



## New Appointment for SJE's Former Pastor

## **Congratulations Fr. Walter!**

Dear Parish Family:

As I processed out of the 11 a.m. Easter Sunday Mass, I was greeted (and surprised) by a friendly face—Fr. Walter Kedjierski. He had stopped in to see all that was happening here on his way to or from celebrating Mass in another parish. It was awesome to see the throngs of parishioners who huddled around him to welcome him back and expressed how much they missed his presence here.

When I first came to St. John's to visit on March 15, 2016, I met Fr. Walter for the first time. From that first day until this one, I have been in awe of his gentleness, humility, holiness and kindness. This parish was truly blessed to be shepherded by him for the six years he served here. You might recall, Bishop Murphy asked Father Walter to take leave of SJE to become the Vice-Rectory of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception and the Director of the Diaconate Formation Program. Last Fall, he was named the Rector of the seminary.



I have reached out to Fr. Walter and am hoping we will be able to celebrate with him here at St. John's. His assignment in Washington D.C. begins on June 3rd so time is tight but we are going to see what we can work out. Below is part of the official press release announcing his appointment.

## Rev. Walter Kedjierski Named as Executive Director of Secretariat of Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops

Rev. Walter Kedjierski of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York has been appointed as Executive Director of the Secretariat of Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), based in Washington D.C.

Fr. Kedjierski will begin the new position effective June 3, 2019. Msgr. Brian Bransfield, USCCB General Secretary, made the appointment.

"Fr. Kedjierski brings to the Conference an abundance of knowledge and experience in the realm of ecumenical and interreligious dialogue, both at the institutional and the personal levels," said Msgr. Bransfield. "I am very grateful to Fr. Kedjierski for accepting this important position in service to the bishops and to the Conference. I am equally grateful to the Most Reverend John O. Barres, Bishop of Rockville Centre, for his kind consideration of the needs of the Conference and the Church in the United States."

Since June 2017, Fr. Kedjierski has served as Rector/President of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, New York, where he first served as Vice Rector and Director of Diaconate Formation, as well as Director of the Sacred Heart Institute for the Continuing Formation of Clergy. Father Kedjierski is also the Director of the Diocese's Office of Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Affairs, where he served from 2007 to 2010 as Associate Ecumenical officer in charge of Relations with Muslims and Other Religious groups, and in which role he is a member of the Catholic Association of Diocesan Ecumenical and Interreligious Officers (CADEIO), the Long Island Council of Churches, and the Long Island Multi-Faith Forum. Father Kedjierski was a member of the board of trustees of the Inter-Faith Center of the Islamic Center of Long Island, in Westbury, NY, for three years. He has participated in sessions of the USCCB's dialogue with the Orthodox Union of Rabbis in New York and facilitated numerous ecumenical and inter-religious dialogues, the latest being a dialogue on non-violence this past fall with Indian Hindu scholar Swami Nikhileswarananda.

Fr. Kedjierski attended the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, graduating with a Master of Divinity in May of 2002. After his ordination to the priesthood on June 8, 2002, he served in parish ministry until June 2016. In May 2011 he earned an Ed.D. in Inter-faith and Ecumenical Education from the Graduate Theological Foundation in Mishawaka, Indiana, and in August 2016, he earned his Ph.D. in Dogmatic/Spiritual Theology from the Graduate Theological Foundation's Foundation House at Oxford University Program.

# **DIVINE MERCY NOVENA**and PROCESSION SUNDAY, April 27, 2019

We are in the midst of the days of the Divine Mercy Novena, which began on Good Friday. Pope Saint John Paul the Great said, "There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy ...which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."



In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be made available to those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena. Our special activity schedule for Divine Mercy Sunday – April 28th is as follows:

- -12PM Parish Mass with the Solemn Blessing of the Image of Divine Mercy
- -Eucharistic Procession to Seton Chapel immediately following 12PM Mass
- **-Solemn Exposition** of the Blessed Sacrament in Seton Chapel from 1-4PM with Confessions available. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3PM, the Hour of Mercy.

- The East End Holy Hour will be held.

Let's pray that for those who are able and so desire, this devotion may inspire a deeper conversion to the ways of the Lord. We also offer additional time for Eucharistic Exposition in Seton Chapel from 8 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. (taking place in between our two daily Masses).

## A Simple Guide to Online Donations for New Users

### **HOW DO I LOG IN?**

The Login button is located in the top-right corner of the site. If this is your first visit to the site, you will not log in until you have submitted your first transaction.

Once your first donation or payment has been submitted you will receive a log-in email, providing a temporary link to set your password. Use the link in the email to **complete your user account** by establishing your secure password. Once completed, you will have access to all of your donation or payment information and can make changes at any time.

## **HOW DO I MAKE A RECURRING DONATION?**

Making a donation or payment is extremely simple. First, click on an individual collection. There will be two options: Recurring Donation or Payment and One Time Donation or Payment. We will review both options.

To begin a recurring donation or payment, you will first choose an amount and then select the donation frequency from the options provided.



You will then decide when to start and end your recurring donation or payment. You can choose to start your transaction right away or at a later date of your choosing. You can also choose a date for this recurrence to end.



Now you will select the payment source for your donations. Choose the payment type from the options provided, then enter your payment information.





Fill in your basic contact information.



Check the "I Agree" box and click Create Your Recurring Transaction button to authorize the donation.



### **HOW DO I MAKE A ONE-TIME DONATION?**

Click on a collection of your choice, then select the **One Time Donation** or **One Time Payment** button.

Indicate the donation or payment amount and proceed through steps 3 and 4 outlined above.

After completion, check the "I Agree" box and click Submit Your One Time Donation button to authorize your transaction.


