# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Letting Go

## COFFEE POTS

Dear Parish Family:

Stay with me after reading this headline.

I walked around the Rectory Kitchen this morning. We have a drip coffee pot with grind, large K-Cup machine, and an espresso machine. Over the past five years, at one time or another, I have had a small K-Cup machine in my office, a perk pot, and a French Press. I do not use all of them, obviously. At one time or another, though, each one became a priority. In these years, timers have been set, different coffees gifted or purchased, various locations decided upon and so on.

I find it can be a bad day when the timer is not set correctly and I find I have to wait (10 minutes for the drip coffee, only two for the K cup!).

Pretty sad, right? The timer on the coffee pot can be the sign of a good day or a bad one.

I am not really talking about coffee pots. I'm more concerned about my attachments.

Brother Mark Mackey, SJ says,

*"Certain things imprison us and keep us from the happiness we seek. We've all been there, and some of us may be there now: toxic relationships, bad habits, addictions, physical and emotional wounds that just don't seem to heal. There are also some more subtle barriers: a perfectionism that becomes obsessive, a fear of getting hurt that inhibits deep relationships, a laziness that stagnates our plans and our dreams, and a selfishness that leaves no room for love."*

When I first read his reflection and viewed a related video, I felt like I could not go to the places he was mentioning. Too much, too deep. Lately, I find myself needing to start with some of the small things, often material things. Then, enough space is cleared out for the more significant work required if I don't let something else get in the way.

Isn't this part of what Jesus is getting at in the Gospel? It's a point he hits on constantly in the Gospels. We miss it in our distraction with one issue or another, one verse or another. It is about making sure the love of God and what that love requires the first priority in my life. So in this Sunday's Gospel Jesus lists some pretty tough and direct challenges to getting things in right order. Neither family or position or status relationship or agenda or issue or devotion or ideology or perspective or habit or comfort or emotion or even our very lives (and we can go on and on) can get in the way of this relationship with God. Period.

I so often have it backwards. I think some of these things will get me to love God more. Let me speak about this issue or preach on this scripture or start this ministry or achieve this goal. Yes, that's it! Start there! Get to work. Do something! I catch myself doing this more often. I am grateful for the awareness. I am ashamed of the disorder.

We need to pray constantly for the grace to be free of so many of these attachments we grab hold off—some not inherently bad or evil. Regardless, they all must go.

This week, what gets the most of our time and energy? Is it TV or Netflix? Is it a relationship—healthy or unhealthy? Is it a movement or mission? Is it an object—material or immaterial? Is it a desire that is just out of order?

Let's pray to be free of those things so that "we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Romans 6:3-4).

Please pray for me.
