Michael Hoonhout



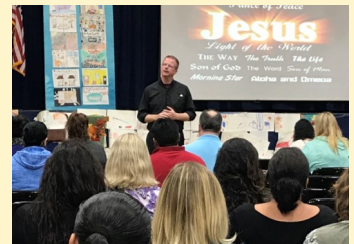

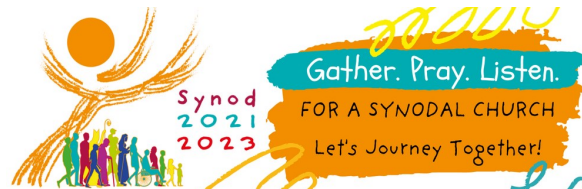


FROM Fr. John's DESK

Synod +125 Journeying Together

Dear Parish Family:

We are in the midst of a time of transition in the life of our parish. Transition and change can easily become a place where stress takes hold. I hope for our parish—and for all included in these times of transition—it is an opportunity for the Spirit to touch each of our hearts, the heart of our parish and the heart of the Church. Jesus asks Peter three times, “Do you love me?” I hope our hearts are opened in these months to say, “Yes, Lord, I do love you....and your parish...and your church!”



Before the announcements of transitions of the past few weeks, our parish had already made some plans to be part of the Synod process of the Church and to consider ways we can link to the upcoming 125th Anniversary Year of St. John the Evangelist. Pope Francis is pushing the Church to journey together, “to walk forward together, listening to the Holy Spirit and the Word of God, to participate in the mission of the Church in the communion that Christ establishes between us. Ultimately, this path of walking together is the most effective way of manifesting and putting into practice the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God” (Vademacum for the Synod on Synodality). Therefore, the question that must guide us in this process comes from the *Preparatory Document* of the Synod, “How does this ‘journeying together’ take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel? and what steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?” This sounds like a lot of Church words, for sure! Ultimately, how can we walk together as a Church and as a parish to live out the Gospel and be even more open to the Spirit? This walking together involves those involved in the life of the Church and those who have left, the actively engaged and actively disengaged. This journeying together needs all of us on the journey!

If we are going to walk together, we need everyone to be a part of this. The work group for the Synod on Synodality in our parish has come up with two clear ways for us to be part of this process.

First, we ask all parishioners to complete a survey available online, at the doors of the church or via mail (contact the Rectory for a copy). You can go www.sjecm.org to take the survey online beginning Monday, May 2, 2022. The survey has two parts. The first part is focused on the work of the Synod. The second part is directed towards our parish. The survey, you will notice, is not asking about specific issues or projects. It is a lot broader. The results of this survey will inspire dialogue and conversation that will lead us to more specifics for the global church and specific initiatives for our parish. This will be the work of discernment for the Pastoral Team, Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, 125th Anniversary Committee, and Father Patrick.

The second part of this is for each of us to journey and to listen together to one another. **With that in mind, we will have four Synod Listening Sessions.** It will allow us to literally journey together, listening to the Spirit moving in each of us. These sessions will take place in the Auditorium on

Tuesday, May 31, 2022 at 3 p.m. Wednesday, June 1, 2022 at 7 p.m.

Thursday, June 2, 2022 at 7 p.m. Saturday, June 4, 2022 at 10 a.m.

We ask each parishioner to come and please invite others to come, even those who have been away from the Church. Look for more information in the weeks ahead.

I find it hopeful that we will be wrapping up the parish and community level work as the feast of Pentecost begins. I believe (and hope and pray) it is just another sign of the Holy Spirit warming our hearts, preparing us for even greater signs of new life in the weeks, months, and years to come!

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me!

The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiring events of His post-Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.

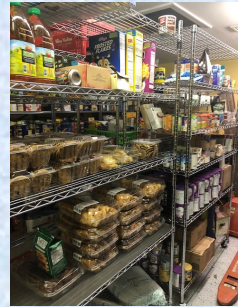
