



### FROM Fr. Patrick's DESK


#### THE NEW PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parish Family—

I asked Fr. Patrick Riegger to share week's letter as we continue to prepare to welcome him to our community on June 29th. Please take some time in these weeks to pray for Fr. Patrick, and for each of us, during these times of transition.

Welcome Fr. Patrick!

The purpose of Lent was to prepare ourselves for a new Easter celebration! I hope everyone is experiencing the wonder and the joy that is found in this great feast. I hope by now we are reassured once again of our greatest hope in sharing in the fullness of our Lord's own Resurrection. It is so wonderful to know from the Scriptures that we can all look beyond this world towards a sign of hope that promises us new life in abundance. This new Easter reminds us that this is the time for us to come out of the dark tomb, filled with hope and wonder of new and everlasting life. Even though we still live in the shadow of death, we now live in the shadow of eternity because Jesus has been raised and glorified forever! It is wonderful to know that we have so much to look forward to in being reunited with all our loved ones in heaven with Jesus Christ as our Supreme Lord and Shepherd! But even more importantly, Easter reminds us that we are now an extension of our Lord's ministry in proclaiming the Easter Joy of His Resurrection with the rest of the world, so that others can come to believe what is true and everlasting. Hopefully, our approach to life is so much more fulfilling and



meaningful during this new Easter celebration, just knowing the great treasure that awaits us all!

**Just before Holy Week**, I received a call from Bishop John Barres letting me know I was being assigned to serve as Pastor at St. John the Evangelist in Center Moriches, effective June 29<sup>th</sup>. Knowing how wonderful this parish is and the history behind it, I was very excited. I always thought that maybe one day I would serve here in some capacity, especially after my parents moved into the area back in 2004.

I was born on April 21, 1971, at St. Charles Hospital in Port Jefferson, NY. I was raised by my mother and father, Patricia and George Riegger, who still reside in Moriches, and spend the winter months in Florida. I have three siblings who are all married, seven nieces and nephews, two grandnieces and one grandnephew. We are all very close and enjoy spending time together, especially during the holidays, and when we vacation together at the Jersey Shore.

**I grew up in Farmingville** and lived there most of my life. In 1989, I graduated from Sachem High School in Ronkonkoma. My class had just over 1400 graduates. During High School, I ran cross country and track, and continued throughout my college years. I went to Suffolk Community College for two and a half years, then I received a bachelor's degree in Business at the University of Stony Brook in 1994. Shortly after my undergraduate studies, I entered the Major Seminary in Huntington, where I studied theology. On June 9, 2001, just a few months before the tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup>, I was ordained to the Priesthood at St. Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre.

#### Fifth Sunday of Easter + May 15, 2022

My first assignment was at St. Anne's in Garden City, where I served from 2001-2005 as Associate Pastor. Then I went to serve as Parochial Vicar under the leadership of Msgr. Walden, pastor of St. Patrick's in Smithtown, from 2005-2010. On June 23, 2010, I was assigned to Infant Jesus Port Jefferson, where I have served as Pastor for the past twelve years. I was very grateful to Bishop Murphy for this appointment, and I will remain there until my new pastorate begins at St. John's on June 29<sup>th</sup>. Infant Jesus is a very big, active, vibrant parish, much like St. John the Evangelist. I love being present to the people I serve in so many ways, especially during the celebration of the Eucharist. I am currently the chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, and I love being part of the many different ministries that Infant Jesus offers. I, along with my brother priests at Infant Jesus, are always inspired by the love and faith of our parish community. Although I am sad to leave Infant Jesus after being a part of the parish for over a decade, I am also excited to be assigned to serve at St. John's, knowing how wonderful this community is. All my priest friends who have served at St. John's in the past tell me what a great parish I am going to.

