STATIONS OF LIGHT Prayer Service

Fridays – May 7, 14 and 21 1:00 p.m. + Church Led by Sister Ann

The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiriting events of His post-Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since

the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.

THE THREE DAYS

The journey continues!

As part of the celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), members of our parish offered reflections at each of the Morning Prayer services. Each week, we'll publish the text – or the excerpted text – for each one. Take some time sit with these reflections and consider how they can serve as an inspiration for your prayer and service in the life of the Church.

This week, we share the Holy Saturday Morning Prayer Reflection offered by Lorraine Hickey. Lorraine helps to coordinate the RCIA adult process (in English) and the Ministry of Consolation. She is also an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and a member of the Art and Environment Ministry.

In his Holy Saturday message last year Pope Francis said: there is great silence on Holy Saturday just like it was on that very first "Holy Saturday which was the day of God's silence".

That great silence is about more than just talking less, having less noise around us; it is about having a silence within us that will allow us to reflect more deeply on the crucified Jesus being in the tomb.

There is silence here in the Church – no Masses, no Funerals, no celebrations, and the Church is bare – an empty tabernacle, no statues, no decorations --- our focus is solely on the cross Jesus died on and his being in the tomb.

We are waiting – waiting for that tomb to be opened.

We are grieving - grieving for the suffering and death Jesus experienced for our sins; for his Mother Mary – her agony, her pain, her loss; for his apostles and friends;

We are longing for a new life - a life that does not end in physical death – that new life we know is given to us by Jesus' death and Resurrection.



YOUNG AT HEART



Last week I mentioned that with all the deaths we have had during this pandemic as well as the natural deaths many have experienced in this parish as well as in other parishes, a support gathering can be very helpful. It is good to experience support in a prayerful setting with others who are going through similar setbacks by family and friends who mean well but have not felt the loss as you have. At present, we have a small group that meets on Wednesday morning at 10:30 in the convent IHM room or on the porch on nice days. I

have a person anxious to meet in the evening because she is working. I will be happy to start a group in the evening, but we need a few more. If you have lost a loved one, even a year or two ago and are still having difficulties with this loss, this group may be just what you need.

We still have the Rosary every morning at 10:00, but it would be great to add a few more. People who tell me that they say the Rosary "on their own" forget that Jesus told us that "where two or three are gathered together, there I am in their midst." By joining this group, you will be meeting more people and strengthening the power of your prayer. If you have an iPad, a computer, or just a phone, you can join into the group. The information is in the bulletin for how to join. If you need help, I can assist you.

Since last Sunday I have been intrigued with the "Good Shepherd" story. Msgr. Vlaugn mentioned in his homily how difficult it is for most of us to understand the relationship between a shepherd and his flock since most of us have not had that experience. But we can make a similar experience between a dog and his owner. I realize that it is not the same since most dogs are not group animals. But a dog knows who cares for it, who takes it on runs, who trained it. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, knows us; He knows our every need, our every good or not so good actions. Fr. Jaime suggested in his Monday morning reflection that we should picture our relationship with Jesus as St. John showed us. Picture yourself resting your head on the chest of Jesus as he did.

When I was missioned in La Plata, MD, we had an active 4H group to which many of our students belonged. Some raised a calf to adulthood and then brought it to the County Fair to be auctioned off. One of our teachers had several children who raised animals for this purpose. It was difficult for some of the children because they became attached to their animal which had become a pet. One of our first graders was too young to be responsible to raise an animal on his own, so he shared responsibility with one of his older brothers who was raising a sheep. They had to wash and keep the animals clean. His mother was asked to settle an argument between the boys when the younger boy would only agree to wash the front end of the animal! Sometimes I wonder how Jesus deals with us when we set out to do a feat but if something happens that we don't like, we start to create "bargains" with Jesus, "If you do this then I will do . . . " I'm so glad we have a Good Shepherd who is so patient with us.
