

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Walking by Faith....Father's Day...Novena of Spirit and Truth

MUSTARD SEED MOMENTS

Dear Parish Family:

Today, a good friend asked me, "Are you ready for Sunday? You going to be OK?" It took me a minute to realize what he was referring to—Father's Day. My heart sank a bit. As many of you know my dad passed away a few months after I arrived here. I dreaded last year's Father's Day and to be honest it was not as bad as I feared. In some ways, I am finding this year's Father's Day a little more challenging.

I find that it's not the big things that I miss—though I do. It's the small things that I miss the most. If you have lost a dad—through death, perhaps to divorce or separation or abandonment or neglect or whatever—you might be able to relate. You know it's the small things that often tug strongest. For me, I remember my dad always be so gracious and humble. Never drawing attention to himself. Always looking to make sure everyone else was comfortable or at ease. Even in sickness and suffering, he never worried about himself. "What's the latest?" I remember him asking whenever I would see him or "Keep me posted" as I would leave. Not the scenes of dramatic movies but I think it's those small things I miss the most. You know some of those small things too—a regular phrase, a warm gesture, a card given, a note shared and so on.

It is also those small things that I can most quickly lose sight of in all areas of my life. I think that is what Jesus is getting at in today's Gospel. God works that way, in the small and simple. We can so easily miss it. Caught in sight—what we want to see—we fail to see with eyes of faith. St. Paul reminds us, "We walk by faith, not by sight." Yet we see with human eyes, human things instead of longing for the vision to see far beyond the "things" of this world.



I hope you can see some of those mustard seed moments as we journey together through the Novena of Spirit and Truth. Through praying, fasting and even planting, we are coming together to see it is often in the small and simple ways that God makes his presence known. The week ahead we will be invited to forgiveness (Monday), fun (Tuesday), prayer and remembering (Wednesday), service (Thursday) and offering (Friday). The opportunities in this Novena of Spirit and Truth are not meant to be "big" things. They are simple mustard seed opportunities for each one of us see the presence of God here and now with those eyes of faith

As I reflect upon the journey of this year, there have been some big moments, for sure. Some of those moments were positive and some a bit negative. I tend to let those go a little more easily than the smaller moments. I think of the altar server who asked after all that happened in the church, "What about the statues?" I remember the phone calls and texts from friends from all over on May 17, 2017. I remember people coming forward offering whatever they could in those first days. I think of the many kind, simple words to me over the year. It's the not the big things. It is the simple, quiet moments that take hold. Those are signs of God.

For from these small moments, I pray that new life as Jesus puts forth about the mustard seed may take hold for each of us and for our parish community. **Keep me posted!**



Rules:

- Form a single file line handing the balls to the first two players in the line. The first player will shoot, once they have gotten their shot off, the player behind them may shoot.
- Everybody's first shot must be taken from the free throw line.
- If the first shooter makes a basket before the second, they hand the ball to the next person in line.
- If the second shooter makes a basket before the first, the first shooter is eliminated. The balls are then handed to the next two players in line and play resumes.
- The order of the players can never change during the game.
- A shooter may never interfere with another shooter's ball. This will result in an automatic elimination from the game.
- The game continues until all but one player has been knocked out. This one talented player is the winner.



3 vs 3 Tournament

Ages 16 and up—EVENING ONLY

\$40 per team.

Depending on number of teams, double elimination will be used with a loser bracket. Seed will be based of perceived ability by tournament facilitator.

Rules

- Every game will be played to 5, or 7 minutes. Whichever comes first.
- After a team scores, the opposing team starts with the ball.
- Games are played to straight 5, not win by 2.
- Each basket is worth 1 point, regardless of where the shot is taken.
- If the game is tied after 7 minutes, the next team to score wins.
- Offense will call fouls.
- The team who is fouled will get the ball at the top of the key.
- If there is an air ball or turnover, the ball must be brought back to the top of the key before offense is initiated.
- All participants must sign an injury waiver prior to the start of the tournament



BEARING WITNESS: WHY BE A CATECHIST?

In this series, catechists from our Faith Formation program share why they enjoy bringing the faith to the young people of our parish. This week features one of our Level 7/8 Catechists, Jerry DiPierro, who is part of our Confirmation prep program.

Hello! My name is Jerry DiPierro and I've been teaching religion here at St. John's for about 18 years. I

really enjoy being a catechist because I enjoy teaching students about their faith and bringing them closer to God. It is nice seeing the students grow in their faith, especially when they learn something new. It makes me feel great when they make that connection from the material being taught.

(When the light bulb turns on!) Also, developing a rapport with the students is another key factor.

I currently teach 7th and 8th grade. At this age, the students for the most part have a basic knowledge of their faith. They are at the age where they want to know more about their faith. Sometimes they do ask me questions and I may not have an immediate answer, but I tell them to research it and report back to me the following week, which works well. We also have a great support system and I know I can reach out to the Faith Formation staff and our priests for guidance. (In my 8th grade class this year, we were blessed to have Fr. John visit and answer some of those questions!) We also play games and try to find new ways to make the learning experience more interesting.


