### FROM Fr. John's DESK

### Good Shepherd Sunday

### **FATHER TONY**

Dear Parish Family:

When I was a young boy at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in West Islip, Father Tony was the priest you wanted to be sure was at Mass. He was a newly ordained priest, I believe. He had funny homilies, great energy, and a spirit that made this particular three or four year old laugh and smile. For this simple mind, "church" was fun.

I think of that experience on this Good Shepherd Sunday. We traditionally celebrate this on the 4th Sunday of Easter, with a particular focus on encouraging vocations to the priesthood. It a reality we need to look at without a doubt. We need priests! The lack of vocations to the priesthood is beginning to and will for years to come impact our Catholic way of life. We see signs of this already. Pastors, in some cases, are called to shepherd two parishes at the same time, services are being combined, and in some places, parishes are being closed or put into different forms (clusters, etc.). The thought of the years ahead can be a cause of great stress and anxiety. I know the Holy Spirit is at work somewhere in this....but what exactly is God asking of us?

Can we consider three areas to look at to encourage more people to consider priesthood? The first suggestion is an important focus in these days of Easter. The final two suggestions are practical and come from a recent study of newly ordained priests (https://www.usccb.org/committees/clergy-consecrated-life-vocations/ordination-classes).

First, pray to the Holy Spirit! Soon this will become the focus of the days of Easter as we move closer and closer to Pentecost. Like the disciples in the locked room on Pentecost, it can be easy to get overwhelmed and locked away. This is not an option. The Holy Spirit has something great in store for us. Let's pray that we can discern this well! I think the Synod on Synodality is going to help with this (see page 4). In our prayer, let us ask for the grace to trust the work of the Spirit in the Church in these days and times.

**Second, encourage involvement in the life of the parish and the church**. In this recent study, 74% (!) of those ordained as priests were altar servers and over 50% were readers and extraordinary ministers and/or part of a youth group or campus ministry program. Please consider encouraging the young (and not so young people) you know to consider getting involved in the life of our parish. The importance of belonging to a community cannot be minimized in the discernment process.

Third, don't be afraid of the conversation! In this recent study, over 90% of those ordained were encouraged by someone in their lives to consider the priesthood...90%! From the overview of the report, it is this intervention that was most common among the soon to be newly ordained. Who do you need to reach out to and encourage?

When I think of my own journey to priesthood there were many seeds planted for many years before I finally considered the seminary. There were many family members and parishioners who asked me to think about it or offered an encouraging word. They planted seeds. I could not wait to be an altar server. More seeds planted! I was able to find a home in my home parish and knew I belonged there. It took a while but all those seeds eventually took root.

This week, I had the chance to meet with the pastor I will follow at St. Brigid's in Westbury. He took the time to come all the way out here to share some information, offer encouragement, provide a few good laughs and promised he would support me in any way he could in my time at St. Brigid's. He even took time to listen to the staff here and offered great insight and support. He made a great effort to put us all at ease.

Who would have thought the paths of that the priest from years ago who planted some of those seeds and I would cross again. Father Tony is the present pastor of St. Brigid's in Westbury.

Remember...the Holy Spirit! Always at work!

If you can, please say a prayer for me!

We need you and your planting help! As we enter into the Spring season, can you help to take care of an area of our parish's huge property!




We are asking each family, ministry, individual or group of friends to begin taking care of a part of our parish's grounds by planting and maintaining that area for our parish and school!

# THE THREE DAYS... The journey continues!

As part of the celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), members of our parish offered reflections at each of the Morning Prayer services. Each week, we'll publish the text — or the excerpted text — for each one. Take some time to sit with these reflections and consider how they can serve as an inspiration for your prayer and service in the life of the Church. This week, we share the reflection of Mary Rodriguez who offered the reflection at Holy Thursday Morning Prayer.

We have in Jesus a genuine model to follow, Who showed us a way of living and suffering through which we can make ourselves more perfect for God. In the Seventh Station of the Way of the Cross, Jesus falls a second time. Jesus is in the midst of His Passion. In a sculpture depicting this station, we see Jesus spilled beneath the heavy weight of the cross, lying on the stony path to Calvary. A Roman soldier looks off to the distance detached from the suffering before him, perhaps concerned with his obligations to his superiors, another day's work.

Simon of Cyrene is there, strong and able, trying to lift the cross up off of Jesus, but his approach looks half- hearted, his grasp neither lessening the weight nor alleviating Jesus' suffering. A third figure looks angry with Jesus, prodding Him to get up, with a "Let's get this over with and we can all go home" attitude.

We all have crosses. What is our attitude to the suffering we bear? Do we accept it? Get angry? Detach ourselves?

The hand with the firmest grasp on the cross is Jesus' hand. He's not letting go, He is keeping the weight of the Cross fully on Himself. By His suffering He has made himself the perfect sacrifice, putting Himself in obedience to God, to carry this through to the completion of God's Will. Let us put our crosses together with the Cross of Jesus, sustained in our suffering by prayer and by the Holy Eucharist.

# STATIONS OF LIGHT Prayer Service

Fridays – May 13, 20, 27, and June 3, 2022

The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiriting events of His post-Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.


