## A Reflection from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick... 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter ~ Good Shepherd Sunday

We know from the scriptures alone that we can refer not to Jesus in so many different ways. It is clear in all the four gospels that Jesus identifies Himself through words and images that we can easily identify with. Images that are uplifting and reassuring—images that really define who He is. For example, Jesus says in John's Gospel chapter 8:21 that He is the Light of the World. He goes on to say elsewhere, that He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. He is the Living Bread, the Bread of Life. He proclaims to the world, "I am the Resurrection and the Life. I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, whoever believes in Me and remains in Me will live forever!" He also identifies Himself as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He makes it clear in so many ways that He is our hope and joy in this everchanging world. He alone has the words of everlasting life. In Matthew's Gospel, chapter 11, Jesus says, "Come to me all you who labor and are burden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me because I am meek and humble of heart, and you will find rest."

Yet as comforting and as important as these sayings and images are, probably the most comforting image that we can refer to Jesus with is the image of the Good Shepherd. He says in John's Gospel chapter 10, "I am the Good Shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep...my sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." Here in John's Gospel, Jesus reassures us that He and the Father are one. Together they bring us eternal life. Like a good shepherd who tends to his sheep, Jesus is the one who laid down His life for us so that we can have eternal life. He prepared the way for eternity! If we hear His voice and harden not our hearts, we too can be led to green pastures, life everlasting. We too can live in full communion with God and with one another with Jesus as our Supreme and Eternal Shepherd.

It is clear from today's gospel all we have to do to attain eternal life is to hear His voice—the voice of the Good Shepherd who loved us to the very end, and who lives and remains forever in communion with God. It is up to us to follow Jesus—to walk in the newness of life with our Risen Lord. It is up to us to stay close to Jesus because He alone has the words of everlasting life. He alone can satisfy our hearts. He leads us to new life whenever we hear His voice.

For the early Church, during the era of great persecution, the early Christians relied on this image, the image of the Good Shepherd more than anything else. For them, it brought them great hope and comfort. What inspired them the most in persevering in their faith was

the crucified Christ. Instead, it was the image of the Good Shepherd-that gentle image that reassured them of God's embracing love through Jesus. For us today, it is the crucified Lord that surpasses all images of Christ that brings us great hope and one that we adore in our churches. Yet, back in the early church, when so many Christians were being crucified for their faith, the Good Shepherd was the image they wanted to see. For them,



the image of the crucified Lord hanging from the cross was the furthest from their mind because it only reminded them of their own pain and suffering from the authorities trying to suppress Christianity.

**Down in the Catacombs in Rome, Italy,** the main image one sees engraved in stone, where so many gathered to worship for liturgy in hiding, is the image of the Good Shepherd. No wonder this image was venerated the most in the early church, because of the reassurance it brought so many people who were enduring great hardships in the public forum for their faith and love for Jesus. It reminded them how much God loved them and how much God wanted to embrace them for their faith and trust in the lordship of Christ.

There is no question how relevant this image of the Good Shepherd is for us today. We too have our own hardships and fears to deal with. Most images, if not all images of the Good Shepherd bring us great comfort because it captures for us and sums up for us the great and tender love that Jesus has for us and for all of humanity. It illustrates for us kind of love that God has for us when we listen attentively to His voice and respond faithfully to His commands. The image of the Good Shepherd captures the level of compassion and concern that our Lord has for His flock of all ages—that He comes to lift us up and raises us to new life. His love for us is all embracing and everlasting.

This simple image shows us the pathway to happiness, to new and eternal life. It brings us peace of mind and forgiveness of the heart. It reassures us of God's presence in our lives. This image of the Good Shepherd brings us new hope. It captures for us the true meaning of Easter—that Jesus is alive and truly risen! This sacred image reassures us that Jesus is among us to show us the way to all truth and understanding. The iconic image of the Good Shepherd says it all. It reminds us just how special we are in relationship to Christ and of God's all-embracing love for humanity!

## May 11, 2025 Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Revival Nights

## A Sacred Journey Across Long Island

Beginning on May 31<sup>st</sup>, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Diocese of Rockville Centre will launch two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages that will journey across Long Island, culminating in a grand celebration at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup>.

These pilgrimages will carry the **Holy** Eucharist in solemn procession through a wide array of sacred and public spaces including towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. Along the way, participants will have the opportunity to engage in Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, and other deeply spiritual experiences. These events aim to unite the faithful in a powerful public witness to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The People of God are encouraged to walk with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, to pray within the designated pilgrim churches, and to joyfully proclaim the Gospel to those who witness the procession as it moves through their communities.

As a part of this spiritual movement, Revival Nights will also be held throughout Nassau and Suffolk Counties from Sunday, May 31st through Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup>. Each evening will include Eucharistic Adoration, dynamic preaching and catechesis, Eucharistic processions, and Nocturnal Adoration, creating an atmosphere of renewal and deepened devotion.

Together, these events form a profound diocesan effort to rekindle Eucharistic faith and devotion, inviting all to encounter Christ in a new and transformative way.


### THE JUBILEE PRAYER

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are many important things to do everyday and important people to deal with. Whoever or whatever is important has meaning, weight, or influence for us. "Important people" are in positions of leadership and have the responsibility of doing what is good for us. As I write this reflection (Tuesday, May 6, 2025 because it must be sent in to the bulletin to be published by Wednesday), we are awaiting the election of a very important person in our Church, a new pope. One of the papal titles or descriptions is "servant of the servants of God", emphasizing and inspiring humble love. One of the most powerful ways that Jesus described this are His words from Luke 22:27: For who is greater: the one seated at table or the one who serves? Is it not the one seated at table? I am among you as the one who serves."

Humble service is an integral part of the way we live our lives everyday with the people we live with, encounter, and who are part of our lives. The moment we are born, there is great joy and a loving commitment to meet our every need from feeding, bathing, and embracing. No need is too great and no response too difficult.




## GARDEN MINISTRY




