Dear Parish Family:

In Rhode Island. Preparing to preside at a wedding. Phone calls and text messages back and forth. The call from my mom, "Where are you?" Presiding at the wedding. Rushing to a ferry to only wish it could go faster. Driving quickly (one could say) to return here. Entering a darkened and soot

filled church destroyed by mental illness and violence.

This upcoming Tuesday will make three years since the tragedy that shook our parish community. It happened on a Friday and the readings we pray with today are the readings the Church called us to pray with three years ago. The line from today's second reading sort of became our motto—reason for hope!

Maybe we need that line from Scripture even more in these days. Life as we know it has changed and probably will not return to what

it once was prior to these days of pandemic. This is not only impacting our parish but our community, our country and our world. We are grieving and mourning. At times, we are fearful and anxious. We find ourselves exhausted yet we are not "doing" all that much. We seek routine yet it seems elusive. We want this to be over yet we are realistic about the impact on the gift of life. We can so easily fall into darkness and despair.

So what is the reason for our hope? Simply, it is the Paschal Mystery. It is the dying and rising of Jesus Christ. It is the outpouring of his love and mercy that is our reason for hope, the hope that never disappoints (Romans 5:5).

Do you remember those early days after May 19, 2017? I do. I remember a community coming together. I remember Mass in the Auditorium ready to go within hours. I remember an outpouring of care and concern for the person who carried out the acts that destroyed the church building. I remember so many signs of hope in what was so seemingly dark. We gave witness to those many reasons for that hope by our prayer, our presence, our response.

We have great reason to hope in these days too! Do you see the signs? Can you give some reasons? We cannot lose sight of those! Do you see it in the desire for the Eucharist spoken of by so many even by some who may have taken it for granted? Do you see it in the outpouring of generosity and support for the poor and the vulnerable? Do you see it in the commitment of teachers and catechists forming young people in these days? Do you see it in the response to opportunities to prayer and learning offered on SJE Social Media in these days? Yes, there are many reasons for hope. There are many reasons not to lose hope! (Take a look at the front cover of the bulletin.)

As we enter in these final days of Easter and long for the feast day of Pentecost, take a look around and see the many reasons for hope. Can we ask you a favor? Can you read over page 2 and share with our parish some of your reasons for hope? They may be reasons for hope in these days or your reasons overall in your own life? Send them to hope@sjecm.org or return them in the ways noted on page 2.

So it's been quite the road since May 19, 2017. There were many reasons for our hope in those days. May our walking through the dying and rising then continue to inspire us in the days and weeks ahead. Please say a prayer for me! Feethert

Mass Book 2020

Many of you have reached out about Mass intentions. I want to let you know a few things: 1) We offer two Masses a day here as a parish.

- a) The first Mass is offered at 8 a.m. via Livestream.
- b) The second Mass, at the present time, is offered by one of the priests privately.
- c) In general, priests celebrate Mass each day. If not, they usually concelebrate at a Mass.
- 2)We are going to add a Sunday evening Mass beginning this weekend. So our Weekend Mass schedule will be Saturday evening 5 p.m., Sunday morning 8 a.m. and Sunday evening at 5:30 p.m.
- a) Existing Mass intentions will be assigned between the Saturday evening, Sunday morning and Sunday evening Masses.
 - b) If you have requested an intention to prayed for at Mass, you have been or will be contacted.
 - c) The Church will be locked at 4 p.m. on Sundays beginning this Sunday.
- 3)We will now "Open the Mass Book" for the rest of 2020.
- a) <u>Sunday Mass Intentions</u>: After July 1st, intentions will be taken for six Sunday (including Saturday evening) Masses. (2 on Saturday evening; 3 on Sunday morning; 1 on Sunday evening)
 - i. <u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: We will NOT be able to give exact times for the Sunday morning Masses at this time. Again, because of precautions related to distance, cleaning, etc. it is likely we will need to have more time in between Masses. It is just not clear at this time how that will look.
 - ii. We will also need to account for baptisms as well as some weddings.
 - b) <u>Daily Mass Intentions</u> will continued to be offered Monday Friday and on Saturday mornings. For now, the first Mass will be at 8 a.m. and the second one privately. Once we are able to celebrate Daily Mass publicly, those times will be announced.


