More transitions...FATHER JAIME

I want to let you know about a change to Fr. Jaime's assignment. On June 29, 2022, Fr. Jaime will become the Parochial Vicar of St. Jude's in Mastic Beach while continuing to serve only the Spanish community here at St. John the Evangelist. He will no longer live at St. John's as his primary assignment will be to minister at St. Jude's. In a sense, it is a "flip" of his present assignment. Fr. Jaime has been serving here as the full-time Parochial Vicar of St. John the Evangelist while ministering to the Spanish community at St. Jude's in addition to this assignment. For the day to day life of St. John's, this will not be a significant change as Fr. Jaime will be here most Saturday evenings and Tuesday evenings for the Spanish masses. He will arrange with Father Patrick other details related to office hours, other assistance, etc.



In April, Fr. Jaime had asked to be on retreat and vacation from this past Monday through July 1st. So he's not leaving early and he didn't "dip" :). He had these arrangements made prior to any changes in his assignment were officially known. While he may return early from vacation to handle the practical details of moving, he will not be on the schedule again until the Spanish Mass on July 1st.

Let's add Fr. Jaime to our intentions in prayer, particularly as we pray before all of our Masses and prayer services.

FROM Fr. John's DESK

Father's Day 2022

Go figure

Dear Parish Family:

A few years ago, a younger person was completing graduate school. I have known him for a number of years. He was struggling and worked through the struggle that was not critical. For a while he was not honest with me about something. When it finally came out, he said "You know my dad isn't the greatest and you're not him or his role. But you are like a 'father figure' to me and I'm afraid I would be letting you down." My heart sank, hurt, feared, and lifted all at the same time if that makes sense.

Our country celebrates Father's Day this weekend. It is one of those days that can strike each of us a little differently, no? I think of the prayer on the front cover of the bulletin. There's joy and celebration for many today. For others it is a time of pain, and even resentment over difficult histories. Still, for others it is a time of memory—either a child mourning his or her father or the other way around.

I'm thinking of the title Father today for a number of reasons. The obvious reason is the celebration of this holiday and for me, and likely many others, a reminder of a certain physical absence. I think today of Father Louis Cona who was ordained on Saturday and who will pray with us next Sunday. I think of that title and the significance it bears. I remember after my own priestly ordination began called "Father John" for the first time and it taking some time to get used to hear that title. Someone even pointed out to me recently that I always write out "Father" when I sign my name. There's something about that title.

Studies outside of religion and theology reveal the incredible impact the father relationship has on children—both positive and negative. There is a writer—I cannot recall his name right now—who wrote that each person has a "father wound", a certain pain or hurt from that relationship. I see first hand in my roles as priest, teacher, and social worker of the absence of a positive father-child relationship. It even has an impact on faith. One can start to see God the Father in the image of their own father and it causes a spiritual breakdown.

We need to pray for more individuals to respond to their God given call to be fathers. For some it a title given at birth. For others, it comes with Ordination. I pray, though, that it might be a title given to each of us as we try to show another "the face of God in heaven". It requires a certain wisdom, patience, interest, and compassion. It is not easy.

Today may be a good day to reflect on not only our fathers from birth but those who have been "father figures" to us and perhaps those we are called to be father figures to in this life. (Please—the same applies to mothers and mother figures!) Who has helped to heal some of those wounds? I think of so many of you in this parish who have sought to take me under your wings over the past six years, particularly after my dad passed away. I think of how many people in my own life have served as those figures of good character, encouragement, challenge and witness. I have a feeling even if our relationship with our fathers may be complicated, there are many father (and mother) figures we can be grateful for today.

It is a reminder for us to see where God might be placing us at different times and moments. Whose wounds have we been called to ease or soothe? I think of St. Joseph. He was called to play an unplanned, unforeseen role. Quietly, humbly, with little desire for attention, he raised Jesus and modeled for him a way to live. We know at times it was not easy. Yet he endured and Jesus was better for it. Perhaps today, too, reflect on those we have been called to guide and mentor and encourage. What a grace and privilege for us to be called.

I still keep in touch with the person I wrote about earlier. There's a wedding in the works and I was asked to preside. Good signs of the Spirit at work. Take some time today to see that same spirit calling you to model Mary and Joseph and so many others. It's probably more than you think!

Go figure.

If you can, please say a prayer for me.

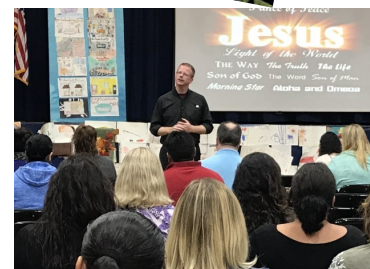

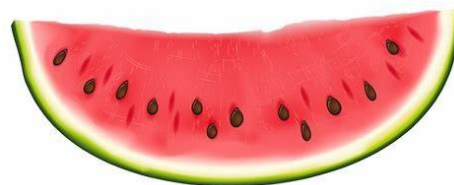

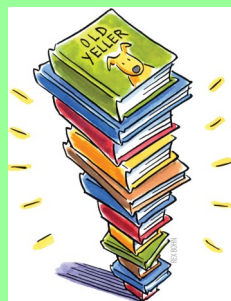

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS



Thank you for your patience as completed a number of small construction projects in the parking lots and by the rectory. Some final work is needed on the rectory ramp which should be completed this week.

