FROM Fr. John's DESK

Sacraments and the Trinity

RELATIONSHIP

Dear Parish Family:

I have been working with seventh graders for the first half of the third trimester on the sacraments of the Church. It was an interesting journey as the work of the course invited them far beyond the rituals and rites and working to help students to see the liturgical and sacramental acts of the Church as an entry way into the relationship of the Blessed Trinity. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us, "In the Church's liturgy the divine blessing is fully revealed and communicated. The Father is acknowledged and adored as the source and the end of all the blessings of creation and salvation. In his Word who became incarnate, died, and rose for us, he fills us with his blessings. Through his Word, he pours into our hearts the Gift that contains all gifts, the Holy Spirit." In the celebration of the liturgy, and particularly the sacraments, we are drawn in to the relationship that is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The celebration of the sacraments whether we receive or are part of the assembly reminds us of the power of that Trinitarian relationship—Father, Son, and Sprit—we pray about this weekend. In his reflection about the Blessed Trinity, Fr. Timothy Radcliffe writes, "The persons of the Trinity exist, as it were, from their mutual relationship. The Son receives everything from the Father, and the Spirit from the Father and the Son. The Trinity is not a community of three persons who happen to get along famously. They are persons in relationship."

I was thinking of this connection because of the work in class, some conversations we have been having in our Liturgy Committee meetings, and considering the many sacramental celebrations we offered together throughout the Easter season. It started with the Easter Vigil with the baptism and full initiation of our neophytes. It continued with the celebration and reception into the Catholic Church of one of our parishioners. We celebrated with our young people who received Holy Communion for the first time at liturgies during the week and at Sunday Mass. We celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation for eighteen of our parishioners last Saturday. Next week, we have the privilege to pray at the Ordination of Fr. Louis Cona.

Father Radcliffe writes further, "Of its nature, the Triune love overflows. The Father and the Son are not stuck in a mutual infatuation. Their love overspills in the Spirit. This is a love which is open beyond itself. If the Trinity makes its home in our love, then our love must overflow. Otherwise it goes sour." We, too, must overflow! I hope that will be true we who have worship and prayed throughout the days of Easter in the celebration of these sacrament as well each one of us when we gather for the celebration of the Mass. The love between the Trinity fills us to the point of overflowing with that love that like the Trinity we might change the world.

There's another consoling thought. It speaks to us about the power of relationship. Isn't that the hope of the sacraments—that we would be so bonded in the love of God that we would remain forever linked in that divine love? Yes! It also speaks to us about the importance of relationship in our own lives. If we allow ourselves to be touched by power God's love, no distance (or assignment or term for that matter) that can break that bond of love and relationship that forms among each one of us in our families, friendships, and communities.

Let's pray that as we contemplate the love between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit we may better mirror it in our celebration of the sacraments and the way in which we live our lives.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

The leader or presider of the prayer will guide through this prayer. Generally, Evening Prayer is about ten minutes in length.

40 HOURS DEVOTION A special holy hour for children and families! Thursday, June 16, 2022 6:30 p.m.—7:30 p.m.

As part of our 40 Hours of Devotion, we will have a special hour designed for families on Thursday, June 12 from 6:30-7:30 pm. This time of communal prayer will be geared for children including an introduction to what exposition is, why it is such a very special time to be with Jesus and time for quiet prayer (and we used the term "quiet" rather loosely). This hour will allow families to come and worship without the worry of distracting others as they bring their children to actively participate in the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. It is an hour to respond to Jesus' request, "Let the children come to me." All are most welcome to come during this beautiful time…children from birth to 100!

Remembering loved Ques

SJE offers a number of ways to remember loved ones, or honor someone living.

Mass Intentions. Remembering one who has passed away at Mass is a most noble practice calling us to pray for one who has died at the most powerful prayer we know—the celebration of the Eucharist.

Altar Bread and Wine. Names will be listed in each bulletin during the course of that month.

Votive Candles/Altar Candles. A number of votive candles enlighten the beautiful statues in our church. You may have a particular devotion to one of these saints. These candles are next to the statues of the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, St. Teresa, St. Gerard Majella and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. They bring a certain light to the statues and, hopefully, inspire some deeper times of prayer and reflection.

Gospel + Luke 9:11b-17



These repairs not only make our parish's building and grounds more beautiful, they make these areas of our parish safer and more secure. 
We are still in the process of receiving approval from the Diocese of Rockville Centre for the Rectory Roof. The process hit a "bump" last month as we learned the existing roof contains asbestos (as do many roofs put on 30 years ago!) and additional work is required for the safe removal of the existing roof. Once this approval is received the roof project will begin. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus for their donation that will provide for the cost of the roof. We are unsure of the additional cost of the asbestos abatement.


