

# A Message from Deacon Michael Hoonhout...


### Trinity Sunday

Likely you have already done it today, without giving it much thought. And when you did it, you combined the two most distinctive truths about our faith. We do this to begin and end our prayers together because it truly captures the core of our faith. It is also such a powerfully symbolic gesture which marks us for who we are and what we believe as Catholics.

I am talking, of course, about making the sign of the cross while saying, "In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." Christianity is unique among all religions for believing in one God who is three distinct persons: the Trinity. And only Christianity dares to appropriate the sign of the cross, the most horrible means of capital punishment used to execute tens of thousands in human history, to signify the great work of salvation: the crucifixion and resurrection Jesus. And we combine these two unique Christian truths together so that all our religious acts and prayers are under the sign of the cross and in the name of the Triune God.

It is not mere coincidence that we combine the two. naming the Trinity while making the sign of the cross. We only believe that God is Trinity, a mystery that exceeds all understanding, because of Jesus and his cross. And the cross can only truly be saving if the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are truly one God. Both mysteries are interconnected and shine light on each other. What unites them, of course, is the one who is the center of both the Trinity and the cross: Jesus Christ.

Our faith in the Trinity arises from what Jesus said and did for us, for he revealed this inner mystery of the divine life to us by speaking of God as His Father, by saying and doing only what a man who is truly God can say and do, and by promising and then sending the Holy Spirit as God dwelling in our hearts. The doctrine of the Trinity is clearly not a human invention, since there is nothing in the entire universe comparable to three persons of one nature. Rather, the Trinity is the proper confession about who God must be given the events of our salvation: the Father sending the Son, the Son dying, rising and being exalted in glory to the very throne of God, and the personal and communal experience of God the Holy Spirit in our hearts and in our midst when we gather together in faith. There is only one God, yet in the Scriptures three Names are given us, who together accomplish our salvation,



and all of whom we experience in grace, prayer and sacrament, as we relate to and address the one and only God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Conversely, faith in the Trinity is necessary for the crucifixion of Jesus to be such a powerful source of so wonderful a salvation. For only if Jesus is truly God can we say that God shared his life with us and God died for us. If Jesus were just a mere man, his death would be tragic but it would not save the world, since it is his divinity which adds infinite value to his sacrifice. Also, only if Jesus and the Father are distinct persons can Jesus offer his life to God the Father and accomplish the Father's plan to redeem the world. For Jesus did not take it upon himself to save the world as a solo act. Rather, he humbly accepted the will of the Father to suffer and die, and his loving obedience redeems our sinful disobedience. Finally, it was the Father, by the power of the Holy Spirit, who raised Jesus from the dead, thereby confirming Jesus' claim to be God. Because the one God is thricely named, the death and resurrection of Jesus occurs as an exchange of love and life among the three divine persons, all for our benefit and salvation. The Trinity is the author of our salvation, and thus it is fitting that we name our God "Father, Son and Holy Spirit" as we sign ourselves with the cross.

**Let me close on a personal note.** Last Monday, May 20th, I celebrated the first anniversary of my ordination to the diaconate. There was a time of adjustment while I got used to doing what a deacon does: learning my lines and parts in the Mass, performing baptisms and leading wedding celebrations, and offering the hope and comfort of our faith in Jesus' Resurrection at wake services. At some point this year, I went from trying to be good at what a deacon does to just being a deacon. I have grown into the gift. But what has made serving as a deacon especially rewarding is all of you, working with such great priests and serving a people of such genuine faith and loving hearts. I thank God for the great, great blessing of serving as a deacon in the parish community of St. John the Evangelist. And I thank you too.


### Votive Candles/Altar Candles



The world-famous INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA will be on tour throughout our Diocese during the month of June 2024. On June 19th, The World Apostolate of Fatima-USA will bring the statue to our parish. This historic statue began its travels from Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1947, and has been around the world many times. Sculpted by Jose' Thedim, based on the description of Sister Lucia, one of the three seers, it was blessed by the Bishop of Fatima and commissioned to serve the Pilgrim Virgin, who would carry the blessings of Fatima throughout the world. The Bishop prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. The statue has visited more than 100 countries bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled. This is a special opportunity to pray with Our Lady, learn Our Lady's messages and requests at Fatima, and present any special intentions you may have for yourself or others.


# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

We live in the United States of America. What are we really united in? At this point, with the divisions we have politically and personally, the most we seem to be united in is that we physically live in one of the fifty states or were born here and are citizens. There is diversity which can enrich us. One of the goals that was put forth in the Declaration of Independence is seen in these words: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness". Today in the Church, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. As Catholics, Jesus Christ is the one who unites us with Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit and, in that process, with one another. It does not mean we agree on everything that is happening in our world or in our Church, but it does mean we all seek to be faithful to Jesus Christ. He has certainly expanded on the Ten Commandments with the Sermon on the Mount in chapters five through seven in St. Matthew's Gospel, and through the teachings that have come down to us through our 2000 year history. At different points in history, different new issues come up. Through prayer and leadership through the centuries, many issues have been addressed. We are faced today with such moral issues as abortion and sex changing operations - even for children.

Recently, I read about what I consider another sneaky and not so subtle attack on our celebration of Christmas. It comes from the National Football League who loudly proclaim that they will air three football games on Christmas Day. Now that might seem an option that is reasonable to some, but I see it as putting entertainment before and in place of what Christmas is all about. The NFL is big business and not only entertains, but is a multibillion dollar business. Three games on Christmas Day will probably take over nine hours of that day. And there will also be the added expense of viewing these games on programs that are outside cable TV. The days of watching the games for "free" with TVs hooked up to aerials are long gone.

The center and core of our Christmas celebrations as Catholics is going to Mass and giving thanks to God for the gift of Himself in Jesus. That is joyfully followed by gathering with family and friends to exchange gifts and greetings, and to be enriched by one another's company. The words of my mother ring out - "I don't want any presents for Christmas - just come home!" The gift is the joy of one another's

presence in our lives and the gratitude that flows from that. As Jesus is a gift to us we are a gift to one another. Our presence to one another truly is a gift. Do we really need to



I am not anti-NFL but I am disappointed that those who run it seem to think of Christmas as a lucrative entertainment opportunity. I began listening to games in the late 1950s on the radio in Greenport because our TV reception had only two channels the aerial could pick up from Connecticut, and the games were not on those channels.

The joy of Christmas is wonderfully expressed in this prayer from the Bible that I pray everyday from the breviary in Morning Prayer:

### Benedictus - Luke 1: 68-79

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; he has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David.

Through his holy prophets he promised of old, that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us.

He promised to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant.

This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham, to set us free from the hands of our enemies,

Free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, To give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.

In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.


# Knights of Columbus


