#### A Reflection from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick ... Jesus' Universal Prayer ~ John's Gospel, Chapter 17 Joy, Unity and Glory

June 1, 2025

**In John's gospel**, all of chapter 17 is dedicated to the Lord's final prayer for His disciples of all ages. This prayer, which is unique to John alone, is also known as the Lord's Universal Prayer. Just shortly before His arrest in chapter 18, and just after His farewell address to His disciples that took place after the washing of the feet, Jesus offers this historic prayer for all of humanity. He is thinking of us and our well-being when reciting this prayer. Knowing what was in store for Him, an agonizing and shameful death, Jesus is turning to God with complete trust and faith in His love and providence for His people.

This prayer also reassures us of Jesus' complete love for us. He is turning to God in faith knowing that His hour has arrived to glorify God once and for all through His passion, death and

resurrection! His prayer to God during the last supper discourse sums up His purpose in this world and His complete love and concern for humanity—that He may remain faithful to the end, and that His disciples may be swept up into God's love and be kept safe from the evil one. He prays that His disciples may live in peaceful unity with God.

Now that Jesus has revealed to His

disciples in words and action all that has been given to Him by the Father, He is ready to hand over His life for our salvation. Knowing that His task is complete in revealing the fullness of God's love for humanity in His words and actions, He is now ready to glorify God through His suffering, death and resurrection—in bringing the world the forgiveness of sins, life everlasting!

Here in John's gospel, chapter 17, Jesus prays for His disciples. He prays that they may follow in His footsteps in giving testimony to God for future generations—in revealing God's precious love for humanity. He prays that they may be one as He is one with the Father through holiness and mission. He prays for their ongoing conversion. He prays that they may be strengthened in their faith and remain obedient to God's word and commandments. He prays that they may lead others to holiness and reflect the oneness of love that exists between the Father and the Son.

In general, this universal prayer is timeless. It is as relevant today as it was 2000 years ago when Jesus was alone with His disciples in the Upper Room on that first Holy Thursday when preparing them for their hour in going forth. In actuality, this prayer is divided into three parts. The first part, Jesus is asking God that He may remain faithful to the end in glorifying Him before the entire world. The second part of this universal prayer is dedicated to His closest disciples who will share in His mission and continue the work of redemption after His ascension into heaven. He prays for their protection and willingness to remain strong in giving witness to God's word and love to all.

**Finally, the third part of this prayer** is dedicated to all of His disciples of all ages, including you and I, that we too may follow

in His footsteps, like His first disciples did in bearing witness to the truth. He prays for all of His disciples in every generation until the end of time that we may remain one with God in our love for Him and one another. He prays that we may never waiver away from the faith or be separated from Him and His Father.

In summary, this prayer is filled with hope and joy that comes from celebrating Easter. It is reassuring. It reminds us how Jesus cares for us and looks out for us. It reveals how God wants to share His life with us when we remain in His love. It is clear from this universal prayer that we belong to God and to God alone. It is evident just how much God wants to be a part of our lives, and how important it is for us to remain in His

love and share in our Lord's mission in revealing His glory and love to others.

> **Today's prayer prepares us** for next weekend's feast, the Feast of Pentecost, which marks the conclusion of another Easter celebration. Hopefully today's prayer will allow us to reflect more on God's saving love found in our Risen Lord who loved us to the very end.

Hopefully we will have some time this week to prepare our hearts once again to receive and be

renewed in the Holy Spirit so that, together as one, we can remain one with God and help our Lord renew the face of the earth.

#### Parish Update

Next weekend, during the Feast of Pentecost, I will have the joy of confirming 28 adults at the 5 PM mass on Saturday. I will offer the Sacrament of Confirmation to those who have prepared to be fully initiated into the life of our Universal Church. Deacon Michael has prepared these adults during these past couple of weeks to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. I am excited to be part of this special celebration here at St. John the Evangelist. In addition, next Sunday on June 8, during the Feast of Pentecost, all are welcome to participate in our Diocesan Eucharistic Congress that will be held on the grounds of St. Anthony's High School in Huntington. So much work and effort went into putting this event together.

