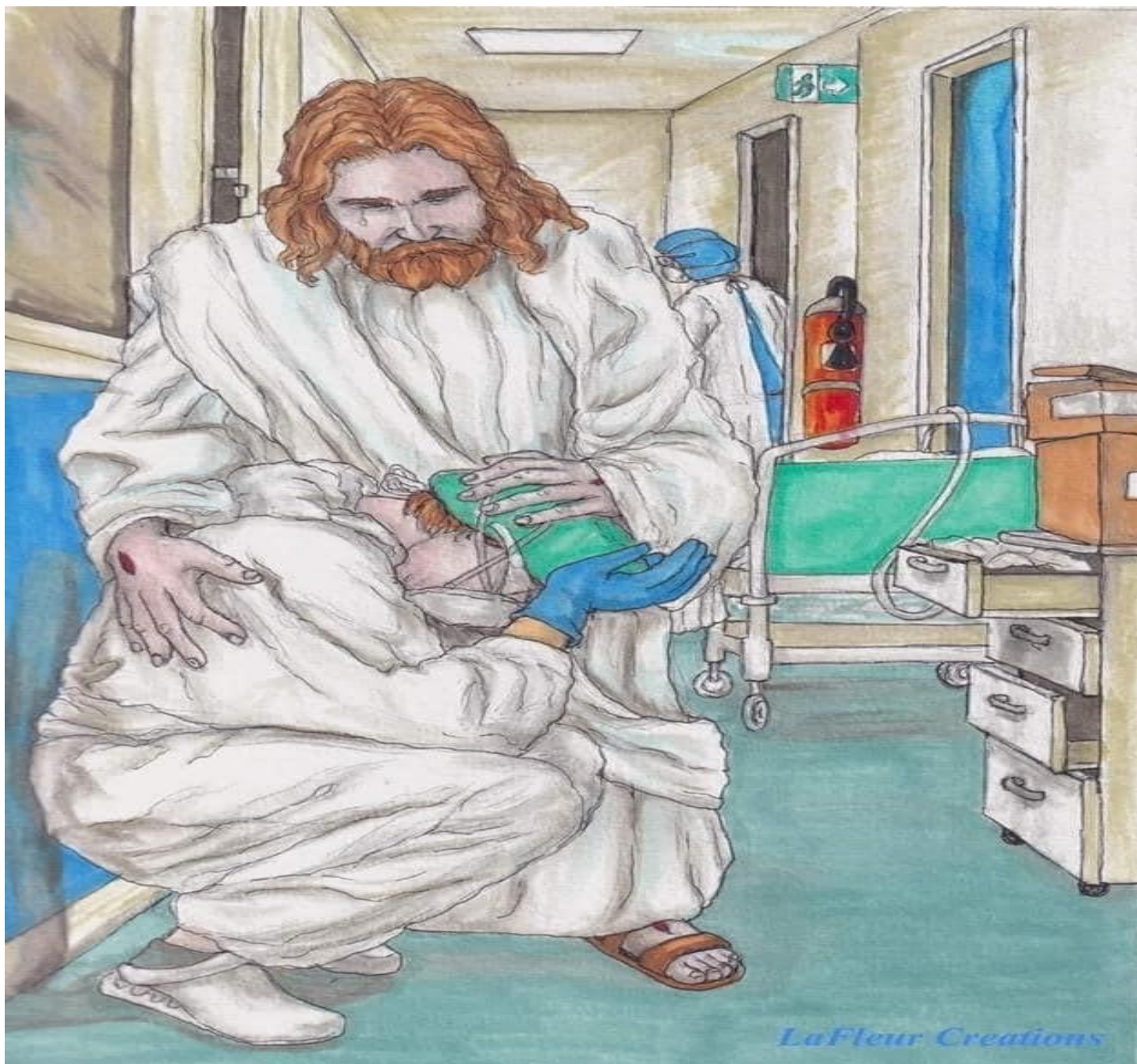

As per the directives of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is not to be celebrated in **any scheduled or communal way** out of concern for your health and safety. Those in need of the sacrament should contact the Parish Office. If there is a case of emergency and necessity for the sacrament of Confession, please reach out to the parish – 631.878.0009 and one of our priests will return your call as quickly as we can. **YOU DO NOT NEED TO LEAVE YOUR NAME.** Simply leave a phone # and a priest will return your call. The priest on duty will set a time to meet you in the church building to hear your confession (face to face or behind the screen). There are not and will not be any scheduled times for confessions in the near future.

Come to the quiet!

The church building and Seton Chapel (located in the white convent building) are open from

Sunday—Friday: 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. + Saturday: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

for private prayer. No devotions or communal prayers are scheduled or are to take place during these times.

