Dear Parish Family:

I want to reach out to you regarding a serious error that was in many editions of last week's bulletin. Early Sunday morning as I was going through the bulletin I re-read the Healing Fair ad and saw the word "Reiki" was in the ad submitted. This was an error that, frankly, I should have caught and failed to as I did not preview the bulletin as carefully as necessary. There will be no representatives encouraging, advertising, practicing reiki or anything of the sort here at St. John's. This was a mistake that should have been caught, ultimately, by me.

While the Church does the see the good in many practices and in different faith traditions, there are significant problems with Reiki, particularly as it does not bring us to Christ for healing but keeps us in the things of this world. I am attaching a document from the United States Bishops about this - (<u>https://www.usccb.org/</u><u>resources/evaluation-guidelines-finaltext-2009-03_0.pdf</u>) regarding the Church's teaching on this. (If you cannot access the bulletin online, please call the office and I would be happy to send you a copy.)

The work of the Healing Fair is a project by a tremendous Eagle Scout candidate in our parish and meant to expose others to opportunities for healing and support in our local community – i.e. counseling, exercise, resources, social ministry support – particularly during these difficult times. Some of our parish prayer groups and social ministries have been invited to attend and you can tell from the ad above the Catholic Church is well represented. This effort is not intended in any way to bring people away from the Church or from Christ for healing. Rather, we hope the Lord continues to use many means to bring his healing to those in need.

I am grateful to those who reached out and shared their concern in a genuine, considerate, and kind way. I appreciate this generosity of spirit - a sign of the Spirit, for sure.

I apologize, again, for the error.
