A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

Gospel Reflection for the Second Sunday of Easter (John 20:19-31)

The Power behind our Lord's Resurrection

Today's feast, Divine Mercy Sunday, marks the conclusion of another Easter Octave. The Easter Octave is eight days in length. It is one long Easter Sunday. This is how important the feast of Easter is. Easter is everything! Easter changed the course of history. It marked the beginning of Redemption. It marked the beginning of a new era filled with hope, heaven without end! It signifies God's complete love for humanity that was fulfilled and nailed permanently to the cross for all ages. Because of Easter, we have eternal life. Easter points to eternity.

It is our gateway to paradise. Easter reminds us that our Lord is truly risen, risen forever!

Today's gospel only reassures us of our greatest hope. We see how faithful Jesus is to His disciples when He reappeared to them shortly after His resurrection from the dead. He promised them at the Last Supper Discourse, that He would return and bring them joy. Well, that is exactly what happened and what was needed on the Third Day. Unlike our Easter celebrations, this first Easter for His disciples was quite the opposite. They locked themselves in the dark upper room behind closed doors out of fear of the religious and Roman authorities

because of their association with Jesus. They feared for their own lives. They feared crucifixion because of the humiliation that one experiences along with a slow agonizing death. One suffered until one died on the cross after hours of shallow breathing. No wonder why the disciples locked themselves in the upper room out of fear of the authorities who waited to end the Jesus narrative of hope and resurrection.

I think it is too easy for us to intellectualize the love that God has for humanity found in Jesus instead of taking the time to internalize all the suffering that Jesus had to endure for our redemption. But once we really begin to internalize and reflect on the mystery of His saving and redeeming love nailed permanently to the cross for all ages, our lives begin to change for the better. Our outlook on life and our approach to life itself is so much more joyful and rewarding. We see life from a

whole new perspective with eternity in sight! We begin to appreciate that great treasure that God has in store for us, eternity without end!

Moreover, we see in today's gospel how merciful and forgiving He was towards His disciples. Instead of being upset or angry with them for abandoning Him at the foot of the cross when He needed them the most, He only informed them of their greatest hope. He only reassured them in His risen and glorified state that He was truly alive and risen forever! He said, "Peace be with you. It is I." Instead of

saying, "Where were you when I needed you the most?", He brought them peace and the forgiveness of sins. He said, "Look at the wounds in my hands and my feet." Here Jesus was only reassuring them and all people of all ages who would come to believe in His resurrection, that He was the same Jesus, the same person, they knew all along. He wanted them to know that He was different someone unrecognizable, but He Himself. The same Lord who was once crucified and now risen for our sake. St. Thomas Aguinas speaks of the Lord's wounds as "trophies" of His victory over death. They represent our greatest hope that we

too will rise again and share in the fullness of our Lord's resurrection on the last day. They signify and remind us of our full share in our Lord's risen and glorified state when the end of time comes.

Easter reminds us that from death comes new life. Easter brings us new hope. Easter is the fulfillment of all our hopes and longings found in the Risen Lord. What we see and witness again during this new Easter celebration, which is connected to that first Easter celebration, is the impact that their encounter with the risen and glorified Lord had in their lives. We see how the disciples, in just a matter of a few seconds, went from being fearful to fearless. Hopeless to hope-filled and joyless to joy-filled. This encounter with the risen and glorified Lord changed them forever and their whole outlook on life. Because of their personal encounter with the Risen Lord, they were on the path to evangelization in proclaiming





Christ to the world, that He is alive and risen! This encounter with the Risen Lord allowed them to walk in the newness of life with the spirit of the Risen Lord close by their side.

