

FROM THE SEMINARIAN'S DESK

Dear Parish Family:

This week, we take some time to reflect on the many gifts Paul Clores has brought to our parish this past year. How blessed have we been for his presence here! While Paul's official assignment ends this weekend, he will certainly remain a part of our parish family in the years to come! I Am Better Because I Was Here

I was never supposed to be here. This was the thought that went through my head as I walked into the destroyed church building on May 20th, 2017. I was originally supposed to be at Holy Name of Mary in Valley Stream but, because of practical reasons, it didn't work out. Instead, I was sent out to all of you.

On May 13th, the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, I sat in St. Edward the Confessor in Syosset and I had just walked out of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I did my consecration to the Blessed Mother for the first time entrusting my vocation to her. That evening I moved into the rectory here at St. John's. When I was walking around the church that Saturday, after everything had happened, I was taking it all

in. Finally, I stopped at the tall statue of the Blessed Mother that stood in the corner, now blackened by soot and dust. It was then that it hit me: this is exactly where I was supposed to be.

This past year I have learned much about what it means to live in and run a parish community. I have learned a tremendous amount through the youth, especially through my Level 6 faith formation class and the 2nd grade class at OLQA. I have had the chance to meet people in prison and on the street and truly experience the broken world around me which has allowed me to reflect on my own brokenness. I have interacted with many of you in different ways whether it was through different meetings, projects, the Adult Formation Classes, or just after Mass on Sunday. In all of those interactions, you have taught me much and I am grateful.



When I first entered seminary, I could've never imagined the different places God would take me. I could've never told you that I would be in Nebraska one summer, walking the Camino in Spain the next, or coming out to Center Moriches for my Pastoral Year. My spiritual director at the seminary once described God as an architect moving the pieces of my life around. St. John's has been one of the most important pieces of my formation as a seminarian.

In my time here, God has shown me how unworthy I am of this vocation. I have been humbled by your kindness, generosity, and, most importantly, your love of Christ and His Church. I am grateful to the priests of this parish, especially Fr. John. It is through him that I have truly learned what it means to be a good shepherd in the Church. I am grateful to God for the gift that He has given to me in this parish and St. John's will certainly hold a special place in my heart.

Please pray for me as I continue in my seminary formation and know of my prayers for all of you. We have all heard Fr. John say the phrase, "We are better because you are here." The truth is I am better because I was here.

May the Blessed Mother protect and guide us to her Son always. God love you.





Low Gluten Hosts (less than .01% gluten content) are available for those with Celiac Disease who cannot receive Holy Communion using the usual bread. If you need to re-



ceive Holy Communion using a low-gluten host, please stop in the sacristy before Mass to discuss this with the priest and see if this will be acceptable for you and/or your child. If you cannot receive the low-gluten host, we can offer a separate chalice for you. We will be happy to accommodate you if we can. Please let us know.


