A Message from Monsignor Walden...

One of the joys I am experiencing this weekend is baptizing the child of one of my nieces. Her first child was taken out of the womb at 24 weeks almost five years ago because the womb was not sustaining her. She weighed only 14 ounces and was only 10 inches long. Her first 250 days were spent in a NICU in Illinois where she as born. Her parents visited her everyday, read to her and held her as much as they could. She has just completed her pre-k schooling and is a bright, active, alert, joyful child.

The wonders of medical technology are great as this child's life is now a blessing for all of us who know her. How sad to read the headline in the paper a week ago Friday that said: "Abortion Pill Access Preserved". The Supreme Court ruled that access to it was legal. Abortion is very much in the media and a constant issue in our government and communities. How sad that we have regressed to pagan cultures we considered primitive as they sacrificed their children to false gods. Today children are aborted because of fear, inconvenience, deformities, no support, and many other reasons. A week ago Friday I went stood on Waverly Avenue in Patchogue near the Planned facility preforms Parenthood that abortions in our area. There were six of us with signs, hope, and prayers. It was so good to hear the horns of support as people passed by in their cars. Our presence there, as I have experienced in other places where I have prayed in front of abortion facilities, is hopeful and prayerful. In the second reading from last Sunday (2 Corinthians 5:6-10) St. Paul had these powerful words: "We are always courageous!" But it takes far more than courage to publicly witness to a controversial issue. The six of us on that Friday were very peaceful and prayerful. For the first time I prayed what is called "A Rachel Rosary". It has all five decades of the Sorrowful Mysteries of the rosary and adds the First



Glorious Mystery (the Resurrection) as the sixth decade. Before each Hail Mary we pray for a particular group of people. During the first Sorrowful Mystery, we have these ten intentions, one mentioned before each Hail Mary: for the thirteen year old girl who is pregnant and afraid; for the teenager who is pregnant and afraid to tell her parents; For whose boyfriend young woman abandons her when the pregnancy is discovered; for the young woman who, alone and afraid, gets "counseled" at the abortion clinic; for the woman who got pregnant to save a relationship, only to find her lover has run away at the news; for the mother of a poor family who unexpectedly becomes pregnant and is advised that abortion is the "logical" choice for her family; for the couple who is pregnant with a child suspected of having a birth defect; for the man who fathers a child he wasn't expecting and believes abortion will free him; for the doctor who advises a couple to about their child and thinks he is helping; for the school counselor who believes that advising a student to abort her baby is saving her future.

As you can see none of these intentions are damning or hurtful, only full of hope that the truth will prevail and the path of peace that comes from the truth of who we are as God's beloved children will sustain, courage and life for all involved. I close with these words from a spiritual book I am using in my daily prayers: "There is, in each of us, a deepest central point where evil cannot reach and where only the beauty of God's creative love exists in all its uniqueness."

Our Parish Outreach programs provide essential food programs that nourish families, especially those needed during the summer months.

Summer is a wonderful time for youngsters who long for fun-in-the sun activities and a break from the school year. Unfortunately for many families, summer can mean months of worry and hunger, as kids lose access to healthy meals given at school. Food insecurity is real on Long Island. According to LI Cares, more than 200,000 families, almost 70,000 children, do not have access to sufficient food, or food of an adequate quality, to meet one's basic needs. As parents juggle the ongoing rising costs at the supermarket, gas pumps, housing, utilities and medical co-pays, they turn to the Parish Outreach to find relief.

LEVEL 7 SPONSOR/CANDIDATE NIGHT!



SJE Safe Environment Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional billing purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.





GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

St. Boniface, an English Benedictine monk who died in the 8th century, wrote in a letter: "In her voyage across the ocean of this world, the Church is like a great ship being pounded by the waves of life's different stresses. Our duty is not to abandon ship but to keep her on her course." Oceans and seas, lakes and rivers, baptism. The role of water in daily life and its use as a metaphor are woven throughout our Scriptures. In today's readings, we hear two references to the sea. First, we have God talking to Job out of a storm, reminding the prophet that he – the Lord – is the one who created the seas and keeps them firmly in their place. The Gospel passage provides us with a stark reminder of that truth. As the disciples and Jesus cross the sea, a storm crops up and threatens to sink their boat. But one command from Jesus and the water is still. St. Boniface had it right. We really all are on that ship with Jesus on its voyage across the ocean of this world, and trusting in him to keep us on course and safe from harm ensures we reach the destinations he intends for us.

GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How to do our part to keep this great ship that is the Church on course? Trust in Christ, trust that he is present within us and guiding us each day. No one is immune from stormy seas, and like the disciples, we can turn to Jesus in times of peril. He asked the disciples: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Like the disciples, we must experience the change of heart that is necessary to place complete trust in Jesus to replace our fear and anxiety. God has things under control. Of course, that is what can be so scary sometimes. I know God will take care of everything, but what if I don't like how he does it? What if I want him to answer my prayers one way and he answers them a different way? This is where Jesus might ask me: "Do you not yet have faith?" And I would have to reply, "I'm working on it."

PRAY We are assured throughout Scripture that God loves us, cares for us, and sustains us. But how do we move from knowing that in our heads to feeling it in our hearts? Prayer. If we center our life on Jesus and his commands, trusting in him will become second nature. Take some time this week and pray with today's Psalm (107:23-24, 25-26, 28-29, 30-31), which praises God for his love for us and gives voice to trusting in his providence.
