A Reflection from Deacon Ed Grieb ...

'The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, Whom My Father Shall Send in My Name ... Will Teach You Everything!'

On this Sixth Sunday of the Great Easter Season, we and the disciples get a glimpse into The Mystery of the Trinity in today's scripture readings. Jesus speaks of the coming of a new person, the Holy Spirit, that will be present to accompany us once He is no longer physically present.

In the Gospel, we see Jesus is gathered with His disciples, preparing them for what is to come. He's just washed their feet and announced Judas' betrayal, and the disciples will become more confused and frightened shortly. Fast forward to our first reading today, and we now see them so much more confident, speaking in union of heart and mind with God, as they recall and live the words from today's Gospel, as they lead and guide the people through a difficult issue.

'Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him'... The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I told you. Peace I leave with you, My Peace I give to you.'

An invitation to share in God's Peace and Love comes to us in that Gospel passage today. Last week's readings reminded us that it was part of God's plan to dwell with us always. This week we hear Jesus give further clarity that if we love Him, keep His word, then the Unity, Love and Peace of God will be with us.

The disciples in that first reading from Acts of the Apostles are dealing with what could be a turning point for the new Church, a significant issue that's more than just a question about circumcision. In broad terms, the underlying question was really whether one had to be a religious Jew to become a

Christian. In hindsight, we know the answer. But the disciples, the new leaders of the Church, would be the ones to decide the



issue. They would debate, pray and discern on the issue. Importantly for us to see, they allowed the Holy Spirit to be part of this discernment. And then once united in heart and mind with God, they concluded together:

'It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us, not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities... if you keep free of these, you will be doing right.'

Remarkable... Joyous... Mysterious... So many words can be used to describe the lesson we see when we allow the Holy Spirit to be part of our lives, to show us how to open our hearts and minds to the gift of the Holy Spirit.

As we continue to move through this joyous Easter season, we are reminded of the gift of the Holy Spirit we each received at Baptism. The inner voice that guides us and teaches us the way of Christ; To do what is right! His unique and special Peace brings Hope into our lives. But we need to remember God's gifts are not meant to be hidden under a lamp shade or stored like grain in a barn... They are Meant to be Shared.

Next Sunday, June 1st, we have an opportunity to spend an evening in the presence of Jesus as the Diocesan Eucharistic Pilgrimage will be making a stop at our Parish. The evening is intended to help us renew our faith as we bring the message of Hope and salvation to others. Please see more information on the pages that follow in the bulletin.

Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Revival Nights

A Sacred Journey Across Long Island

Beginning on May 31st, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Diocese of Rockville Centre will launch two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages that will journey across Long Island, culminating in a grand celebration at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday, June 8th.

These pilgrimages will carry the Holy

cemeteries, and parishes. Along the way,
participants will have the opportunity to
engage in Eucharistic Adoration, the
celebration of Mass, Eucharistic
Catechesis, Praise and Worship, and other
deeply spiritual experiences. These
events aim to unite the faithful in a
powerful public witness to the Real
Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The People of God are encouraged to walk with Jesus in the Blessed
Sacrament, to pray within the designated pilgrim churches, and to joyfully proclaim the Gospel to those who witness the procession as it moves through their communities.

As a part of this spiritual movement, Revival Nights will also be held throughout Nassau and Suffolk Counties from Sunday, May 31st through Friday, June 6th. Each evening will include Eucharistic Adoration, dynamic preaching and catechesis, Eucharistic processions, and Nocturnal Adoration, creating an atmosphere of renewal and deepened devotion.

Together, these events form a profound diocesan effort to **rekindle Eucharistic faith and devotion**, inviting all to encounter Christ in a new and transformative way.






A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"I am going to give that person a piece of my mind." When we use that expression, we are usually angry and feel like we need to retaliate. On the other hand have these words from Jesus in today's Gospel reading at Mass (John 14:23-29): "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or Jesus spoke those words on His last night with the apostles at the Last Supper. The next day He experienced everything but peace. There was injustice, hatred, anger, vengeance, and spite that led to passion and death on the cross. Jesus in His love made it clear that it is not that we abstain from anger and vengeance, but that be consistent in our faithfulness to who we are as the children of God.

Reflecting on these words in today's Gospel, we come to see that it is not what we abstain from or cannot or should not say or do, but what we can say or do, especially challenging conversations encounters. What is the "my peace" Jesus offers to us? It is the peace that emanates humility, from truth, mercy, unconditional love. Unconditional love is not compromising the truth but living and speaking the truth with faith, hope, and love. To experience and live this peace that Jesus so hungers to share with us, I have to accept who and what I am and who and what I am not. Jesus accepted and lived with all His heart, soul, mind, and strength who He is as our God, Savior, Brother, and Redeemer.

The first readings at Mass these past weekdays have come from the Acts of the Apostles and recount how the apostles, St. Paul, and other leaders who embraced their faith in Jesus and lived it time and time again; rose above rejection, incarceration,

beatings, and death itself to be who they were and we are all called to be as followers of Jesus Christ

everyday lives. May we all come to the

point the Blessed Virgin Mary reached when

she said, "Let it be done to me as you

say" (Luke 1:38). Those were not words of

resignation, but words of complete love,

trust, and joy.

"Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace:
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy.
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

and it is in dying that we are born

to eternal life."




May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
