## JOURNEYING TOGETHER: Sister Ann

Where does one begin to express all that is in one's heart after thirteen wonderful years in a parish? For days I have been trying to put my thoughts together without much success. I decided to give a brief history of my years here. So, let me take a trip down memory lane



I had been living and working with a sister friend in Palm Coast, Florida. It was my 7<sup>th</sup> year and her 8<sup>th</sup> year. I was the Bereavement Facilitator and she was a Parish Nurse. As it was a retirement area for ITT former workers, we were both kept quite busy.

Then one day, we were sent for by The Parish Manager, and the Pastor, not into an office but into a large meeting room—away from any possible eavesdroppers. After an hour of listening to many accolades concerning our work, we were told that we were not fired but that our contract would not be renewed! They could not afford to keep us.



That summer when we had our annual Congregation Assembly, I boldly announced that just because we are Sisters, there nd generally enjoyed working together was no guarantee that we would always have a job. I shared with the assembled group the circumstances of why we were out of a job.



Sister Helen Ann Charlebois came up to me when I was finished to say that there was a possibility that a job might be available in Center Moriches because a Sister was going to be retiring. Sr. Helen Ann contacted Fr. Joe Coschignano and told him of my situation and of my availability. Fr. Joe invited me up for an interview and hired me on the spot. He then had me return before Sister Ann Kathleen left so that she could instruct me as to how she had worked. Fr. Joe stayed one year and then left. After Fr. Joe, Fr. Walter Kedjierski came for six years and then went to the Seminary and then was asked to go to Washington, D.C. to work in his field of ecumenism in the Church.

During this time, I would often visit the volunteers in the Thrift Shop. We prayed, laughed, planned celebrations together, and just enjoyed being together.



The following year, Fr. John came to SJE and life hasn't been the same since! After a year Father then asked if I would mentor a young man, Alex Finta, who needed to do his practicum toward a Masters in Social Work. Alex and I worked well together but he taught me more than I taught him! Father John asked if I would consider working with our Senior parishioners. I was very happy to do that. I tried to encourage our seniors to join a book discussion group but there was another one in the parish. I tried to get a group to go to Connecticut for a day of fun at one of the casinos. Only three of

us signed up but we did have fun. Then one of ladies said that those who like to do things usually attend those activities in the Community rooms where they live. We had one parishioner offer to help us with a modified Tai Chi program which worked quite well until the pandemic. Another program affected by the pandemic was a Book Discussion group. I found most of my ministry has been the personal outreach on the phone, or visiting someone's home, or just taking the time to listen.

However, the one program that was quite successful is the Bereavement Group, I am pleased to say that two of the women, both of whom have attended more than once, are quite capable to continue with this most necessary support group.

I will miss those whom have prayed with when I brought Jesus to them in their homes. I miss those who I've met in the grocery store, in the Church, or just walking on the street. You are all very special to me. All of you will be in my thoughts and prayers. God bless you all. Please occasionally pray for me.

# ...to Be Continued

Dear Parish Family:

Last summer, a few members of the Pastoral Team were joking with me about the seasons of Fr. John. I didn't quite understand what they meant. They explained that when talking about my years here they divided it into seasons—sort of like a Netflix or TV series. (They refused to tell me what they titled it! I'm SURE it was complimentary.) In my recollection of their descriptions, season 1 was the fire and the welcoming of a newly ordained priest, season 2 was the rebuilding and restoration of the church building, season 3 was the time as OLQA principal, season 4 was COVID and all that entailed, season 5 was about managing the difficult times after the pandemic and returning in-person to so many things, and for season 6 they weren't sure what was coming. I'm not sure the show would get a lot of people watching but I was thinking of this image in preparation for the formal transition in the days ahead.



We each go through seasons of life. We know the moments of fall and winter and spring and summer in our lives and undoubtedly many episodes that make up each season. You know them as well as I do. I think of the different “seasons” of my own life and, in a particular way, the seasons lived here with each of you. There are those moments we have celebrated and journeyed through together. There are the episodes that our own that somehow we play a part in each other's lives.

I came to SJE in 2016 (Season 1 :) and faced the loss of my dad within months of arriving. His last time “out in public” was at the Installation Mass and Party in November 2016 here in the parish. He loved it, by the way. Yet, in that moment, so many of you played a role through presence, prayer, wisdom, and encouragement. I knew I had found a home...and story continued and continues.

