FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Nourished, Holy, Enlightened and United

GETTING A LIFE

Dear Parish Family:

I originally planned this letter to be a listing of updates regarding some of the practical details related to the "re-open", if you will, of the church and the public celebration of the sacraments. Then, I gave up because it is changing too quickly. In the time I started writing this letter I learned we will be permitted to minister communion at Masses beginning this weekend. Good changes overall. We're getting there.

In the middle of writing this letter, I also stopped to work with one of our awe-some eighth graders at OLQA. He is doing a report on electrical devices and how they link to people living a "good life". He had over 70 responses to his survey. I went through his data and I was excited. I was trying to remember all my statistics classes and what we could do with this information. Sensing my enthusiasm and excitement he said, "Fr. John, with no disrespect, get a life. Who wants to talk about statistics? I just want to graduate." He was smiling and it was said in good humor. (It's too bad he won't graduate for another three years. I hope he liked his joke.)

This weekend, we celebrate what gives us life—the gift of the Eucharist. We know how vital it is to our lives in a most powerful way because we have missed it so terribly over these months. We have missed all that brings us into the presence of Jesus Christ—the assembly gather, the priest presider, the Word of God and most powerfully the Real Presence of Jesus Christ transformed from bread and wine. It is He who nourishes us, helps us to find holiness, enlightens us and unites us (taken from the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer). We seek these things in other places and often come up empty or find ourselves going down dead ends. This requires a deep renewal of our reverence, respect, and engagement in the Mass when we gather. This means we come open acknowledging our need to be filled. This means our life renewed in the Eucharist **sends us forth** to enlighten the world, to unite others in the Body of Christ. If we're doing this part right, it's going to be hard work. It means we keep coming back to the Lord—in silent prayer and contemplation, in the Word broken open, in the quiet of eucharistic adoration, in whatever we can continue to do to extend the graces and blessings of the Eucharist. Even in these days when

we could not see each other or even pray together, I came to know more powerfully how the Eucharist unites is ways seen and unseen.

We also suffer a tough transition in our parish. Fr. Michael will be taking leaving of SJE some time in August to become the Chaplain at St. Anthony's High School. (I admit when I heard this news last month, I drew on my inner Job and said, "Really, Lord. Now?") This is a wonderful opportunity for Fr. Michael and, I'm sure, a time of great enlightenment coming for the community of St. Anthony's. If they encounter even a glimpse of the spiritual gaze and multitude of gifts we have been blessed with over these years, how blessed are they!

As a community we have work to do. The months ahead are not to be a wake for Fr. Michael or for our parish. It is a time for each of us to come together and to not only wish him well but to **send him forth** to a new and exciting (and challenging) ministry. We have been blessed to be part of Fr. Michael's first years as a priest. Our parish—and its pastor for sure—has been nourished and made holier because of his presence and

priestly ministry. I know that blessing will not end but will continue to enlighten and unite our parish.

As we return to the Table of the Lord this weekend, let's seek nourishment, holiness, enlightenment and unity in the Body of Christ and go forth ready to be the same for one another.

- **Chicken Ministry** As of this time, egg crates are no longer needed. As the need arises, we will publish that in future bulletins.




GARDEN MINISTRY

PRAYER TO OVERCOME RACISM

Mary, friend and mother to all, through your Son, God has found a way to unite himself to every human being, called to be one people, sisters and brothers to each other. We ask for your help in calling on your Son, seeking forgiveness for the times when we have failed to love and respect one another. We ask for your help in obtaining from your Son the grace we need to overcome the evil of racism and to build a just society. We ask for your help in following your Son, so that prejudice and animosity will no longer infect our minds or hearts but will be replaced with a love that respects the dignity of each person. Mother of the Church, the Spirit of your Son Jesus warms our hearts: pray for us. Amen.

From *Open Wide Our Hearts*, the United States Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Racism:

"To walk humbly with God" requires even more. We know that we do not have all the answers, but a missionary disciple is one who willingly meets every problem and every sinful attitude with the confidence that comes from a deep love of Jesus. As Pope Benedict XVI has said, "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." The Christian community should draw from this central, ongoing encounter with Christ and seek to combat racism with love, recalling the insight of Pope Francis that "if we have received the love which restores meaning to our lives, how can we fail to share that love with others?" With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, this wellspring of strength and courage must move us to act. Consequently, we all need to take responsibility for correcting the injustices of racism and healing the harms it has caused. (p. 22-23).
