#### June 15, 2025 A Reflection from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

#### The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

Last weekend when we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit into our lives, we were reminded how we share in God's life through this precious gift. It is only through the Spirit of God that we can enter into an intimate relationship with Him. It is through baptism that we first enter into this precious everlasting relationship. Through this sacrament, we are baptized and incorporated into a great community of love that exists between the Father, the Son and the Holy

Spirit. It is through these words that we find new life in God – "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." These words make all the difference in our lives. It is a permanent relationship that we enter with God at our baptism. And each day we are called to deepen our personal relationship with God through our prayers and the sacraments of the Church.

How reassuring these words are from our Lord, found in today's gospel, during this glorious feast of the Most Blessed Trinity: "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason, I told you that He will take from what is mine and declare it to you." (JN 16:15) It is clear in today's gospel that God wants us to live a full life with Him. Jesus reminds us that God wants to share His entire life with us, filled with hope and joy...a life that is fulfilling and everlasting! What a message of hope—a message clearly defining God's allembracing love for us! Everything that is His is now ours because of our mutual belonging. Through baptism, we now belong to God and to God alone!

**Moreover, Jesus' Universal Prayer** found in all of John's gospel chapter 17 reassures us of this great promise. It basically sums up the true meaning and understanding of today's feast. Jesus' prayer expresses His vision and hope for all of humanity for all ages. He prays that we may be one as He and the Father are one! He prays that we may live and remain in their love. And when we do, we live and remain with them. We are one with God in our love for one another. "In the One, we are one." (JN 17:21) We too share in the gift of

everlasting life because of God's desire from the beginning of time to be one with us.

**St. Augustine sums it up the best** when speaking about the inner life of the Most Blessed Trinity that exists between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. He says that the love that the Father has for the Son and the love that the Son has for the Father is the Holy Spirit – that great love that co-exists between the Father and the Son creates the Holy Spirit which draws us into full

communion with God. It is through the grace of baptism that allows us to participate in the very life and inner workings of the Most Blessed Trinity. Baptism opens the doors to Christ so we can meet God through the Spirit.

It is up to us now to keep the love of God and the Spirit of God alive in our world today! We are called to make God's love visible in our lives and the lives of one another. The second part of our Lord's Universal Prayer

reminds us how important it is for us to join the Lord in glorifying God. This concept of universal glorification applies to all disciples of all ages. Because of the Holy Spirit, we can now participate in the life of the Most Blessed Trinity whenever we open our hearts to God! We can make visible in concrete ways what is often abstract and not so visible in our world. St. Augustine says, "that God loves us so much, as if there was just one of us in the world." Maybe we cannot change the world, but we do not have to let the world change us. Is this not the mission of the Church but to do the work of the Holy Spirit—to make God's love known to all?

It is up to us to keep the mission of the Church alive in our world today — in doing the work of the Holy Spirit. How wonderful it is to know that we have the power and authority by the grace of God to continue the work of redemption! We make God's presence felt and visible in our world today by the way in which we obey His commandments, by loving always, by loving one another as He has loved us! You see, the more we remain and abide in God's love within our lives, the more others will be inspired to do the same. For Jesus, this is what gives credence to our faith when we live and remain in God's everlasting love!

Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Today, consider a dad like Paul. Paul saw information about the Catholic



Ministries Appeal at his local parish, and he knew he had to turn to the Church for help since he had nowhere else to go. Paul had been gainfully employed for more than 10 years when he began to fall ill. Soon his medical issues made it impossible for him to keep working and he was forced to go out on disability.

After paying the co-pays on his medications, his family's rent and utilities bills, Paul had very little left to purchase food and other necessities for his family.

It was hard for him to ask for help, but with nowhere else to turn, he did. Catholic Charities found him a specialist who assessed the family's needs and directed them to appropriate resources in their community. He went to his Parish Outreach, where his family received food that allowed them to make it through the month. Paul and his family received the help they so desperately needed.