All who visit must wash their hands in the bathroom before entering the worship space and keep a safe social distance from others.

No more than ten people may be in either space at any time. As this situation develops, this may change. Please follow SJE Social Media for the latest updates.

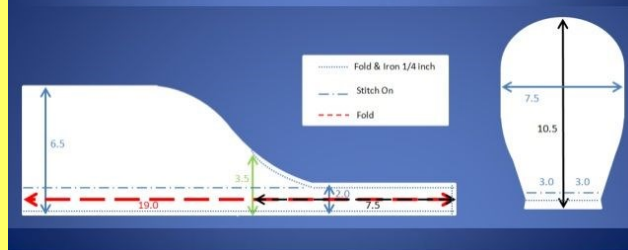

MAKE A SCRUB CAP!

You will need:

Paper to make the pattern – all measurements are in inches
9 inches of cotton fabric – standard 44 inch width
3 inches of elastic band
Black and red thread
Please wash, dry and iron fabric before you start cutting – it will shrink



First, you will need to make a pattern. To put the cap together, using a sewing machine is recommended.

SIGNS OF EASTER HOPE!

We had been hoping...

HOPE FULFILLED

Dear Parish Family

I really miss praying with you. I am grateful to preside at Mass and pray with you virtually and even, a few times, have celebrated Mass alone for your intentions. While the Mass is the summit and source of our worship whether there be one or one million present, there is something missing when we are not together.

I know the loss of the public celebration of the Mass is devastating to so many of you who are reading the bulletin. You know the power of the risen and glorified Christ in the Eucharist, in the Word shared, in the assembly gathered and in the priest himself. These days of “spiritual communion” are beautiful acts but it is not the same. It would be foolish to suggest otherwise. We are all feeling the loss.

First, I hope this invites us to a place of solidarity. Someone suggested this consideration to me. In these days, we link with peoples all over the world where priests come only once a month or a year. There are very few opportunities for the celebration of the sacraments—Mass, confession, anointing, etc. Maybe as we go through this time of sickness and sacrifice, of fasting and even frustration we can unite and link more closely with those who face some of these challenges every day of their lives? Does it make all better? Of course not. Might it make us more grateful for the gifts we do have? You bet!

Second, whenever I pray with this Sunday’s gospel, I am always touched that Jesus appears to a group (more than one) on their journey. He hears their story, their pain, their agony. He hears them say, “We were hoping...” and acknowledges their disappointment and despair. He moves them so much so they can’t see him leaving. After breaking open God’s Word they beg, “Stay with us”. In their longing, in their sadness, in their desperation, he responds. He offers them the gift of life that satisfies everything—the gift of Himself. Then, it clicks. It all comes together—burning hearts, opened eyes, moving feet, evangelizing mouths. They go forth with a willingness to give of themselves, to bless, to be broken because that have encountered Him.

Aware of that desire to “stay” with Him and to have our “hearts burning”, we are inviting you to come for a eucharistic blessing next Sunday, Good Shepherd Sunday. While this blessing is not the same as the celebration of the Mass or a replacement, it is one way for us to connect to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament in these days. I invite you next Sunday, beginning at 10 a.m., to come for an experience of prayer that concludes with the eucharistic blessing. Take time before you come to read the Sunday scriptures, even pray with us at Mass that morning or night before, and then come to our parking lot.

As you did with the house blessings, please share this information with your neighbors and family members and friends. Invite someone you live near to follow you to be part of this brief morning of prayer and blessing. I think they’ll be grateful if you did.

I laid out the details on the next page. In this challenging time, please respect all of the guidelines listed there, particularly remaining in your car the entire time you are on the grounds. You will receive more information when you come here on Sunday. We will be there to greet you and cannot wait to see you!

I find myself like those disciples these days. “I was hoping...” this and that in these days. I have stopped. I trust that just as Jesus came to assure them on the road to Emmaus, he is doing the same for us. May our experience of this unique Easter inspire us to cry out “Were not our hearts burning...” when we encounter Him in the many ways He is making himself known.

Please pray for me.

Prayer and Eucharistic Blessing



The words of 23rd psalm, a psalm encouraged by the Church when we adore the eucharist and the psalm prayed at Mass on the 4th Sunday of Easter inspires us to follow our path to the Lord. On Sunday, May 3rd, between 10 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., all are invite to come to the right path—the path that leads to our parish and to a eucharistic blessing.



Here how this will work:

- You may only come in a car so we respect all social distancing guidelines.
 - You must remain in your car at all times.
- Enter the church parking lot using the John Street entrance (across from the school building).
DO NOT ENTER USING the Main Street or Ocean Avenue entrances.

