

Hello Fellow Parishioners & Happy Sunday!

My name is Tess Austin, and you may remember me from my time as Campus Minister at OLQA or singing with the Sunday 5:30pm Mass Band! I always love when I get to come back out to Center Moriches, more recently to speak to the young people in Faith Formation. The St. John the Evangelist Parish Community has been such a blessing in my life and I am so grateful for this incredible parish community of faith.



Over the past two years I have been discerning a vocation to reli-

gious life with the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians – Salesian Sisters of St John Bosco. The Salesian Sisters are an active contemplative community dedicated to evangelizing young people through reason, religion, and loving kindness. Their mission of laying down their lives for the young is rooted in the very heart of Christ, and finds its model in Mary's motherly care. Through their presence with and among young people in schools, camps, retreats and parish education they strive to become for them signs of God's love and presence.

I am thrilled to share with you that I have been accepted into this incredible community! The Salesian Sisters and I are so excited for me to enter into formation as I seek to lay down my life in love of Chrisst and become a sign of God's love and presence for the young.

However, like many men and women discerning vocations to the priesthood and religious life, I am unable to enter because of my student loans. This week, I will be speaking at all Masses about the La-

May 18, 2025 Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Revival Nights

A Sacred Journey Across Long Island

Beginning on May 31st, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Diocese of Rockville Centre will launch two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages that will journey across Long Island, culminating in a grand celebration at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday, June 8th.

These pilgrimages will carry the **Holy** Eucharist in solemn procession through a wide array of sacred and public spaces including towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. Along the way, participants will have the opportunity to engage in Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, and other deeply spiritual experiences. These events aim to unite the faithful in a powerful public witness to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The People of God are encouraged to walk with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, to pray within the designated pilgrim churches, and to joyfully proclaim the Gospel to those who witness the procession as it moves through their communities.

As a part of this spiritual movement, Revival Nights will also be held throughout Nassau and Suffolk Counties from Sunday, May 31st through Friday, June 6th. Each evening will include Eucharistic Adoration, dynamic preaching and catechesis, Eucharistic processions, and Nocturnal Adoration, creating an atmosphere of renewal and deepened devotion.

Together, these events form a profound diocesan effort to rekindle Eucharistic faith and devotion, inviting all to encounter Christ in a new and transformative way.



A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are many reasons we do the things we do and say the things we say. We act and speak motivated by fear, joy, disappointment, hope, vengeance, love and a host of other motives. In the Gospel for today's Mass (John 13:31-35), Jesus is speaking to His apostles at the Last Supper, literally His last evening in this world with them as He will be crucified the next day. He does not speak with fear, anger, disappointment, or spite. Fully aware of what is going to happen the next day, He continues being who He is and doing what He has come to do - bring God's life and love to the apostles and all who will ever be open to Him. As the Way, Truth, and Life He says, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." How is this a new commandment? It is because we see the depth and power of love in the author of life and love - God Himself not only telling us what we need to hear for our own good and the good of all people, but actually living that out as one of us in the face of the world's greatest injustice, ignorance, hatred, and stupidity.

As much as God seeks to embrace us with His love, just as importantly He seeks to be loved by us in return, not because He needs our love but because He is enriched by our love and we become more and more the image in which we are created: "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." (Genesis 1:27). The words of today's Gospel make it crystal clear how we are created and how we live our lives to the fullest extent possible, by loving one another as He loves us. It is not easy to navigate through our everyday lives with all the distractions and information which with we are constantly bombarding ourselves. The more we can put down our electronic devices and turn off our twenty-four hour news reports, the more peace, inspiration, and hope we will know and the more grateful we will be for God's love and His confidence and joy in us as we fulfill the words of Jesus in today's Gospel, "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."

We are very familiar with the words of Jesus calling us to love one another as He loves us. We do know the joy of giving ourselves in unconditional love to those who are an intimate part of who we are. But where do we draw the line? In the book I am reading now, "Enchanted by Eternity" by William J. Slattery, PhD, I was given a lot of food for thought and inspiration by this quote from C.S. Lewis in the first chapter entitled "Catholicism Is About Reality, Not Religion": "I



believe in Christianity as I believe the sun has risen; not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else." It is almost too simple and naive to believe that we can live in peace by following the words of Jesus, loving one another as He has and does love us at every moment of our lives, and looks forward to our presence with Him forever in heaven. We navigate disappointments, disagreements, and scams all too often. But do we know the joy, nourishment, and hope when our first thought is to love as Jesus has loved us. He is our Savior, and God knows and acted knowing that we sorely need His saving love that we can share with one another.

I offer Psalm 46 for your prayerful reflection:

God is for us a refuge and strength, a helper close at hand, in time of distress, so we shall not fear though the earth should rock, though the mountains fall into the depths of the sea; even though its waters rage and foam, even though the mountains be shaken by its waves. The Lord of hosts is with us: the God of Jacob is our stronghold. The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within, it cannot be shaken; God will help it at the dawning of the day. Nations are in tumult, kingdoms are shaken:

he lifts his voice, the earth shrinks away. The Lord of hosts is with us: the God of Jacob is our stronghold. Come, consider the works of the Lord, the redoubtable deeds he has done on the earth. He puts an end to wars over all the earth;

the bow he breaks, the spear he snaps. He burns the shields with fire.

"Be still and know that I am God,

supreme among the nations, supreme on the earth!" The Lord of hosts is with us:

the God of Jacob is our stronghold. Glory...