The work of being a pastor is a complicated one, but a blessed one. I have heard other priests and even a few bishops say, “being a pastor was the best part of my priesthood. I would go back to it in a second.” I see why. It is not that you are in charge or run things or are “the boss”. Ultimately, Jesus is the boss and so many other people shoulder the responsibilities of the life of this parish. It is the privilege to try to be at the service of the other in a special and beautiful way. It is a time of gratitude and grace.

I use the phrase, “always gratitude” quite often. It is a phrase that I repeat all the time, even when it might be a bad episode or two. I, without question, have so many reasons to be grateful to be part of this community of St. John the Evangelist. Too many reasons, people, moments, and times to even list here. Always, always, always gratitude to God for all the many ways he has allowed us to journey together these six years.

I have been praying the Novena of Grace which will bring me up to this Wednesday, the day of the beginning of my new assignment at St. Brigid's. The reflections and considerations in the novena are helping me to see the signs of God's grace in all the times and seasons here. We know it has not always been easy. Isn't it true though that in those times and moments, we can “find God in all things” as the *Spiritual Exercises* would remind us. Even on my toughest days—pastorally and personally—somehow it was clear that God was in the midst of all of this.

When I announced to each of you in April that I would begin a new assignment in June, I said I was confident we would journey together beyond any assignment or term. When hearts are touched, nothing can break or remove that. When the Spirit is involved, as I believe it has been these years, there is no cut off or separation on the deeper levels. The journey that started here six years ago continues now in new ways with new characters, some new plots, and wonderful adventures along the way for

each one of us. We have been privilege to share in a beautiful story these past six years one made stronger each time it linked to the Great Story—the story of Jesus—a story that knows no end and just gets better and better.

I don't want too much TV or Netflix at this point. I do remember that at end of some of these famous shows there would be a cliff hanger or it might even a season finale. Other times there would be a second part to the episode that would air next week but you didn't know ahead of time. Suddenly, "To be Continued" would come across the screen and you wait another week or for the new season to begin.

Rather than a finale or an end, as we journey together I think it's to be continued in the days, weeks, months, years and lifetime to come. For me, that brings peace and great consolation. I hope the same for you.

If you can, please say a prayer for me!

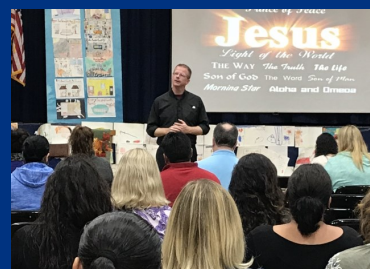

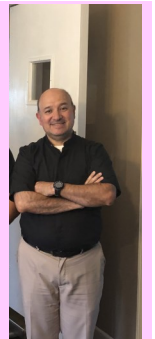


### Michael Hoonhout

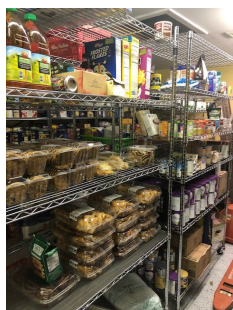
### Street Ministry— serving the homeless in our area each week

## More transitions... **FATHER JAIME**

I want to let you know about a change to Fr. Jaime's assignment. On June 29, 2022, Fr. Jaime will become the Parochial Vicar of St. Jude's in Mastic Beach while continuing to serve only the Spanish community here at St. John the Evangelist. He will no longer live at St. John's as his primary assignment will be to minister at St. Jude's. In a sense, it is a "flip" of his present assignment. Fr. Jaime has been serving here as the full-time Parochial Vicar of St. John the Evangelist while ministering to the Spanish community at St. Jude's in addition to this assignment. For the day to day life of St. John's, this will not be a significant change as Fr. Jaime will be here most Saturday evenings and Tuesday evenings for the Spanish masses. He will arrange with Father Patrick other details related to office hours, other assistance, etc.



In April, Fr. Jaime had asked to be on retreat and vacation from this past Monday through July 1<sup>st</sup>. He had these arrangements made prior to any changes in his assignment were officially known. While he may return early from vacation to handle the practical details of moving, he will not be on the schedule again until the Spanish Mass on July 1<sup>st</sup>.