- You will be invited to pray as you enter the park-

ing lot assisted by members of our staff and the clergy. You'll be asked to follow on the right path (even if it means going against the arrows in the parking lot!) with prayer and reflection.

- The path will end at the summit of our lives—the Eucharist. The priests will offer eucharistic blessings to each car as it passes by.
- You will then be asked to pray a Glory Be and exit out onto Ocean Avenue.

Here's how you and your family or group of friends or ministry can help! We are asking each family, ministry, individual or group of friends to begin taking care of a part of our parish's grounds by planting and maintaining that area for our parish and school!

It's as easy as 1...2...3...4...5...

1. Talk to your family or group of friends!
2. Decide where you would ideally like to have a piece of the land (Church, School, The Barn, Rectory, Convent). This year, we want to add spaces by the Thrift Shop and the Stations of the Cross (behind the school). Please understand we may not be able to meet everyone's request for a space!
3. Consider if there is someone you would like to plant in honor of—perhaps a member of your family or a parishioner or member of the school community—living or deceased.
4. Turn in this form or email (even better) your response to Sarah Dern at sdern11@gmail.com no later than April 26, 2020.
5. Look for directions and a specific spot assignment in the weeks ahead. With precautions in place for safety and security, we are uncertain of the exact date families will be able to come on the grounds. For now, we want to get as many set up as possible. Once we receive an all clear or permission for limited planting to happen, we will contact you via phone or email.

Yes! We are looking to plant some seeds (and plants and flowers) of hope) in the Easter season!

PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.

Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals, when they resume. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can leave a donation in the Parish Office.



CONFESSIONS DURING EASTER



As we go through these days of Lent and Easter, we feel the absence of the sacraments – especially our communal celebration of the Eucharist. So many of us long for the Sacrament of Penance too! As one mom said to me, “After this week of living with my family, I’ll be in confession for hours!” During these days of social distancing, regularly scheduled confessions, drive thru confessions, etc. are not permitted. Confessions can also not be heard via a cell phone (even at a distance or from your home). These are tough times, indeed. Can I share with you the words of Pope Francis (20 March 2020) building on the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

“I know that many of you go to confession before Easter... Many will say to me: ‘But Father...I can’t leave the house and I want to make my peace with the Lord. I want Him to embrace me... How can I do that unless I find a priest?’. Do what the catechism says. It’s very clear. If you don’t find a priest to go to confession, speak to God. He’s your Father. Tell Him the truth: ‘Lord, I did this and this and this. Pardon me.’ Ask His forgiveness with all your heart with an act of contrition, and promise Him, ‘afterward I will go to confession.’ You will return to God’s grace immediately. You yourself can draw

near, as the catechism teaches us, to God’s forgiveness, without having a priest at hand.”

Furthermore, the Apostolic Penitentiary released the following note in March:

Where the individual faithful find themselves in the painful impossibility of receiving sacramental absolution, it should be remembered that perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, beloved above all things, expressed by a sincere request for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to have recourse, as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones (cf. CCC, no. 1452).

Can you and I try find some peace in these days from the words of the Holy Father and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1451-52)? IN NO WAY DOES THIS TAKE AWAY OUR NEED (including mine) FOR SACRAMENTAL CONFESSION. Let’s pray for God’s mercy in these days and as soon as we possibly can prepare to celebrate the sacraments regularly again – especially for that mom!

THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS

The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (*Opus Dei*), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer. At times the dialogue is between the Church or individual soul and God; at times it is a dialogue among the members of the Church; and at times it is even between the Church and the world...The dialogue is always held, however, in the presence of God and using the words and wisdom of God. Each of the five canonical Hours includes selections from the Psalms that culminate in a scriptural proclamation. The two most important or hinge Hours are Morning and Evening Prayer. These each include a Gospel canticle: the Cantic of Zechariah from Luke 1:68-79 for Morning Prayer (known as the *Benedictus*), and the Cantic of Mary from Luke 1:46-55 for Evening Prayer (known as the *Magnificat*). The Gospel canticle acts as a kind of meditative extension of the scriptural proclamation in light of the Christ event. Morning and Evening Prayer also include intercessions that flow from the scriptural proclamation just as the Psalms prepare for it.

In the Hours, the royal priesthood of the baptized is exercised, and this sacrifice of praise is thus connected to the sacrifice of the Eucharist, both preparing for and flowing from the Mass.

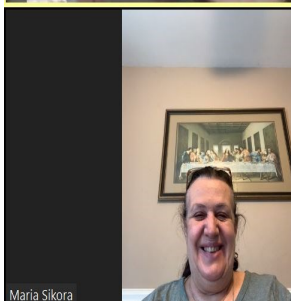
FAITH FORMATION
