A Message from Father Felix...

JESUS REVEALS GOD AS OUR MERCIFUL FATHER

The Old Testament speaks frequently and with tenderness about God's mercy yet, it was Jesus, who through his words and actions, revealed to us in an extraordinary way, God as a loving Father, rich in mercy and abounding in great kindness and love. In Jesus' merciful love and care for the poor, the oppressed, the sick and the sinful, and especially in His freely choosing to take upon Himself the punishment for our sins (a truly horrible suffering and death on the cross), so that all may be freed from destructive consequences and death. He manifested in a superabundant and radical way the greatness of God's love and mercy for humanity. In His person as God-man, one in being with the Father, Jesus both reveals and is God's love and mercy itself. On Good Friday we heard from the Passion "Father forgive them for they do not know

what they are doing". That is a great act of mercy for us sinners.

The message of God's love and mercy is especially made known by the gospels. The good news revealed through Jesus Christ is that God's love for each person knows no bounds, and no sin or infidelity, no matter how horrible, will separate us from God and his love when we turn to him in confidence, and seek his mercy. God's will is our salvation. He has done all on our behalf, but since he made us free, he invites us to choose him and partake of his divine life. We become partakers of his divine life when we believe in his revealed truth and trust

him, when we love him, and remain true to his word, when we honor him and seek his kingdom, when we receive him in Holy communion and turn away from sin; when we are mutually caring and forgiving.

The same is true of the revelation of feast of Mercy ,"The feast of mercy emerged from my very depths of tenderness, It is my desire that it solemnly be celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the fount of my Mercy" (by sr. Faustina). These requests of the Lord given to sr. Faustina between 1931 and 1938 can be considered the beginning of the Divine Mercy Message and Devotion in the new forms. Everything in life takes courage, perseverance, determination and hard work for effective out come. Through the efforts of sr. Faustina's spiritual directors, Fr. Michael Sopocko, and Fr. Joseph Andrasz, SJ. and others...including the Marians of the Immaculate Conception ...this message began to spread throughout the world.

However, it is important to remember that this message of the divine mercy, revealed to sr. Faustina and our present generation is not new. It is a powerful reminder of who God



is and has been from the very beginning. This truth that God is in His very nature love and mercy itself, is given to us by our Judeo-Christian faith and God's self-revelation. The veil that has hidden the mystery of God from eternity was lifted by God Himself. In his goodness and love chose to reveal Himself to us, his creatures, and to make known his eternal plan of salvation. God revealed Himself fully through his only son, our Lord Jesus Christ. In the person of Jesus Christ, conceived through power of the Holy Spirit an born of the Virgin Mary, the unseen God was made visible. What a great God we have and trust. He is our only source of hope to eternity.

Why is trust in Jesus so important in understanding Divine Mercy? It is the vessel for drawing graces from God. It is our response to God's great mercy. First and fore most it is our

part to trust in him. In fact, the image of the Divine Mercy bears the inscription "Jesus I trust in You!" inviting us to answer this call. The graces of my mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive. Trust is our faith, hope and love in action. Trust, then, means to believe in Jesus, to love him and to hope in him. It means to be totally absorbed in Jesus as our Lord and Savior, to rely completely upon him. If we do this whole heartedly then, we can say with the Apostle Paul "it is no longer I that live but Christ who lives in mee" (Gal 2:20).

Be merciful as your Father is merciful. We are not only to receive the mercy of God, but to use it by being merciful to others through our actions, our works and our prayers: in other words, we are to practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The corporal works include the following:feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the prisoners, comfort the sick, and bury the dead. The spiritual works of mercy include the following as well; teach the ignorant, pray for the living dead. Correct sinners, counsel those in doubt, console the sorrowful, bear wrongs patiently, and forgive wrongs willingly. Blessed are the merciful for they will receive mercy (Matt 5:7). Our own merciful attitude is likewise a preparation especially time. Without deeds of mercy, our devotion would not be real. For Christ does not only reveal the mercy of God, but at the same time he places before people the demand that they conduct themselves in life with love and mercy. POPE John Paul 11 states that this requirement constitutes the very heart of the Gospel ethos (Rich in Mercy, 3). It is the commandment of love and promise. Together let us response to the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, March 29, 2024 and concludes Sunday, April 7, 2024 – the Second Sunday of Easter – the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This novena is another way for us to reach out – or better yet – allow Jesus to reach out to us with the hand of mercy and compassion.

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be available - in Spanish and English - as you leave the Church for those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena.

Let us ask Christ for the gift of mercy. Let it engulf us and penetrate us. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet His love and mercy in the sacraments....let us feel His closeness and tenderness, and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness, and love." -Pope Francis





A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Skepticism, doubt, uncertainty, ignorance, and fear all too easily come into our minds when things happen that we never expected or are out of our control. These thoughts are seen in today's Gospel with the account of "Doubting Thomas". In today's Gospel (John 20:19-31), we see the Risen Jesus appearing to His disciples who are behind locked doors lest they be associated with Him as His followers and in danger of even crucifixion themselves. Those fearful negative thoughts are first of all dispersed not only by Jesus' risen presence, but even more by His greeting: "Peace be with you." Then He showed them His hands and His side. And a second time He addressed them: "Peace be with you." Those were far from words of anger, disappointment, and blame. They were the words of the One whose company and life they had shared so powerfully during His earthly presence, who shared his company, words, and love with them so powerfully. Then He sent His life of mercy and forgiveness on them as He said: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

We get a second picture of Jesus' love and desire to continue His life with his disciples as He engages doubting Thomas. Again there are no words of rebuke our correction but simply an invitation to Thomas "to put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Jesus did not try to prove Himself to Thomas or any of the others nor does He try to prove Himself to us. Even more, as we see in Thomas, we do not have to perfectly prove ourselves to Him. He simply invites and welcomes us as we are at this very moment into His life and offers to be part of our lives. Sadly, President Biden used March 31st to usurp the joy of the Risen Christ with a call to nationally celebrate a Transgender Day of Visibility. Sadly in our nation, in addition to the promotion and defense of abortion, there is also a huge focus on sexual identity and who and what we want to be sexually. Life in the womb,

along with all who are alive, is a gift from God. We were created in the image and likeness of God and to be loved by Him in this world and



forever with Him in heaven. Thomas came to see that. Peter came to see that as He responded to the three-time question from the Risen Christ, "Do you love me?", with the words, "Yes Lord you know that I love you." Can we boldly say the same? First and foremost, we are created to be the children of God who are worth the death and resurrection of Jesus, the Son of God.

There is a tremendous bond with those who love us and who we love in return, a bond that brings security, joy, and hope. All during this Easter Season, we will see once again how the Risen Christ raised up those who opened their hearts to Him. May we find the same security, joy, and hope.

I offer these words of prayer from St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta:

> Jesus is the Word – to be spoken. Jesus is the Truth – to be told. Jesus is the Way – to be walked. Jesus is the Light – to be lit. Jesus is the Life – to be lived. Jesus is the Love – to be loved. Jesus is the Joy – to be shared. Jesus is the Sacrifice – to be offered. Jesus is the Peace – to be given. Jesus is the Bread of Life – to be eaten. Jesus is the Hungry – to be fed. Jesus is the Thirsty – to be satiated. Jesus is the Naked – to be clothed. Jesus is the Homeless – to be taken in. Jesus is the Sick – to be healed.

Jesus is the Lonely – to be loved.