I am personally grateful to your Pastor, Fr. John Sureau, who called me right away once I was assigned to St. John's to congratulate me and assist me during this time of transition. I am looking forward to meeting with the staff and getting a tour of the grounds and buildings. I am also looking forward to meeting all of you this summer and serving you in the upcoming years! My first experience at St. John's was attending the wedding of close friends of mine in the old church. I was so happy to see that when the new church was built, Msgr. McDonald was able to preserve much of the history and was able to bring it into the new church, including the old altar and stain glass windows. Every time I drive by the parish campus, I always say to myself what a beautiful parish in such a beautiful environment. I cannot thank your Pastor enough for going out of his way to make me feel welcomed and informed. He has been so gracious during this time of transition in making me feel comfortable and right at home. Thank you for all your prayers for Fr. John and me during this time of transition, and please be assured of mine for you and your families.

### THE THREE DAYS ... The journey continues!

As part of the celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), members of our parish offered reflections at each of the Morning Prayer services. Each week, we'll publish the text — or the excerpted text — for each one. Take some time to sit with these reflections and consider how they can serve as an inspiration for your prayer and service in the life of the Church. This week, we share the reflection of Patti Gordon who offered the reflection at Good Friday Morning Prayer.

Today is a solemn day as it takes us back to that moment in time where Jesus gave his life for us. As we remember the depths of his suffering and the injustice He endured, we also remember that it was the very purpose for which He came. What seemed to many as though it was the end, was really the fulfillment of his mission here on earth as he spoke the words 'It is finished.' He had completed what he had come to do on our behalf. In truth, it was just the beginning for each of us.

It is also a day of gratitude because He did for us what we could never do for ourselves. Taking our sins upon himself, He became the perfect sacrifice needed to allow us to once again be united with God. Jesus became our substitute, exchanging His life for ours. By the shedding of his blood, we have been made new.

When I look at the cross, I see the evidence of the suffering He endured for me and for you, but when I am able to look beyond His suffering, I see the love that brought him to that moment. A love so great, that as scripture says, "For the joy set before Him endured the cross." His heart was focused on the joy of knowing that you and I would be His, and now He sits at the right hand of the throne of God.

At the moment of his death, the curtain in the temple was torn in two, making known that no longer anyone else needed to go before God on our behalf, but that we ourselves were and are free to approach the throne of grace, assured of a glad welcome because He desires an intimate relationship with each of us.

Jesus told us, "In this world you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world." In the moment of His death, that's exactly what he did. He defeated the power of sin and death, bridging the gap between God and man, opening the way to heaven for us so we could live with him for all eternity.

Each of us will have trouble and face suffering in our life. Jesus knew sorrow, grief, pain, and loss and Jesus himself modeled for us how to walk through those times of suffering and trouble.

He stayed in close communion with his Father and now we stay in close communion with Him. We fix our eyes on Christ, and the precious promises He has given us to hold on to in those times. And we find those promises throughout scripture.

His word challenges me to look beyond the difficult circumstances I am facing, to the promises God has in place for me. They become my strength because it can be easy to get swept up in my emotions during times of pain or suffering. In those times, we can wrap our heart tightly around the hope that lives within us, knowing that God always keeps his promises.

The night before His death, when he went to pray, He didn't go alone. He asked His friends to come and wait with him and pray. We aren't intended to walk through difficult times alone either. That night, knowing what He would be facing, He poured out his heart to His Father, allowing us to see that we too can share our deepest pain, fears and struggle with Him as well.

He has promised to never leave us. I am also so thankful to be part of a faith community that supports one another in love and in prayer. There's been times where God has sent someone into my life when I needed to be encouraged, someone to come alongside me to pray with me or for me.

His love and faithfulness are revealed to me during those times even when it's difficult to see in the moment. How many times after we've come through and are on the other side of difficult times, do we look back and say, oh yes, that's where He was in that moment and oh yes, He was there too, but I hadn't realized it then.

It's one of the reasons that for me, it's so important to look back on those times, to recount the ways He was with me or at work on my behalf. It not only strengthens my faith, but allows me to see His ever present love and help. Every detail of our lives is continually being woven together to fit in God's perfect plan, bringing goodness into our lives....He died that we may live an abundant life. He calls us his beloved. I pray that each one of us will come to experience that beautiful love in new and deeper ways as we behold His cross. Amen.

# STATIONS OF LIGHT Prayer Service

Fridays – May 6, 13, 20, 27, and June 3, 2022

1:00 p.m. + Church Led by Sister Ann



The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiriting events of His post-Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.
