Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Every Easter, you and I are reminded of the power of the Paschal Mystery. Commemorating the celebration of the first Eucharist at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, walking with Jesus on the road to Calvary on Good Friday in the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and celebrating Christ's triumphant conquering of sin and death in the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter is a potent reminder of God's love for us.

During this season of Easter and this time of National Eucharistic Revival, it becomes even clearer to us that the Paschal Mystery is not a mere historical event, but a mystery in which we are privileged to participate every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Easter sequence, we sing: "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises!" The word, Enchartst, which means, thanksgiving, implies that every time the Church gathers for the celebration of the Mass, she offers an act of "thankful praise" to the Lord. In this act of offering thanksgiving to God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we as a priestly people offer the sacrifices of our lives with the offering of the Body and Blood of the Lord, by which our sacrifices take on new value and meaning (see, CCC, §1368).

Love is central to the mission of the Church. The sacrifices that we offer to God each day and in the celebration of the Eucharist are an expression of our love for him and for his people. When Christ appeared to Peter and the apostles on the Sea of Galilee after his Resurrection, he asked Peter: "Do you love me?" As he responds, "yes, Lord" to that three-fold questioning, Christ calls him to mission: "feed my lambs...tend my sheep... feed my sheep" (see John 21:15-19) Like Peter, you and I are faced with that same question from the Lord: "do you love me?" In other words, do we take the contemplative time that our hearts yearn for to renew our love for the Lord? In the offering of our time in prayer we are reminded of the very nature of God's love. Through that experience of true love, we realize that as disciples of Christ, you and I are called to mission: to bring the love of Christ to world; to glorify the Lord by our lives; to extend the Divine Mercy to those who suffer; to let the earth shake with the joy of the Resurrection!

Every human heart is created to love. As we grow deeper in our devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a Diocese this June, we ask the Lord to strengthen our hearts to love as Jesus loves and for the zeal to proclaim to those we encounter that "God is Love" (1 John 4:8,16).

I wish you and your families a blessed Easter Season!

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo.

Cristo Resucito! Aleluya!

Cada Pascua, usted y yo recordamos el poder del Misterio Pascual. Commemorando la celebración de la primera Eucaristia en la Misa de la Cena del Señor, caminando con Jesús por el camino del Calvario el Viernes Santo en la Liturgia de la Pasión del Señor, y celebrando la victoria de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte en la Misa de la Resurrección en la Pascua es una poderosa forma de recordar el amor de Dios por nosotros.

Durante este tiempo de Pascua y este tiempo de Reavivamiento Eucaristico Nacional, se nos hace aún más claro que el Misterio Pascual no es un simple acontecimiento histórico, sino un misterio en el cual tenemos el privilegio de participar cada vez que celebramos la Misa. En la secuencia Pascual, cantamos: " Ofrezcan los cristianos ofrendas de alabanza a gloria de la Victima propicia de la Pascua". La palabra Eucaristía, que significa acción de gracias, implica que cada vez que la Iglesia se reúne para la celebración de la Misa, ofrece un acto de "alabanza agradecida" al Señor. En este acto de acción de gracias a Dios en el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, nosotros, como pueblo sacerdotal, ofrecemos los sacrificios de nuestra vida con la ofrenda del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor, por lo que nuestros sacrificios adquieren un nuevo valor y significado (ver, CCC, §1368).


El amor es la misión central de la Iglesia. Los sacrificios que ofrecemos a Dios cada día y en la celebración de la Eucaristía son expresión de nuestro amor a Él y a su pueblo. Cuando Cristo se apareció a Pedro y a los apóstoles en el mar de Galilea después de su resurrección, le preguntó a Pedro: "Me amas?" El respondió, "si, Señor" a esas tres preguntas, Cristo le llama a la misión: "apacienta mis corderos... cuida mis ovejas... apacienta mis ovejas" (cfr. Jn 21, 15-19) Como Pedro, tú y yo nos enfrentamos a esa misma pregunta del Señor: "¿me amas?". En otras palabras, ¿nos tomamos el tiempo contemplativo que anhela nuestro corazón para renovar nuestro amor al Señor? En el ofrecimiento de nuestro tiempo en oración se nos recuerda la naturaleza misma del amor de Dios. A través de esa experiencia de amor verdadero, nos damos cuenta de que, como discipulos de Cristo, tú y yo estamos llamados a la misión: llevar el amor de Cristo al mundo; glorificar al Señor con nuestras vidas; extender la Misericordia Divina a los que sufren; ¡hacer que la tierra tiemble con la alegría de la Resurrección!

