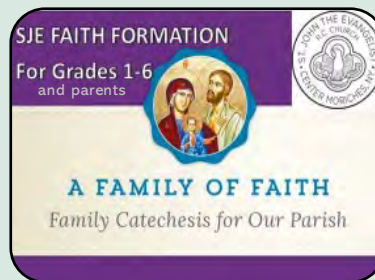

A Message from Monsignor Walden...



How generous are we with our time, talents, and resources? How grateful are we for the gifts we have received? Do I recognize God's goodness to me and through me? These thoughts came to mind this past week when I read and reflected on these words of Pope Benedict in the book "Benedictus, Day by Day with Pope Benedict XVI": "In the New Testament, the cross appears primarily as movement from above to below. It does not stand there as the work of expiation which mankind offers to the wrathful God, but as the expression of that foolish love of God's, which gives itself away to the point of humiliation in order thus to save man; it is his approach to us, not the other way around." We do not earn God's love or attention or placate Him by praying to Him. It is through attentive and focused prayer and reflection that we come to see the wonder of the gift of faith and the wonder of God's love for myself personally and everyone else.

True prayer is doing what we do with those who are closest to us - giving our time and undivided attention to God. That means getting away from the computer, TV, and cell phone, in fact leaving them in another place. There is no other way to rise above our fears, confusion, and busyness that fill our minds and thoughts. The clearer God's blessings and goodness are in our lives, the more joy, hope, peace, and inner security we have. If we only consider what we think we need or want from God, the emptier our hopes and more tedious our prayer life. True, life-giving gratitude is present not just when we are thankful for what we have received, but only when we

are first and foremost grateful to give without counting the cost. God did not send a prophet or savior from among us but came Himself in Jesus, the Son of God. It is easy to buy, wrap, and give a gift. Love is a gift not looking for a return but the ability to enrich the lives of those we carry in our hearts. Love is the joy of giving purely for the sake of others as Jesus gives Himself through, with and in Him. Amen!

I offer this passage from Colossians 1:1-20 for your prayerful reflection:

*Let us give thanks to the Father
for having made you worthy
to share the lot of the saints in light.*

*He rescued us from the power of
darkness and brought us
into the kingdom of his beloved Son.*

*Through him we have redemption,
the forgiveness of our sins.*

*He is the image of the invisible God,
the first-born of all creatures.*

*In him everything in heaven and on earth was
created, things visible and invisible.*

*All were created through him;
all were created for him.*

He is before all else that is.

In him everything continues in being.

*It is he who is head of the body, the church;
he who is the beginning,
the first-born of the dead,
so that primacy may be his in everything.*

*It pleased God to make absolute
fullness reside in him and, by means of him,
to reconcile everything in his person,
both on earth and in the heavens,
making peace through the blood of his cross.*

ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

The Brookhaven Town Highway Department has been working diligently on the curb and sidewalk replacement project along St. John's Place. We are grateful for their continued efforts and commitment to improving the safety and accessibility of our parish and school campus.

The next phase of the project will involve paving St. John's Place Extension and St. John's Place, which is tentatively scheduled to begin after July 17. While this work may temporarily affect traffic patterns, parking, and pedestrian access, we are excited to see these long-awaited and much-needed improvements taking shape.

We appreciate the Highway Department's ongoing communication and willingness to work closely with the parish to accommodate parish and school activities throughout the project.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as these important improvements are completed. We look forward to the lasting benefits they will bring to our entire community.
