FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Faith, Father's Day and Facing New Times

WHEN EVENING COMES

Dear Parish Family:

The Gospel for this Sunday begins with the headline for today's column—the translation used in the *Lectio* reads “On that day, as evening drew on” (Mark 4:35) - which can sum up so many times and moments of life. This Gospel passage is the passage used by Pope Francis on March 27, 2020 in the Ubi et Orbi Message in the early days of the pandemic. In the midst of an incredible darkness, Pope Francis states, “We find ourselves afraid and lost. Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other.”

Evening can symbolize many things in the life of faith. It is the precursor of night—of extreme darkness. Evening is a time of thanksgiving in the *Liturgy of the Hours* of the Church. St Basil writes about Evening Prayer or Vespers as a time that “we may give thanks for what has been given us during the day, or for the things we have done well during it.” Evening indicates the coming close of a day. Evening is a time of taking leave. It is a time of transition. It was for the disciples in Gospel today as “they were filled with great awe” (Mark 4:41).

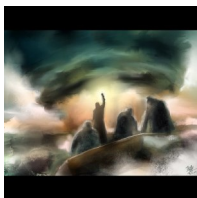
Permit me to share a few “evenings” of this day and these days. Coming to these moments may have, at times, been filled with many “Lord, do you not care” at it is not necessarily easy (Mark 4:38).

Graduation 2021. This Wednesday, we celebrated the Graduation Mass and Commencement Exercises for the Class of 2021 at the Catholic School in Center Moriches. This particular group is the first group that has participated in The Mission, the middle school academy at OLQA, for three years. They have been through a great deal—many transitions within the class, the adjustment to me as their principal—yikes!, impacts of COVID-19, completion of their two year research project, and returning to school in a new way. Yet, now as evening comes, they should be filled with great awe for they go forth to high school and life beyond. They have been given an incredible foundation at OLQA in the midst of storms of all kinds! They are ready to go forward! May the same be said of us.



Father's Day. Today, we celebrate Father's Day in the United States. (Be sure to pray the prayer of blessing on the front cover of the bulletin.) Fr. Jacques Philippe writes, “Every man and woman needs to find a father on whom they can rely and by whom they are recognized, loved, and encouraged. This father is, of course, above all, the Father in Heaven; but each time that a man or woman finds him- or herself faced with someone who, by their manner of being, represents an authentic image of God's paternity, it's a great gift.” Today, let us give thanks to God for the gift of fatherhood. Let us also acknowledge those who find themselves “at evening” in the loss or disruption in their relationship with their fathers. I find more and more young people so brutally destroyed by the wound of this relationship. Let us pray that they will find healing in others who try to pick up the pieces in their lives and always find peace in our heavenly Father—and maybe a little help from St. Joseph, too.

Rough Waves and Times. The journey of this life—particularly the last 15-18 months—has seen us bracing ourselves against some rough waves. We can feel like we're drowning in the midst of pandemic, prejudice, passions, partisanship, pain, and much more. These rough waves are unavoidable. Good luck trying to avoid them. Instead, the actions of the disciples are the actions we're called to take in those moments of darkness and, yes, even in the deaths. We need to call out honestly, “Lord, do you not care?”. We need to create the space for us to hear the Lord say, “Quiet! Be still.” Then, let us allow the Lord to bring us his peace.



A spiritual writer I have been praying and reading with these days draws me to look at the story of Emmaus. The two disciples in the story say, “Lord, it is nearly evening; the day is almost over. Stay with us” (Luke 24:29). Can I make a suggestion? Regardless of the time of the day consider repeating this line, particularly in the times of struggle and pain—**“Lord, it is nearly evening; the day is almost over. Stay with me.”**

If you can, please say a prayer for me.

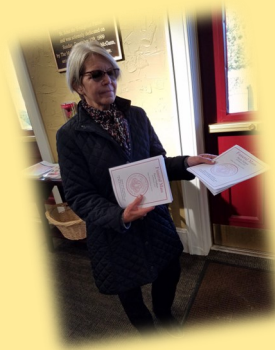

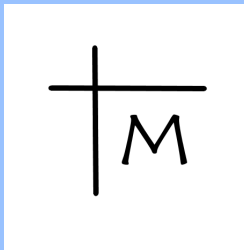
