FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

From Trinity to Sacred Heart

FEELING THE PAIN

Dear Parish Family:

Before I entered the seminary in 2009, I felt need to go on a retreat. Honestly, I had never been on an extended retreat before that time. I asked a friend to help me find a place. I resigned from my position as the Campus Minister/Social Worker/Teacher at St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School on July 15th. On July 16th, I was on a plane heading to a retreat at the Camaldolese Benedictine Monastery in Big Sur, California. (I had never been to California either.)



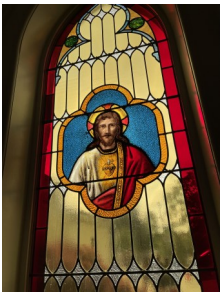
In a week of trying to figure out many things (What does God want of me? How will I live as a seminarian? What will it be like to not work? and so on), I met a monk named Fr. Michael. I think he was just what I needed. With a deep South African accent, Fr. Michael met and sat with me for a few moments and said, “John, don’t try to be a monk. You’re here to let God love you.” I needed to hear that. I needed to calm it down and relax a little bit as the years ahead would be unlike any others.

I need to write to him as I have thought about many of the things he has said, particularly over the past few weeks. He was recently profiled in a show about preaching which led me to consider some of his other talks and ideas. He said during a workshop, “Prayer is listening to the heartbeat of God...Prayer is also you sitting down and inviting God to come and lean God’s ear against your heart...”

This week, I want to invite you to consider joining me in the Novena to the Sacred Heart that will conclude this year on June 11th. This devotion comes from apparitions of Jesus to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 1670’s. The first apparition occurred on the December 27, 1673 (the feast of St. John the Evangelist, by the way!) and the final one occurred on the Friday after Corpus Christi, the day the feast is celebrated today. Here Jesus revealed to Sister Margaret Mary the outpouring of his love to humanity and how humanity has hurt his heart.

I have come to have a great awareness of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in my own life. It is a devotion that I need to remind me of God’s outpouring of love for me and, yes, the times I have hurt that heart with my own weakness and pain and failure (and you can bet there is a lot of this!). I try to light a candle each day at the shrine at St. John’s, often remembering and asking God to help someone or someones who are in my heart on a given day for better or for worse and yes, at times, for the struggles in my own heart.

The booklets for the Novena will be at the doors of the Church. We will use a text from the Society of Jesus in Ireland that was made available in 2020. If you’re open, consider taking a booklet and pray with it each day in the days ahead. Take an extra copy and feel free to share it with others too. (There is no fee for the booklet—if you’d like you can leave an offering in the Sacred Heart shrine.)



I had the chance to meet Fr. Michael a few more times that week. He checked in a few more times. On my last day, we talked about the years ahead and he gave me great advice that I turned to often (he wrote it on a napkin while I was helping him with lunch—his “work” for the week at the monastery). He helped me to open my heart a bit too so I could hear God’s heartbeat and, I’m pretty sure, God heard mine then and still does now. I just need to create the space to let him do this.

If you can, remember me in prayer in these days of the Novena to the Sacred Heart. I promise the same.

Let me know your closeness to me, and your care for me and all who are dear to me. My intention for this Novena is dear to me, and I know that what is important to me is important to you. Hear my prayer (mention your intention); grant what I ask, and may I always trust that in all that happens in life, you will be close to me as my friend, guide and saviour. And so, Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.

Novena to the Sacred Heart

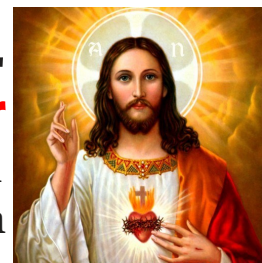

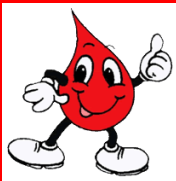
ERNIE'S PLACE Volunteers Needed!

Reading I: Exodus 24:3-8

Discussion Questions

1. Moses couldn't imagine anything comparable to the love that God had shown his people. What, in God's plan of salvation, was Moses *not* aware of? Jesus? The Holy Spirit?
2. "We are ... heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ." What do we inherit with and in Christ? Which treasures do you want the most? Which do you need the most?
3. What do you think Pope Francis means when he says that the Trinity is wholly at the service of the world, which he wishes to save and re-create?
God loves the world, despite its sins; God loves each one of us even when we make mistakes and distance ourselves from him. God the Father loves the world so much that, in order to save it, he gives what is most precious to him: his only-begotten Son, who gives his life for humanity, rises again, returns to the Father and together with him sends the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is therefore Love, wholly at the service of the world, which he wishes to save and re-create. ... And it would be beautiful if we felt that we were loved.