Hopefully during this new Easter celebration, we can learn from this gospel narrative. This Narrative reassured Resurrection disciples that God was with them and faithful to His promise! We have eternal life because of the Easter mysteries. We have our Easter faith today because of these first disciples who shared their experience of the Risen Lord. Hopefully, during this new Easter season we can grow in our faith and be strengthened and renewed in our hope of our own redemption and the resurrection of our own bodies...that like Jesus, we too will be the same person when we rise from the dead, not someone different but our true selves. In other words, Easter enables us to reflect on the power of our Lord's resurrection and its universal implications for all of humanity who come to believe in Jesus and the Easter mysteries over time. Easter enables us to live again and to believe again so that, like those first disciples, we too can grow in our faith and understanding of the power behind our Lord's resurrection within our own lives and sharing in the fullness of life with God.

Together, during this new Easter season, let us pray for Pope Francis that God may grant Him eternal rest from his labors. His love for us was tireless and extraordinary. Let us join with the entire Church that God may grant him peace and mercy. How beautiful it was to witness his strength and his love for us during his illness and how important it was for him to be with us to celebrate this new Easter before his passing the following day! How blessed we were to have a loving pope who served the Lord faithfully! Let us pray to the Holy Spirit that the Lord will guide the College of Cardinals in electing us a new pope who will represent our Lord and His love for us as the new Vicar of Christ here on earth. Let us pray for one another for a renewal of faith in the power of our Lord's resurrection during this Easter celebration...and join the early disciples in proclaiming to the world that the tomb is empty and Jesus is alive and truly risen!

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 18, 2025 and concludes Sunday, April 27, 2025 – the Second Sunday of Easter – the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This novena is another way for us to reach out – or better yet – allow Jesus to reach out to us with the hand of mercy and compassion.

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Let us ask Christ for the gift of mercy. Let it engulf us and penetrate us. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet His love and mercy in the sacrament's let us feel His closeness and tenderness, and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness, and love." - Pope Francis

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"God exists is the real message of Easter." Those are the words of Pope Benedict XVI that I was inspired by as I read them this past week. I still remember from my catechism days in religious education back in the early 1950s: God created us to know Him, love Him, and to with him forever happy heaven." How true those words are and how they come alive as we reflect on Easter for fifty days. God created us in His very image out of pure, unconditional love. He has entrusted us to each other as well as the planet we live on. powerfully and clearly revealed His life and love for us through Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we see divine love is life giving, life renewing, life sustaining, and eternal. The fifty days of the Easter season is our time to look beyond where we are, to give thanks to who and what got us here, and to embrace the hope that we are invited to be with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and one another forever. There is no human way we can make that happen. All we have to do is to humbly express our wonder and awe in the words we pray as the Host that is the Body of Christ is held up at Mass at Communion time: "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my should shall be healed." No, I am not worthy. Love is never love if I think or feel I have earned or deserved it - Love is a pure gift. What is the Word that makes the words "my soul shall be healed" a reality. It is not a spoken word or printed word, but God Himself in Jesus Christ: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:1-5)

To embrace the gift of who we are through God's love and mercy is to become God's love and mercy. If I am not God's



love and mercy, then there will always be the feeling and reality that something is missing. That "missing something" is an obstruction caused by anger, disappointment, sinfulness, and self-willed ignorance and isolation.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. God's mercy is far more than the forgiveness of our sins - it is the life-giving wisdom, presence and commitment of God's love in His all-embracing wisdom, mercy, and joy. To see God's glory is to be embraced, enlightened, enabled, encouraged, and inspired in the very depths of our minds and hearts. As much as we might "feel too busy" to pray, even more God is joyfully waiting to lift us up with His loving, merciful eternal life-giving presence.

I offer Psalm 121 and its prayer for your reflection:

I lift up my eyes to the mountains; from where shall come my help?
My help shall come from the Lord who made heaven and earth.
May he never allow you to stumble!
Let him sleep not, your guard.
No, he sleeps not nor slumbers,
Israel's guard.

The Lord is your guard and your shade; at your right side he stands.

By day the sun shall not smite you nor the moon in the night.

The Lord will guard you from evil, he will guard your soul.

The Lord will guard your going and coming both now and for ever. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, you have prepared a quiet place for us in your Father's eternal home. Watch over our welfare on this perilous journey, shade us from the burning heat of day, and keep our lives free of evil until the end.