**Please see in our bulletin** and on the Diocesan website about all the different activities and celebrations that will take place throughout the day. The Eucharistic Congress will conclude with mass led by our bishop, John Barres, at 4 PM. Hope you can come to this event and join in the festivities if you are able to do so. Many graces and blessings come from a Eucharistic Congress. Let us pray that this Eucharistic Congress will enkindle in us the gift of the Holy Spirit and lead us all closer to Christ and to greater conversion of heart.

Let us pray for one another that our hearts may be filled with the Holy Spirit, united as one in communion with the Father and the Son. Let us rejoice in the Lord for all that He has done!

# Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Revival Nights

#### A Sacred Journey Across Long Island

Beginning on May 31<sup>st</sup>, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Diocese of Rockville Centre will launch two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages that will journey across Long Island, culminating in a grand celebration at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup>.

These pilgrimages will carry the Holy Eucharist in solemn procession through a wide array of sacred and public spaces including towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. Along the way, participants will have the opportunity to engage in Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, and other deeply spiritual experiences. These events aim to unite the faithful in a powerful public witness to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The People of God are encouraged to walk with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, to pray within the designated pilgrim churches, and to joyfully proclaim the Gospel to those who witness the procession as it moves through their communities.

As a part of this spiritual movement, **Revival Nights** will also be held throughout **Nassau and Suffolk Counties** from **Sunday**, **May 31<sup>st</sup> through Friday**, **June 6<sup>th</sup>**. Each evening will include **Eucharistic Adoration**, **dynamic preaching and catechesis**, **Eucharistic processions**, and **Nocturnal Adoration**, creating an atmosphere of renewal and deepened devotion.

Together, these events form a profound diocesan effort to **rekindle Eucharistic faith and devotion**, inviting all to encounter Christ in a new and transformative way.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...


There are many gifts we receive and give in the course of our lives. More than any physical gift, the most valuable gift is the gift of love. We are loved not because we are perfect but because our presence brings out joy and the best of those who love us. Our first experience of love is from our parents who are wholeheartedly grateful for our presence in their lives. We will always be their sons and daughters no matter how old we are. Then there is the gift of each other in the sacred bond of marriage. As we mature and grow in our ability to love, we become grateful not only for the love others have for us, but we become grateful for the opportunity to love others in return. We are always grateful for gifts and there is no greater gift than the love we give and receive from the depths of our human hearts.

In the Gospel for today's Mass (John 17:20-26), we see Jesus concluding His remarks at the Last Supper with words of pure love for His apostles and us. How can they and we not be overwhelmed, amazed, and humbled by these words Jesus speaks in this passage to the apostles and in turn apply to each one of us: "Father, they are your gift to me."? Those present would soon run away from Jesus when He was arrested, condemned, and crucified. In a matter of hours after hearing Jesus pray this prayer of thanks for the opportunity to love them and the gift they were to Him, Peter would three times deny he knew Jesus or was associated with Him. Yet Jesus prayed that prayer with all sincerity and pure, unconditional love. Love can never be earned or deserved; it is a pure gift. How almost unbelievable that Jesus' love transcends human weakness, ignorance, and lack of acceptance, gratitude, and reciprocation. Living and seeking to love only on a human level impedes our ability to accept and embrace the love of Jesus personally. But He never gives up. After His resurrection, He came back to the apostles and many others to assure them of their presence in His mind and heart as they were. Embracing His heart-felt presence and words, they responded by living and sharing His love and so here we are today.

Those we love are never a duty or obligation to be fulfilled. Jesus' love not only enriches and redeems us, it opens our minds and hearts to the wonder and joy of living fully in the image in which we have been created, the image and likeness of God Himself. How truly grateful we are when we see all those God puts into our lives with us as gifts! Our love becomes fully mature and divinely founded when we are simply joyful and grateful to reach out with our words, deeds, and presence to all God entrusts to our care everyday. Our love cannot cure every disease or solve every problem, but it will be life-giving, enriching, and a source of gratitude, inspiration and life. May we all live the words of Jesus to us in the people we encounter and walk the journey of life with everyday: "Father, they are your gift to me."




#### THE JUBILEE PRAYER
