

The world-famous INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA will be on tour throughout our Diocese during the month of June 2024. On June 19th, The World Apostolate of Fatima-USA will bring the statue to our parish. This historic statue began its travels from Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1947, and has been around the world many times. Sculpted by Jose' Thedim, based on the description of Sister Lucia, one of the three seers, it was blessed by the Bishop of Fatima and commissioned to serve the Pilgrim Virgin, who would carry the blessings of Fatima throughout the world. The Bishop prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. The statue has visited more than 100 countries bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled. This is a special opportunity to pray with Our Lady, learn Our Lady's messages and requests at Fatima, and present any special intentions you may have for yourself or others.




There is no change necessary for your fulfillment and perfection that you are not capable of achieving with the assistance of the Divine. The answer to this problem is to replace the old activity with a new activity. A person experiencing a problem in purity can respond in several ways. For example, if he is constantly glaring lustfully at women as they walk down the street, his response can be twofold. First, he can learn to admire the pavement instead of scanning everything as he walks down the street, thus limiting the input to his imagination. Then, with his imagination and attention now his slaves, he can use them to begin a conversation with Christ, and he can try to sustain this conversation always and everywhere," praying constantly" throughout the day. Thus, far from focusing on the negative and the "sacrifice" being made, he moves forward by replacing the activity being removed with one much more positive, beautiful, and fruitful to his development. I have this to say focus on the good, the noble and the just. Also try to focus on the positive not negative and always hope in God. It is the replacement of one activity with another of greater meaning and value that makes attempts to change successful. If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above (Colossians 3:1).

Surrendering your life to God is about making yourself available for Him. God works many wonders in the lives of those who make themselves available to Him. There is no advance in spiritual life without humility. As we enter deeper into relationship with God, we come to know ourselves better and better. This self-knowledge is often humiliating. These humiliations give birth to the virtue of humility in a soul. Prayer humbles us and opens our eyes to the person we really are and the person we can be. When you come to a realization like this, you are at a crossroads in your life. You would notice to your left lies the road of pride. The road of pride is an easy one. There are no mountains to climb on this path; it is downhill all the way. It is a smooth path and gentle on your feet. The road that leads to happiness or fulfillment are hard and difficult to reach. It is not an easy road at all.

I thank God always for placing me with very devoted and prayerful priests for the past thirteen years at St. John the Evangelist. It has been an absolute honor to work with the staff that are very professional and worked as a team. My thanks and prayers go to all the parishioners at St. John the Evangelist. You motivated me through your prayers and devotion. Thank you for being a great inspiration in my spiritual life. I am very grateful for the successful thanksgiving mass on June 9th, 2024. 

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

In a spiritual book I use in my daily prayers, I was struck by this quote from St. Francis of Assisi: "Where there is patience humility, there is neither anger nor worry." Living in such a fast-paced world with all kinds of messages, information, and products available, literally at our finger tips on our electronic devices, it is hard to be patient as we track our orders and continue to go on sites that fuel our concern, anger, or pleasure. Can this saying from St. Francis of Assisi, who lived 1181-1226 - over 800 years ago an inspiration and source of strength, hope, and guidance today? We can say life had to be simpler then but, through the centuries, people who took St. Francis of Assisi to heart have found the peace, hope, inspiration, and lifegiving guidance that only Jesus can bring and give to us. That does not mean we all have to join the Franciscan order priests, as brothers. sisters or the third order. In reality, what that simple thought captures is how Jesus Christ lived, preached, taught, and healed. Jesus faced doubt and skepticism as we saw in last Sunday's Gospel (Mark 3:20-35) where His relatives thought He was out of His mind and the religious leaders accused Him of being possessed by the devil. The account of His passion and death shows so very clearly how even in the midst of rejection, abandonment, and injustice Jesus had the inner patience and humility St. Francis speaks about. Was Jesus worried and angry? Certainly not! In His final words at the Last Supper

(John, chapters 13-17), Jesus so hopefully said, "No one has greater love than this, to lay



down one's life for one's friends." The passion and death of Jesus clearly reveal His patience and humility. He did not come to impose God's will upon us but to reveal God's love for us and invite us to experience it and with it Him and He surely had enough another. during His passion and death to drain all patience and humility out of Him. But He was not angry nor did He worry that He had died in vain. He patiently and humbly did what we all need to see, know, and experience in our lives to find purpose, hope, meaning, trust, and inspiration. He found the peace we all seek from the very depth of our minds, hearts, and souls. Not only has He showed us the depth of divine love and mercy, He invites us to experience it and share it with Him and one another.

## Let us pray.

In your goodness O Lord, pour out on us the fruits of your Spirit: patience, kindness, and gentleness. May we ove you and possess you, for you are love. May every action of our lives praise you. May we seek those things which are beneficial to our brothers and sisters to help them on the way to salvation.

"Where there is patience and humility there is neither anger nor worry." There is only God and His love through us, with us, and in us.