We are still in the process of seeking approval from the Diocese of Rockville Centre for the Rectory

Roof. The process hit a "bump" last month as we learned the existing roof contains asbestos (as do many roofs put on 30 years ago!) and additional work is required for the safe removal of the existing roof. Once we add this work to our proposal (still collecting estimates) we will seek permission from the Diocese to begin the project. Once this approval is received the roof project will begin. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus for their donation that will provide for the cost of the roof. We are unsure of the additional cost of the asbestos abatement.

This week and early next week, the Summer Appeal mailing for 2022 will go out. It is because of your support in these efforts that we can maintain and enhance our parish in ways seen and unseen.

REACH (Research + Excellence + Academics + Catholicism + Hope)

REACH is a two year process that requires students to propose, research, study, and present their findings. Instituted in 2018, this project is a requirement for graduation at OLQA.

REACH 2022

The Class of 2022 presented their studies at the REACH Academic Symposium on Thursday, June 9, 2022. Students presented on topics ranging from blown umpire baseball calls, solar power, food allergies, suicide and depression, social media, grass and turf fields, and much more. Student's mentors as well as members of the local community questioned the students. Following the presentations, students were available for more specific question at their poster presentations.



REACH 2023

The Class of 2023 visited St. Joseph's University last week. Students in 7th grade are beginning the Review of the Literature sections of their REACH projects. Students worked with the library staff to learn the foundations and the "how to" of research using many collegiate resources. Staff from SJU then gave students a tour of the campus showing the various parts of a college campus. Students will return to SJU in the Fall for more library work, including receiving SJU Library cards that will allow them to use the resources at SJU in the year ahead.



Journeying Together!



Hello! You may have seen me serving in the sanctuary as an acolyte at one of the weekend Masses over the past few weeks. As I am new to the parish, our Pastor Fr. John has kindly asked that I write a brief self-introduction.

My wife, Glee, and I are moving to Center Moriches from Smithtown where we have lived the last sixteen years and raised our three sons. In the Fall I will enter into my final year of formation for the permanent diaconate, and God-willing I will be ordained next May and begin serving here as a new deacon.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, I have lived on the East Coast since going to Boston College for graduate studies, where I earned a doctorate in theology. There I met Glee (who is from Chicago originally) and we married and started our family before moving to Maryland as I was hired to teach at Catholic University in Washington, DC. In 2006 we moved to Long Island when I started teaching at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington. I continue to teach deacons and lay students there as well as seminarians studying for the priesthood at St. Joseph's Seminary in New York.

Two areas of interest in my research is the relation between theology and science (right now I am writing on the question of the origin of life from a scientific and theological perspective), and theology and Catholic literature (Flannery O'Connor is a particularly favorite author). I am a big baseball fan, especially of my hometown Dodgers.

My wife and I are quite excited to become members of St. John the Evangelist and have already experienced a warm and friendly welcome from those of you we have met. I pray for all of you and humbly ask that

you remember me and my classmates in yours so that we may continue to be formed into the servants (*diakonia*) that our Lord is calling us to become.

Fr. Patrick will become the Pastor of St. John the Evangelist R.C. Church on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Fr. Patrick was ordained on June 9th, 2001 and became an Associate Pastor at St. Anne's in Garden City, NY from 2001-2005. From 2005-2010 he served as Associate Pastor in St. Patrick's parish of Smithtown, NY. In June of 2010, Fr. Patrick became the pastor of Infant Jesus in Port Jefferson and has served there for 12 years.

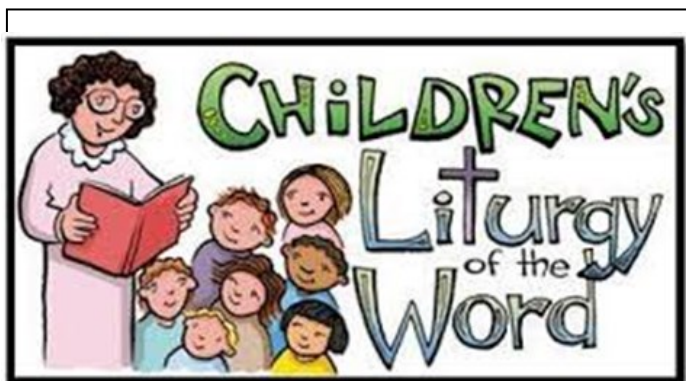

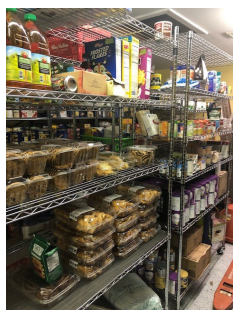
Street Ministry— serving the homeless in our area each week
