# A Message from the Coordinator of Family Ministry...

# Imagine for a moment that you are one of the disciples ...

You're locked in a room with your buddies, already scared to death of what might happen to you because you are one of Jesus' disciples. It's been a crazy couple of weeks. You are still trying to make sense of everything that has happened. Jesus, your rock, your grounding force, your Savior is no longer with you. You feel lost... anxious... uncertain... afraid. And here you are in the upper room of a house, doors and windows locked. All of a sudden there's a noise from the sky like a strong driving wind and it whips through the room. Then tongues of fire appear and rest on each one of you. Talk about frightening! What they were thinking? What were they were feeling? It's hard to imagine...

# Imagine for another moment that you are one of the disciples...

After a moment or two of trying to process the crazy wind...the tongues of fire...try to imagine the unexplainable feeling of empowerment; so much so, that you are confident enough to go amidst the crowds, those same crowds that only minutes ago you feared. Not only are you secure enough to go out there, but you are confident enough to start preaching about the mighty works of God. Miraculously all who are gathered there understand you. Each group hears you speaking in its native language. And the kicker is... you only know how to speak your own language. What was happening? Imagine what the disciples were feeling. Did they recognize the impact that they were having right from the start? Was it a gradual recognition? Did they put 2 and 2 together and remember Jesus telling them that He would send them His Spirit? Did they understand that this was that Holy Spirit working through them at that very moment? Imagine being a disciple....

# Well, you can stop imagining. WE ARE HIS DISCIPLES!

And we have been given that same amazing power by that same Holy Spirit who came to the disciples more than two thousand years ago! The powerful words of St. Paul weren't meant only for the Corinthians... they are meant for us too! "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

(1 Corinthians 12:4-8)

So let's go forth from our upper rooms. Let's surrender our fears. Let's allow the Holy Spirit to work in us and with us and through us so that we can truly be the Body of Christ. The readings make it clear that each of us has been gifted in some way. Thanks be to God we all have different gifts and when we work together, we cover all the bases. Pentecost is not about going it alone... it's about working together to be the Body of Christ. It's about living out the gospel's call to holiness with unity, humility and love. Pentecost is about a community of believers, empowered by the Holy Spirit, working together to serve one another, to right the wrongs, to care for the most vulnerable among us, and to bring others to Jesus. It's not going to be easy...but that doesn't really matter, because we have Holy Spirit power. It might not always be fun, but it'll be better if we're working together. And when you're doing it all for the GLORY OF GOD, the energy and persistence and motivation of the Spirit just keeps on comin'!

There's a great Christian song by Matthew West entitled "Do Something". The lyrics start off with a person who sees all of the pain and injustices in the world and he shakes his fist up toward heaven and asks, "God, why don't you do something?" And God replies, "I did.... I created you!" It's a great song that really makes you think. Here's the link if you want to listen.



# International Pilgrim Virgin Statue comes to St. John the Evangelist








The world-famous INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA will be on tour throughout our Diocese during the month of June 2024. On June 19th, The World Apostolate of Fatima-USA will bring the statue to our parish. This historic statue began its travels from Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1947, and has been around the world many times. Sculpted by Jose' Thedim, based on the description of Sister Lucia, one of the three seers, it was blessed by the Bishop of Fatima and commissioned to serve the Pilgrim Virgin, who would carry the blessings of Fatima throughout the world. The Bishop prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. The statue has visited more than 100 countries bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled. This is a special opportunity to pray with Our Lady, learn Our Lady's messages and requests at Fatima, and present any special intentions you may have for yourself or others.

# SJE Safe Environment

# Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/ record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are many things that we hope for in our lives. We hope to have a good job and be able to support ourselves and those we love and depend upon us. But that hope involves far more than just money - it involves sacrifice, concern, and other centered love on our part. Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the followers of Jesus, the same Holy Spirit we receive when we are baptized and then a fuller outpouring of the Holy Spirit when we receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The Holy Spirit is given to us so we can know, experience and be bearers of God's love and goodness. He is the Spirit of courage, wisdom, patience, and hope. The one thing that comes across so clearly to me as I pray and reflect during this Easter Season is how patient and merciful God is to us. Since the beginning of creation God's patience, goodness, and love have been tested. Never has God given up on us. Throughout human history, God has never stopped reaching out to us with the hope that we will let Him love us. As far as He is concerned, it is never too late or does it take too long. That point comes across to me as I reflect on the words of Jesus on the cross addressed to the "good thief's" simple prayer (Luke 23:42-43): Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." It is not that we ever earn or deserve God's love and mercy. Rather, it is almost unbelievable that He is so patient, hopeful, merciful loving. We are certainly tempted and challenged by the devil and his evil ways. He can be subtle and blatant.

God does not ignore evil or let us slide when we give in to it, but fills us with His Spirit of courage,



truth, mercy, and love so that we can be his healing, life giving presence. We do not stick our heads in the sand when evil thriving in our world, nation, communities, or personal relationships, but courageously live and speak the truth with love as Jesus did. Mother Teresa spoke this simple point: "The Lord does not ask us to be successful. He asks us to be faithful." When Jesus died on the cross, His enemies and detractors thought they were done with Him and would not be bothered by But He refused to stop loving even them. God's hope is seen in His love, inexhaustible mercy, wisdom. It is His Holy Spirit we celebrate today and seek to guide our thoughts, words, and actions everyday of our lives.

Come, Holy Spirit,






