A message from DRVC Coordinator of Development ...

Hello! My name is Tanner Zalud and I am the Parish Development Coordinator for the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Fr. A message from Michael Hoonhout ...

In the first reading this Sunday from the Acts of the Apostles we hear the apostles laying hands on the first deacons in the Church, almost two thousand years ago. In two weeks, the same rite is going to be performed again in the Cathedral of St. Agnes in Rockville Centre, when Bishop John Barres, like all bishops an anointed successor to the apostles, will lay his hands upon six men of our diocese and by the power of the Holy Spirit make them permanent deacons for the Church on Long Island. I am very blessed to be one of those six.



At the beginnings of the Church the need arose for deacons to assist the apostles because the needs of the community were greater than what they could attend to. The same is true today. Deacons are called to serve the Church by assisting priests and the bishop of the diocese in the pastoral care of the people of God. Like bishops and priests, deacons are members of the clergy for they too are ordained by the laying on of hands. Although deacons are not priests and cannot say Mass, hear confessions, or anoint the sick, they assist the celebrant of the Eucharist, call people to repentance and greater conversion, and bring Holy Communion to the sick and homebound. They celebrate the sacraments of baptism and marriage, preach and teach, and serve in various ministries in the parish or the diocese. They also are another set of eyes and ears for the pastor (and the bishop) so that they may have a better sense of the desires and needs of the people of God.

The seven men who became the first deacons were chosen because they were "reputable" and were "filled with the Spirit and wisdom." Similarly, those who are admitted into formation for the permanent deaconate must be living lives of Christian virtue, faithful to the call to holiness we all received in our baptism. We have been in a program of human, spiritual, academic, and pastoral formation for the last 3-4 years, led by a formation team, with yearly evaluations and under pastoral supervision. Given the grave responsibility the clergy have in the eternal, spiritual welfare of the flock, it is prudent and wise for the bishop to know through a long and formal process the quality and caliber of the candidates for ordination.

It has been a journey of discernment, growth, and now in the final days, one of preparation and practice. I am on this journey because I truly believe God is calling to me to serve as a deacon. How have I heard the voice of Jesus in this call? Not as an explicit voice from heaven, but in many distinctive ways heard with faith: the persistent thoughts and desire to become a deacon; the suggestions and encouragement from others to become one; the loving support of my wife and family; the acceptance into the program of formation and the positive evaluations; most of all, the peace I have had in accepting and obeying this calling, like the peace I knew when I proposed to my wife, and a peace I never did have when as a young man in the seminary I spent six years discerning the priesthood.

There are other "voices" I hear sometimes, but do not listen to—"Why make your life even busier than it already is?" "Do you know what you are getting into?" "Do you think you are better or more special than anyone else?" But it is easier to trust that Jesus is leading me because of how my life has been richly blessed in pursing this calling. Already I have come to experience that you certainly receive more than you give. To be a deacon is to follow Jesus' great example of service, how he lived up to his own words: "I have come not to be served but to serve." I can assure you that I already know that I cannot live up to Jesus' example, and yet I trust that He is calling me to take this step because He will give me the strength and grace I need to be the deacon He wants me to be. In the ordination rite, after the laying on of hands in silence, the bishop prays the beautiful prayer of ordination that calls down the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. It is this sacramental grace of holy orders that makes a man a deacon, and sustains him in the exercise of the office. This special gift of the Holy Spirit gives me confidence to listen, trust and follow Jesus, our Good Shepherd who always serves us.





Identify your risk of having a stroke or abdominal aortic aneurysm

If you are between the age of 30-90 years old and have any of the following:

- Personal history of smoking, high blood pressure, diabetes or high cholesterol.



Bereavement... Grieving is a natural process each of us goes through after

the death of a loved one. While no one can take away the sadness, others can help by listening and caring. Sharing feelings with others who have experienced the death of a loved one helps many people to heal.

St. John's Bereavement Group began meeting on Wednesday, April 12th. Facilitated by Loretta Gallagher and Maureen Harney, our group will meet weekly on Wednesdays, for 8-10 weeks from 10am to 11:30 in the Convent. Our beloved Sister Ann started this group about 10 years ago and it has been a great support to many in our parish community who have suffered the death of a loved one. If you, or someone you know might benefit from this support community we hope that you will join us. Many of our current and former participants have shared that the second year can often be more difficult than the first, sometimes managing through the first few months with support from family and friends but realizing that others sharing the same feelings are often the best supporters. Most people also find that a group is most beneficial if started not sooner than three months after the death, however this is an individual decision, and all are welcome at any time. We do ask for a \$10 donation for the cost of the program materials. If an evening group works better with your schedule, please reach out, we are open to facilitating an additional program if there is interest.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Recently, I went through a period of spiritual dryness, and I questioned my ability to make faith the central tenet of my life. Although I had always loved reading Scripture, I felt I needed reassurance that God was truly present with me. So I did what many people do: I asked God for a sign that he was real. Nothing happened. The sky didn't open; doves and rays of light didn't magically appear announcing God's presence. Although I didn't receive what I envisioned as a "heavenly sign," I looked down at the Bible in my hands and realized that God's word, handed down through the millennia, had been my companion all this time and was indeed the "sign" I was looking for. Which is why Jesus' question to Philip in today's Gospel struck a chord with me: "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me?" If Jesus asked me this same question, I want to be able to answer, "Yes, Lord, I know you through your sacred word, through partaking of the Eucharist and through the strength and guidance of the Holy Spirit who is with me each and every day."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

What does "knowing Jesus" mean for me in my everyday life? It means hearing his words and acting on them: "I am the way and the truth and the life ... If you know me, then you will also know my Father." In following Christ, we know that Jesus is in the Father and the Father is in him. Jesus Christ is God! And as we heard in the second reading from Peter, we are not Christians on a lonely road; we are living stones that form a spiritual house. We are "called out of darkness into his wonderful light," as he describes it. Therefore, let us not be afraid to lean on our fellow Christians when we need support. And then, of course, we turn to Jesus, the cornerstone, the bedrock of our faith, and rejoice in his love for us.

ACTION Faith is rarely a straight path - sometimes there are sharp curves, steep hills, or roadblocks. If you feel lost or could use someone to talk to about faith, reach out to your parish and ask about contacting a spiritual director. *Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with your grace.*


