# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"...If we love one another, God remains in us..."

# REMAINING

Dear Parish Family:

I hope you have been picking up the word remain over the past Sundays of Easter as well on this 7th Sunday of Easter. The cycle of readings (Year B) brings us this word and connected images throughout. This God wants to stay with us, to be with us, to remain in us.

Today, particularly in the second reading, we are given some challenging insight into that remain-



ing of God. There is actually a condition put forth. **IF** we love one another, God remains in us. Did you heart sink a little bit when you read that? My heart did when I began preparing for this week's homily.

Why? Because I do not love as I should. Perhaps the same might be true for you? I have been learning and praying a great deal about God's love. The readings have told us again and about it. Even if we cannot see it, we have been great images and qualities of this love. It's the image that we are supposed to model in how we love one another. I come up short. Then the cycle begins. My lack of

openness to loving others leaves little room for God to enter my heart. Simply, there is not place for Him to remain. I, then, become more miserable.

I think this is part of the reason we need to pray for the Holy Spirit to purify and sanctify our hearts so that we might become better at loving as God loves and not as we may want to love in our humanity. We pray we might be better at loving one another—particularly those with whom we struggle (insert those name or names here) - so we might create deeper space for God to remain.

The power of love to remain is not simply about the works of Scripture and the love of God. If we attempt to mirror or image that love then we see clearly that we remain with one another. Think of some obvious examples – the unconditional love of a parent to a child, the married love of a couple together for 50, 60, or 70 years or the companionship of life-long friends. That love, simply, remains. It happens in parishes too! I remember when I was preparing to enter the Seminary a priest of great wisdom in the diocese said to me, "John, just remember two things. Love your God. Love your people." Love. Friendship. Presence. Remain.

As a parish we have been privileged to be part of a love story this year. Blessed by the presence of Seminarian Louis Cona since last July we have been privileged to journey with him in his love response to God's call in his life. We have witnessed it in the words of reflection offered, the generous spirit exemplified in many ways, good humor even when it is as his own expense, his desire to learn more and

more about this faith and what it takes to be Roman Catholic priest and his willingness to share that with everyone from second graders to adults and to everyone in between.

Seminarian Louis, too, has been part of our love story here at SJE. Over the past year, he has a witnessed a parish managing a pandemic, the transfer of a beloved priest, the day to day life of re-opening a school, teaching adults and forming young people, leading faith sharing, seeing the love and compassion for the sick and the poor and so much more that happens in an attempt to bring God's love wherever it is needed.

Taking physical leave of a loving relationship is tough! Of this, there can be no question. If we have been listening and praying with the readings these weeks of Easter, we know that love remains and connects far beyond any assignment or physical connection.

That is a blessing for Seminarian Louis and for this parish. Love remains. Please keep Seminarian Louis in your thoughts and prayers in these days. If you can, please say a prayer for me, too.

#### NEXT WEEK'S READINGS - Pentecost Sunday

**<u>Reading I:</u>** Acts 2:1-11 *The Spirit comes to the Apostles as tongues of fire.*  **<u>Responsorial Psalm:</u>** PS 104:1, 24, 29-30. 32, 34 <u>Second Reading:</u> 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Galatians 5:16-25 *Be guided by the Spirit.* <u>**Gospel:**</u> John 20:19-23 or John 15:26-27; 16:12-15 *The Spirit will guide the Apostles to all truth.* 



#### **Discussion Questions**

1."But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." This could be the definition of evangelization. Pope Francis says that Jesus himself is the model of evangelization. How important is listening to people's needs in being a witness and evangelist for Christ?

2. " ... live in a manner worthy of the call you have received ... " If your call isn't to be an evangelist or a pastor, what is it? Could it be to feed the hungry? To lead Eco-justice or Green Teams? Help people find jobs or housing?

3. Jesus prayed aloud so his disciples would hear him " that they will be one with him as we are one. ... As you sent me into the world, so I send them into the world." Will knowing they are one with Jesus and the Father and being sent to do his work bring the disciples the "joy" that Jesus will share with

## **STATIONS OF LIGHT Prayer Service** Friday – May 21 1:00 p.m. + Church Led by Sister Ann

The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiring events of His post-Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk

along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light



were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.