Today, Paul is back to work and the family is doing well. "I am so thankful that I know there is somewhere I can turn, where there are people that care, people I can talk to, if I am ever in such a situation again," shared Paul.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

As smart, clever, and ingenious as we can be as individuals, there is always that innate hunger to be at peace with one another. Peace is far more than the absence of conflict and disagreements. True peace is found in our willingness to humbly, lovingly, honestly, hopefully, and joyfully seek to grow in our love, respect. concern for and one another. Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday. There is no greater example of unity than that of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Their mutual love is so powerful and pure that it has resulted in the creation of the world we live in and the creation of the human race of which we are blessed to be part. Through the gift and vision of faith, we come to see and experience the power of God's creative, redeeming, and eternal lifegiving presence and love. Even more than being part of the created world, we are the high point of creation, blessed to be created in the image of God Himself. Living in God's image, we seek to become one with Him and one with each other. We cannot become one with each other in the best sense of that phrase unless we are becoming more and more one with God. And at the same time, we cannot become more and more one with God unless we are sincerely seeking to be one with each other.

As we read the Gospels, we see that many times Jesus went to out of the way places to be one in prayer with the Father. That unity is so clear in His prayer in the Garden as His crucifixion was imminent. In Matthew 26:36-45, Jesus prayed three times that this cup of suffering would pass, each time knowing there will be no escape. In less than twenty-four hours after that prayer, He suffered death by crucifixion in the face of what seemed to be abandonment what we see here is how far God is willing to go to welcome us into His life in this world and into

and absolute injustice.



in this world and into eternal life in heaven when we die. How can this not seem to be too good to be true?

But

The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are completely one in their love for each other and one in their love for us. There is no greater picture and example of unconditional love, forgiveness, and gratitude to suffer for us than Jesus embracing the Father's way for us. Jesus did not seek to make us one with Him through fear and angry threats of damnation, but with words of pure, "Father, forgive unconditional love: them. they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) That verse is completed with these words: "They divided his garments by casting lots."

We all deal with difficult moments of division and tension. True peace comes not by seeking to win and have the upper hand. Reconciliation is found only when there is humility, truth, and mutual love and desires for reconciliation. It not always easy to take the first step. It is only with humble prayer as we see Jesus prayed in the Garden that the light of peace, hope, unity, and joy begins to dawn.

May we pray the prayer Jesus taught His disciples when they asked Him how to pray, especially in times of disunity, anger, and injustice.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

# A Father's Day Message from our Grand Knight...

St. Pope John Paul II credits the prayerful devotion of his father Karol Wojtyla Sr. for his own inspiration to practice the faith as he grew up. The elder Wojtyla believed it is the primary duty of a father to get himself, his wife and his children to heaven.

The fatherly witness of prayer, participation at church and actively teaching children the faith has a huge impact on our children. This fact is borne out by several studies. One often quoted is from Switzerland which came out in 2000. The study reports:

- If Mother and Father both attend Mass regularly = 74% of their children will attend Church as adults. (33% Regularly and 41% irregularly)
- If Mother attends regularly and Father attends irregularly only 3% of children will attend regularly; 38 % will no longer attend.
- If Mom is regular and father doesn't go at all, 2% of children will attend regularly as adults; 60 percent of their children will not attend at all!

In short, if a father does not go to church- no matter how faithful his wife's devotions - only **one child in 50** will become a regular worshipper. If a father does go regularly, regardless of the practice of the mother, between two-thirds and three-quarters of their children will become churchgoers (regular and irregular).

If we Dads takes our faith in God seriously, then the message to our children is that God should be taken seriously. Nothing will be more impactful on a child's faith that our witness as fathers.

We make a commitment to our children at baptism to develop and strengthen their faith as they grow. A more recent statistic from the Pew research center shows that only 22-25% of men attend Mass regularly. We have a duty to give our children a path to successfully developing their relationship with Jesus., Regularly attending Mass will give your children a great example to follow in their own faith journeys.

The Knights of Columbus are committed to encouraging one another to grow in the faith. Many of us discovered

the richness of our own Catholicism after joining. The power of the Rosary, the peace and unity with Christ we find in Eucharistic Adoration, and the richness of scripture as the Word of God are things many of us didn't explore until we became Knights. Our faith has increased, many of us attend Mass more often than we did before joining.

Let us help deepen your faith to become the kind of witness to your family that Karol Wojtyla Sr. was to his son. There is no guarantee your son will one day be Pope, but with the election of Pope Leo XIV, our first US born Holy Father, you never know.
