A Lenten Project


Here's how you can participate:

Father Jerry Kaywell is the pastor of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Punta Gorda, Florida, known for his engaging and dynamic approach to delivering sermons. He combines eloquence, inspiration and humor in his preaching. Music has been a defining part of his life, with Father Jerry composing music from a young age and working in film and television as a composer and producer. He co-created award-winning digital commercials and contributed to a Grammy-winning gospel album.

Father Kaywell's life has also been marked by personal struggles, including surviving two bouts of cancer, including stage-three lymphoma. His experiences with cancer deeply influence his ministry, particularly his ability to offer counsel and comfort to those with terminal illness. Father Jerry's journey to the priesthood was delayed by his pursuit of a secular career in music. However, after surviving his cancer battles, he returned to Florida, earned degrees in theology and divinity, and was ordained as a priest in 1991.

Father Jerry's commitment to his parish has extended to the rebuilding of Sacred Heart Church, which was destroyed by Hurricane Charley in 2004. Under his leadership, the church was rebuilt and opened in 2008. He continues to serve his parish with joy. Father Jerry is delighted to be giving the parish mission here at St. John the Evangelist this year.

Are you a baptized, practicing adult Catholic who has received the Sacrament of Holy Communion but not the Sacrament of Confirmation?

For those who were never confirmed as a child, there is a way to receive this holy sacrament as an adult. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a strengthening in the indwelling, action and grace of the Holy Spirit. Without it, one is not fully initiated into the Catholic Church, because this Sacrament confirms your baptism and empowers you to live a genuine life of witness as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

Preparation is needed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, which is given to adult Catholics once a year on the Solemn Feast of Pentecost (Sunday, June 8, 2025). The process to be confirmed as an adult requires a mature grasp of the Catholic faith and freely committing oneself to live it. Informal classes on the Catholic Faith are given to adult candidates for Confirmation over the seven weeks leading up to Pentecost (April 23 – Jun 4, 2025).

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." These words are from the Gospel for today's Mass (John 8:1-11), where we see Jesus being challenged as to what to do with the woman caught in adultery. It is all too easy to condemn, talk and gossip about, and quickly point out the faults and failures of others. But in the end, what is really accomplished by all that? Lent is a time given to us to look into our own hearts and see where we have sinned and hurt others as well as ourselves. On Ash Wednesday, one set of words used when the ashes are placed on our foreheads are: "Turn away from sin and be faithful Gospel." Our impatience, anger, and gossip fueled by the sins of others, in the end, accomplishes nothing and leaves us feeling empty and, hopefully, somewhat uncomfortable.

To become forgiving, we must first look into our own hearts and see where we have been uplifted, relieved, and renewed by the forgiveness of others. Unless we are willing to do that, it is almost impossible to find peace, hope, and inspiration from the Sacrament of Confession. How can we really expect God to erase and forget our wrongdoing when we are not willing to do that for one another? Perhaps one of the sins we need to confess and repent from is our unwillingness to let go of things others have said to us or about us and things they have done to hurt us. And just as importantly, we must humbly sorrowfully seek forgiveness for how we have not only been the victim of such words and actions, but how we are the source of such words and actions. Good penances or ways to be reconciled with others and in our own hearts is to focus on the kind, nourishing, helpful and loving words and gestures we use to speak to others and about others. How good it is to take the initiative to do good, loving and simple things each day for others and to use good, constructive, loving, and life-giving words! We have been created to be loved by God

and to become that love for and with each other.

As I wrote last week, it is so good to have the opportunity




I offer these words from the March 2025 Knights of Columbus monthly magazine written by the Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly:

"The virtue of magnanimity opens our hearts to always respond with charity, humility, and gratitude to God. It is characterized by selfless generosity of heart. We come to see we are loved by God and are aware of the gifts and talents he has given us. We know that our gifts are not for our own use but for serving and uplifting up of others. And because we are grateful for these gifts, we recognize and even celebrate the gifts of others, especially those gifts that we may not personally possess. In other words, magnanimity gives us the mindset to always see the best in others and interpret their actions and attitudes in the most favorable light possible. It gives us the strength to practice the spiritual works of mercy - bearing wrongs patiently and responding to difficult situations with forbearance rather than revenge. It can be hard to take the high road, especially when we have been hurt, but it is always the better path."

Jesus has not won us over, but reconciled us to Himself through His Life, Death, and Resurrection and gives us Himself so beautifully in the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Penance over and over again. How blessed we are and what a blessing we become over and over again!
