THE THREE DAYS ... The journey continues!

As part of the celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), members of our parish offered reflections at each of the Morning Prayer services. Each week, we'll publish the text – or the excerpted text – for each one. Take some time to sit with these reflections and consider how they can serve as an inspiration for your prayer and service in the life of the Church. This week, we share the reflection of Gerri Plechner, OLQA's school nurse, who offered the reflection at Holy Saturday Morning Prayer

Today is about waiting...waiting for the resurrection, the longing for a new life. And it's a day of somber and darkness...."He has torn us to pieces...he has struck us down."

Our lives are not perfect, the journey is not easy. We face times of great challenges. And as I contemplate these words, I realized how when we bring our misery to the cross "He will heal us...he will bandage our wounds."

Our body is temporary. We are born into this world and as Christians we are baptized in our faith. Through our life we experience many ups and downs, moments of misery. When are we torn to pieces? And what do we do when we are struck down?

We may be broken in a personal relationship with a spouse, a parent, a sibling. It may be our physical health – diseases of the body – our hearts, our lungs, our bones that make it difficult with our daily lives. Sometimes it is our mental health that has torn us down – depression, addiction, anxiety which also make it difficult to function daily. And sometimes it's all three: our body, mind, and social well-being. That strikes us down.

If we look at today, we realize today is the day that allows us to grieve and wait for the new life that will appear tomorrow on Easter Sunday. Today is the day and, every day, if we bring our struggles, our misery, to the cross, we can manage through them all. We can slowly heal and maybe not in the way we expect a doctor to come in, diagnoses and prescribe a treatment plan.

Jesus will heal us and bandage our wounds in a different way. He offers us a new life, a life of release from the struggles of the body, struggles of the personal relationships, struggles of the mind. For when we walk with Him he will comfort us. Jesus brings us out of our conflicts, out of despair, out of our worry and into hope, reconciliation, and peace.

On Good Friday, Jesus endured a scourging that challenged his body, mind, and soul. As human, He was torn to pieces. The pain was excruciating. Yet He did it for us, and in doing so we, wait, today for tomorrow - the resurrection, a day of new life. And, as divine, with His resurrection He returned to His disciples and said, "Peace be with you!" After all that He endured... a betrayal by many and in many ways, there was no malice in his voice, no contempt... Peace be with you! The mystery of our faith.

Jesus is our light. Have you ever noticed when you walk in the dark how you stumble, you try to get your bearings, you are unsure of what lies ahead, you may loss you footing and fall or bump into things, you're not sure of your surroundings? And when the light is on you see things clearly, it's obvious what's in front of you, it easier to walk. You find your way. Well, that is Jesus ... the light. He removes the darkness, He removes our struggles, our misery, He heals us and bandages our wounds.

Sixth Sunday of Easter + May 22, 2022

My father had many moments in his life that caused him strife – most of his life. When I would visit, he would tell me he was in bad, bad shape. Yet when I asked him how I could help, he didn't answer. But when he recognized, he was going to die, he realized he needed to prepare himself. He changed his answer and he told me "I got this. I know what I'm doing." And literally pulled the sheet over his head. He wanted to be left alone, with God, and bring his sufferings to the cross. I noticed from that day, my father had such peace. A peace that I never saw before in my dad. His mind was finally calm without struggles. And that's because, it was the first time in a very long time that he was walking with Jesus and bringing his struggles to the cross. Not only did he bring his broken body, mind, and relationships to the cross... "I got this...I know what I am doing", he also let go.

For Jesus to heal us and bandage our wounds, we must let go and trust in Him. We must let the light lead us out of the darkness. When you bring your misery to Jesus, you also must let go and listen quietly.

So let us prepare today for tomorrow and every Easter Sunday let's renew our life, our spirit and recognize the sacrifice Jesus made for us, so that we can have Peace. "They will search for me in their misery", I wished he brought his sorrows, his pain, his misery to the cross sooner.

Why wait?

Peace be with you.



STATIONS OF LIGHT Prayer Service Fridays – May 27 and June 3, 2022 1:00 p.m. + Church Led by Sister Ann



The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiriting events of His post-

Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.