Cada corazón humano ha sido creado para amar. Mientras profundizamos en nuestra devoción como Diócesis al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús en este mes de junio, pedimos al Señor que fortalezca nuestros corazones para amar como Jesús ama y para el celo de proclamar a los que encontramos que "Dios es amor" (1 Juan 4:8.16).

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on **Good Friday, April 7, 2023** and concludes **Sunday, April 16, 2023** – the Second Sunday of Easter – the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This novena is another way for us to reach out – or better yet – allow Jesus to reach out to us with the hand of mercy and compassion.

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be available—in Spanish and English—as you leave the Church for those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena.

Let us ask Christ for the gift of mercy. Let it engulf us and penetrate us. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet His love and mercy in the sacraments....let us feel His closeness and tenderness, and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness, and love."







Bereavement... Grieving is a natural process

each of us goes through after

the death of a loved one. While no one can take away the sadness, others can help by listening and caring. Sharing feelings with others who have experienced the death of a loved one helps many people to heal.

St. John's Bereavement Group will begin meeting on Wednesday, April 12, 2023. Facilitated by Loretta Gallagher and Maureen Harney, our group will meet weekly on Wednesdays, for 8-10 weeks from 10am to 11:30 in the Convent. Our beloved Sister Ann started this group about 10 years ago and it has been a great support to many in our parish community who have suffered the death of a loved one. If you, or someone you know might benefit from this support community we hope that you will join us. Many of our current and former participants have shared that the second year can often be more difficult than the first, sometimes managing through the first few months with support from family and friends but realizing that others sharing the same feelings are often the best supporters. Most people also find that a group is most beneficial if started not sooner than three months after the death, however this is an individual decision, and all are welcome at any time. We do ask for a \$10 donation for the cost of the program materials. If an evening group works better with your schedule, please reach out, we are open to facilitating an additional program if there is interest.

Easter Sunday The Resurrection of the Lord Written by THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 | Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8 | Jn 20:1-9

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I love arriving to Mass early when the sacristan is preparing the altar, or even shortly after the prior Mass clears out. This is because I enjoy praying the rosary with fellow parishioners as well as having my choice of seat in the church, but there's also something about the silence, the stillness that permeates the atmosphere during that time. Sitting alone with one's thoughts tends to either disturb or flat-out bore many people, but consider the silence in a new light this Easter Sunday. Mary of Magdala visited Christ's tomb only to find it empty; what was the tomb like after Christ had risen and left? I'd like to think the silence of the sanctuary before Mass is like the silence of the tomb: still, peaceful and, most of all, joyful, for our Savior conquered the grave. In a way, arriving early to a silent church is like Mary arriving to Jesus' tomb and finding it empty. Soon, though, the church is filled with other believers – witnesses to the risen Christ who proclaim his victory over sin and death to share in the Eucharist before going out into the world to serve and make disciples.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

After Mass, many of us are swept up in a dizzying Easter timeline full of brightness and pastels, rushing from Mass to Easter egg hunts to lunch or dinner that may leave kids and adults alike exhausted. But our Easter worship and traditions are important because they mark this day as the most joyful of all celebrations, indeed the greatest event in human history. The Lord Jesus is calling us to new life in him! We take this time to celebrate and reflect on what this means. After his resurrection, Jesus revealed himself over time to his Apostles. But before they saw Jesus and truly understood he had risen from the dead, they experienced great sadness and fear. In the same way for us, we must remember that there is no Easter without the suffering and darkness of Good Friday. St. Paul tells us in the second reading that, in order to celebrate the feast, we must "clear out the old yeast, so that [we] may become a fresh batch of dough." We can't celebrate with "the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness" – we must let Christ purify our hearts and fill them with his Truth

WITNESS Let the joy of Easter fuel a new resolve to be a witness to the Resurrection. Take Easter week to contemplate Scripture, to let Jesus fill your heart with his light and forgiveness so that you may bear his witness to those you encounter in the days and weeks to come.
