Back to Church Updates

I want to provide some updates about our procedures and practices as we continue on a path to reopening and birthing something new! I prefer this than returning to normal.

Please note the following:



Dispensation from Mass Lifted. On August 14/15, 2021, all Catholic are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. A dispensation has been provided by Bishop Barres since March 2020. Of course, if you are sick or not well you should not attend Mass in the Church.

Masks. Masks are encouraged but optional. If you are more comfortable wearing a mask, please do so. If you see someone wearing a mask, consider giving them a little more space as they might be more comfortable with some added room. Those who are not vaccinated, who are health impaired in any way or concerned in any way, should continue to wear a mask. As Fr. Felix preached a few weeks ago regarding a mask, “Mind your business” as to why someone may wear a mask.

Please let us be patient with one another. We are each in a different place. So let us be gentle and kind!

Beginning this weekend, Priest-Presiders and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are no longer required to wear masks. As above, priest-presiders and minister may wear masks if they desire.

Entrance. The only entrance into the Church will be the two main doors that lead into the Fellowship Area. This assists with communication, welcome, and security.

Convent Porch Mass. The last outdoor Mass will be on Sunday, August 8, 2021. Until then, we will continue to make a decision regarding the Mass each Thursday or Friday based on weather forecasts.

Live Streaming. In July, we will move away from live streaming Daily Mass and only live stream one English and Spanish Mass each weekend. Funerals and weddings will be live streamed by request only beginning July 1st. Those who wish to pray the Daily Mass should watch on the Catholic Faith Network.



Weekend of August 14/15, 2021. Please save the dates and plan to be at SJE! We are working on some things to make it a special day for the life of our parish family. On both Saturday afternoon and evening, we want to celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption and return to Mass echoing Mary, “My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...”



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Begging, Grabbing and Healing

DESPERATE

Dear Parish Family:

I am preparing this letter during a break between counseling appointments at the group home where I volunteer. A new client asked me, "How did you get involved here?"

It started with a student who was actively using drugs and alcohol in the high school where I worked nearly 16 years ago. We needed to find a place that would remove him from his family dynamics while also allowing us to keep him in the school. I remember bringing him here for an "overnight" - so he could check it out and they could check him out. As I was picking him up the next morning, one of the staff members who is so dedicated here said to him, "Well, what do you think?" Like anyone of us looking to please he replied, "I like it a lot." She looked at him with a smirk, "Of course! Everyone loves coming here."

The truth is that as helpful as organizations and ministries can be, no one really wants to be here. They are here, usually after a long battle, because they are so desperate to find healing that they will do anything—even commit to a 12-18 month long in person treatment program.

Whenever I read or pray with this Sunday's Gospel, I imagine how desperate Jairus (5:22) and the woman with hemorrhages (5:28-29) must have been to approach Jesus. We're told that the woman had been seeking treatment for 12 years. From what we are told of the illness of Jairus' daughter he, too, likely sought many other ways to find healing for his daughter. Simply, they were desperate. They were desperate enough to turn to Jesus for healing.

Are we not desperate enough? Even we who are reading this bulletin after Sunday Mass, are we desperate enough to recognize that the only place we are going to find fulfillment and healing is in Jesus Christ? This is not to say there isn't a place for medicine, support, good communities, science and the like. Isn't it true, though, that we can often approach those good things as if they were gods?

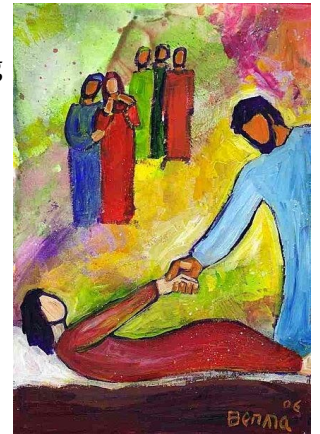
How did you approach Mass this weekend? Were you desperate to receive the Eucharist or could it have come and gone? How are you approaching that struggle and pain in your heart? Are you desperate enough to turn to God first instead of trying to solve the problems solely with the tools of this world?

When I think of the battles I can face, I admit that I am not always desperate enough for Jesus. I say I can handle this. I'll fix this. This won't happen again. I learned my lesson and so on. Some of these things may be true. At least, I hope they are when I say them. More often than not, I find myself starting over again and again until finally I can say, "Alright, Lord, I need you." We can hear the voice of the woman and of Jairus saying the same thing. I need to be healed, Lord. Lord, please I need you to heal my daughter.

It's interesting. Even though they looked everywhere else first, Jesus does not delay or condemn or give them a "you're coming to me now?" sort of thing. He simply allows the healing to flow from him. He moves to where the healing needs to happen and brings others along with him. This is a good lesson for us who can be hesitant not only about coming to the Lord for help but also we who can sometimes be less than charitable to the desperate among us.

As I come to the end of writing this letter, I just celebrated Mass at the group home. After Mass, one of the young men who lives here was sitting alone in the Chapel. It is not his first time at recovery and sobriety and not his first time in this program. I do not know him well. I just sat next to him, welcomed him back, and offered to help in any way I can. He talked about the journey back here. He had other plans after hospitalization including an outpatient program he knew he could manipulate. He decided to come back here. With his Bible in his hand, "Father Sureau, I'm 33. I am never going to get sober without doing this work. I will be dead. This is my chance." Sounds desperate enough for me. Like the woman and the synagogue official in today's Gospel, maybe he will finally know healing.

Please say a prayer for him (and for me, too).

Discussion Questions

1. "For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him." ([Wisdom 1:14](#)). What in humankind's nature is made in God's own image? Is it true of all of humankind or just Christians?

2. To which do you think many people in the world respond better, a wealthy God or a poor God? Explain your answer. With which do you feel more comfortable? Why?

3. What does Pope Francis say the woman with the hemorrhage and the girl's father had in common? Were they part of Jesus' group of followers? Did it matter to him?

It is a matter of two interlocking narratives, with a single core: faith; and they show Jesus as the wellspring of life, as the one who restores life to those who trust fully in him. The two protagonists, that is, the little girl's father and the sick woman, are not disciples of Jesus yet they are satisfied through their faith. They have faith in that man. From this we understand that all are permitted on the Lord's path: no one should feel as an intruder, an interloper or one who has no right. To have access to his heart, to Jesus' heart, there is only one requirement: to feel in need of healing and to entrust yourself to him.
