FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

QUESTIONS, QUESTIONS, QUESTIONS

Dear Parish Family:

This weekend is a weekend of mystery in the life of the Church. The Holy Trinity is often a source of many questions and, truthfully, questions that are not entirely able to be explained. Even more truthfully, I am not going to be able to answer them. There's something engaging about living in the mystery of the Trinity. We try to embrace it, allow ourselves to be embraced by it and use the "clues" the Scriptures and the Church's teaching give us.

I have a feeling the situation of our Church building is becoming a bit of a mystery. Some people are wondering why it is going to take so long or what's the status of the building or what can we do. Let me try to answer a few of the questions, then if you have others, I'll answer those in the weeks ahead.

Why is it taking so long? The major damage to the Church was not damage related to fire but to smoke and the effects of the various chemicals used to attempt to start much larger fires. Basically, we are going rebuild the entire interior of the Church. This includes the replacement of all pews (they could not be refurbished), new duct work throughout the Church (this will require going into some walls), replacement of the ceiling and recently installed light fixtures, a new organ, a new sound system, a new floor and likely a few more things. (We seem to find more problems as we go along.)

What are we doing now? Right now, the primary work has been the removal of many of the items above and related cleaning. The soot and smoke damage seeped into just about every part of the Church. We have met with an architect and are in process of working with the Town of Brookhaven to secure the necessary permits. The process of arranging different contractors and coordinating these various services will naturally add to our time.

Was anything salvageable? Yes! All of our liturgical furnishings (altar, ambo, Presider's Chair) and the statues are all in relatively good shape. The reredos was not damaged nor were the Stations of the Cross or the stained glass windows. Everything is in need of a good cleaning but we're working on that.

How can I help? Right now, we're in a place where not too much can be physically done. Certainly, we are in need of help with our auditorium set up and clean up and will likely need help with more projects in the months ahead. I promise I will let you know if and when help is needed. People have asked about making donations and certainly donations are most welcome. We will use that money toward the rebuilding efforts. I am hoping not to have to undertake a capital campaign or fundraising campaign for this rebuilding project.

Are we going to be OK? Absolutely. No question about that.

Our coming together in the midst of these days is—yet—another reason for our hope!

- Our program begins when students enter First Grade.
- When registering your child, please bring their baptismal certificate (or birth certificate if they were not baptized). Only a parent/guardian may register a child in our program.
- For parents of students already registered in our program, you will be notified about your child's class placement via email and through a mailing over the summer. **Any placement change requests must be made in writing via email to: faithformation@sjecm.org.**
- We currently serve nearly 1,800 students in Grades 1-8. During this time, students are expected to participate in our program each year as they grow deeper in their faith and touch on different topics.
- We provide Sacramental preparation for 1st Communion and Confirmation, as well as Baptismal preparation for those students above the age of 7. This involves two years of preparation.
- Beginning this academic year, our 1st Communion preparation (Levels 1 & 2) is now in-parish only (classroom setting) on Saturday mornings.

Words of Wisdom

A miracle has occurred! It happened over two thousand years ago and it is still happening. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might have eternal life. God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." I have read these opening words of today's Gospel (John 3:16) over and over through the years, but after the events in our parish a bit more than two weeks ago, these words took on a whole new meaning for me.

No matter who we are, no matter the color of our skin, no matter our ethnic or religious background, the truth is that this God sent his Son into the world for each and every one of us. God loves us more and better than anyone else ever could love us!

Not long ago while at prayer I was reminded that Satan is an angel—a fallen angel—never-the-less his intelligence is greater than ours. You remember how he tried to tempt Christ to worship him; that scene is a tremendous reminder that he can tempt anyone of us. Some people have disciplined themselves to be able to resist strong temptations; some of us are weaker than others, and some suffer in ways we don't always understand. Always remember that we have received the Holy Spirit to help us, to guide us, and to strengthen us to be able to resist temptation. Jesus did not leave us orphans. Today we celebrate the fullness of God as we pray to the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—to increase our faith, to bring us hope, and to help us in our concern for others.

St. Paul reminded the Corinthians to: "Rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you." (2 Corinthians 13:11.) We parishioners have received so much outpouring of God's love through the support YOU have bestowed upon one another and your constant concern for others. Your concern for our church building shows the strength of true Church—its people.

We do not understand why bad things happen to good people but to a people of Faith all things work out. One woman told me that she told children that when bad things happen, God cries, too. Could God stop bad things from happening? Yes, but that would take away our free will which is given to all people; that is a gift that no one wants to lose. Pope Frances said recently: "Without a cross there can be no resurrection." Honor and pray to the Holy Trinity and we will have our resurrection.

1. "He let you be afflicted with hunger, then fed you with manna ... in order to make you understand that one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord." In this statement, which is the source of their life, is the bread still efficacious, or is it just the promise of God?
2. "When we eat, we incorporate our food into ourselves. The opposite is true with regard to the Eucharist. When we partake of that bread we are transformed into it." (Dianne Bergant, CSA, Preaching the New Lectionary: Year A) Explain in your own words what this might mean.
3. When Jesus gives us himself in the Eucharist, does he give us his presence, or does he give himself in the whole Paschal Mystery (passion, death, resurrection)? Discuss.
