FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Parish Social Ministry

Cedar Trees, Seeds and Social Ministry

Dear Parish Family:

I want to take some time to share some information and updates about Parish Social Ministry at SJE. The mission of the Church is to go out and to sanctify and to make holy the world, most especially in the lives of the poor and the vulnerable. Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "To love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it. Besides the good of the individual, there is a good that is linked to living in society: the common good. It is the good of 'all of us', made up of individuals, families and intermediate groups who together constitute society."

In any parish, the primary responsibility of working towards the common good falls to parish social ministry or parish outreach. SJE has an incredibly rich tradition of seeking to build the common good in this local community. That is a testament not only to those who have volunteered but to each member of this parish who through generosity, prayer, and witness who have done so much for those most in need in our parish.

As you know, we have seen some major changes in Parish Social Ministry over the past year or so. COVID-19 impacted the functioning of our ministries as well as the needs of those seeking assistance. Increased government funding and the temporary moratorium on evictions has reduced some of the crisis intervention work we carry out regularly. Alex Finta, as you also know, resigned as Director of Parish Social

Ministry in November. That, too, has had a significant impact on our work and

ministry.

While these changes have impacted us, the work has continued on in these most unique and challenging times. Since November through the end of Lent, the leaders of the various parish social ministries have been meeting with me two weeks a month. We are going to start those meetings again soon. Our case manager Christian Diconsiglio

has stepped up in great ways over the past months. He has taken on some pretty significant responsibilities - few of which he signed up for when he joined our staff. We have been blessed with a gifted social work intern, Liam Costa. Liam was with us in the Fall and Winter and is returning to SJE this week until the beginning of August.

Over the next months, we are going to be actively pursuing a new Coordinator of Parish Social Ministry. This important work of the parish needs a person to lead the effort to build on the great work that has been and is part of the fabric of SJE. While we are doing an enormous amount for those in need from intake work to various ministries, there is much work to be done. (You can read more about it on

page 6.) We are going to move most of our parish social ministry hours and services to 3 p.m. and later. We are finding the late afternoon and evening a better time for both clients and volunteers.

The mission of parish social ministry, the work of the building up the common good here, reminds me of so many of the references to the cedar tree in first reading and the psalm, and the seeds planted in the Gospel can serve as good reminders of the work parish social ministry. The work of parish social ministry

requires us to provide the shade and protection for the poor and the vulnerable while also, we pray, lifting those who are down up to the highest points while also planting seeds that we pray will take root. While the practical work may mirror the efforts of other impressive organizations and support program, this cannot be us. If it's only about filling material and practical needs, we have failed. Rather, the work of the Church must always be about evangelizing in ways big and small—to those who pray each week and those who simply come with needs and desires. This, too, is the work of building up the common good. In this work it is not simply about providing for the practical needs of this word but also making connections that link them to the life of the Church and, we pray, eternal life!

Discussion Questions

- 1. The tender shoot becomes a majestic cedar. In the Gospels, Jesus refers to the "least" becoming the "greatest" numerous times. How is Jesus' own life an example of this? Can you think of others who followed or now follow this example?
- 2. Do you have confidence all the time, even when your spiritual weather is stormy? When Paul says "we are always courageous," is it true? Are you courageous? Always? What helps when you are not?
- 3. According to Pope Francis, what happens to our (small, mustard seed-size) gifts when we trust God instead of ourselves?

If you had faith as a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this sycamine tree: 'Be rooted up, and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." ... Thus, Jesus wishes to make it understood that faith, even if small, can have the power to uproot so much as a sycamine. And then to transplant it into the sea, which is something even more improbable: but nothing is impossible for those who have faith, because they do not rely on their own strengths but in God, who can do everything. ... It is a faith that, in its humility, feels a great need of God and in its smallness surrenders itself, trusting fully in him -Pope Francis, Oct 6 2019 Angelus
