# A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

## The Feast of Corpus Christi

Today's feast, the Feast of Corpus Christi (the precious Body and Blood of Christ), is a special feast indeed because it reminds us of how generous and how near Jesus is to us. If Jesus is not present in the Eucharist, then there is no life in the Church; Jesus is not risen, and He is not alive in our world today. However, because He is alive and risen, He is truly present to us through the celebration of the Eucharist, the

source and summit of our lives. The Eucharist is everything. It is the cornerstone of our faith. It is God's greatest gift to humanity. It is the reason why we go to church, to receive Jesus in the most Blessed Sacrament! It is the heartbeat of the Church since its institution. To think that the Eucharist is being celebrated around the world at any given time is truly miraculous and encouraging. It reminds us how ever-present Jesus is to all. It signifies the reality behind this sacrament that Jesus is alive and risen in all corners of the world. Talk about the richness and

power behind our faith!

and our world. Life with Christ!

Since the Last Supper, the New Passover in the Upper Room on that first Holy Thursday, we as a Church have been celebrating this sacrament for nearly 2000 years. Each time the priest becomes another Christ during the words of consecration, he breathes life into the hosts and chalice with the grace that comes from the Holy Spirit! Even though the appearance of bread and wine remain the same, in substance it becomes the true Body and Blood of Christ through the words of consecration. This celebration brings life into our hearts

As the Second Vatican Council taught, "Really partaking of the body of the Lord in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread, we are taken up into communion with Him and with one another." (Lumen Gentium 7) "Communion—with Christ! And that communion received in faith and founded on grace changes us. It fills us with divine love and divine grace. It transforms us so that we can become more like Jesus" (Word Among Us, June 2, 2024). Venerable Fulton Sheen says when speaking of the Eucharist: "the greatest love story of all time is found in a tiny white host."

In truth, it is not Disneyland - a land of make-believe - when we attend mass. Instead, what takes place each time we come to sacred liturgy is a great encounter

with God! We encounter the Lord of History and Redemption. We encounter the Risen Lord! In reality, we encounter Jesus in mind, body, soul, and divinity. We recognize the Lord in the breaking of the bread. Since the institution of the Eucharist in the Upper Room on that first Holy Thursday, the world can rejoice in the Lord. We can share in the fullness of God's life found in Jesus. It is the Eucharist that unites us as one and keeps us close and connected to the

in the Eucharist that saves us and reassures us of God's great love for us. It is what gives us meaning and purpose in life. Without the

Lord. It is our lifeline. It is our faith and participation

Eucharist, the Church is dead and there is no eternal life. Our faith in Christ is in vain. Yet because God was faithful to His promise, we now have life eternal with Christ. We have true food for the journey.

All that Jesus wanted for us is that we share in His life, death and resurrection; that we remain one with God as He and the Father are one (JN 17); that we remain in His

love and stay connected to one another through this precious gift that brings us eternal life. It is the Eucharist that brings us joy in the Lord and strengthens our hope. Pope Benedict XVI once said that bread that is broken signifies our Lord's great desire to be one with us. Through the bread that is broken, we can now share and participate in God's life when we receive the Lord in faith. We are healed and strengthened by our hope. We are made new and whole again. During this great solemnity, let us be renewed and strengthened in our faith, knowing that Jesus is the fulfillment of all our hopes and longings, and that through the Eucharist, we can experience new life with Christ!

As many of you already know, Fr. Felix's tenure here will end on June 26<sup>th</sup>. In the short time that I have known Fr. Felix, I have witnessed His love for the Eucharist and the Church. He is a very spiritual and dedicated priest who is connected to Jesus and is always praying for us. He has served here at St. John the Evangelist for 14 years. Please join us next Sunday, June 9<sup>th</sup> at the Noon Mass to thank him for his faithful service and love for our parish community, and to wish him well on his new assignment. Let us fill the church with our love and gratitude for Him. A reception will follow immediately after mass in our parish auditorium. Hope to see you there! God's blessings!



The world-famous INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA will be on tour throughout our Diocese during the month of June 2024. On June 19th, The World Apostolate of Fatima-USA will bring the statue to our parish. This historic statue began its travels from Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1947, and has been around the world many times. Sculpted by Jose' Thedim, based on the description of Sister Lucia, one of the three seers, it was blessed by the Bishop of Fatima and commissioned to serve the Pilgrim Virgin, who would carry the blessings of Fatima throughout the world. The Bishop prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. The statue has visited more than 100 countries bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled. This is a special opportunity to pray with Our Lady, learn Our Lady's messages and requests at Fatima, and present any special intentions you may have for yourself or others.



## A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Public opinion is very much fostered and sought after by many different groups who seek to make changes or what they see as improvements in their lives, in our communities, and in our country. The media floods us with countless opinions and criticisms of issues. History has shown us how much good and how much evil public opinion can foster and inspire. During the last century we saw how public opinion in Germany under the leadership of Hitler led to the death of millions of Jews and other "undesirable" people in the late 1930s into the 1940s. The Nazi's controlled the media and sent the message only they wanted broadcast.

The most insidious example of how public opinion can attack pure goodness is seen in these verses from Matthew's Gospel 24:20-26: "The chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas but to destroy Jesus. The governor said to them in reply, "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" They answered, "Barabbas!" Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus called Messiah?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" But he said, "Why? What evil has he done?" They only shouted the louder, "Let him be crucified!" When Pilate saw that he was not succeeding at all, but that a riot was breaking out instead, he took water and washed his hands in the sight of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood. Look to it yourselves." And the whole people said in reply, "His blood be upon us and upon our children." Then he released Barabbas to them, but after he had Jesus scourged,\* he handed him over to be crucified."

Today's feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ shows us the power of God's love, mercy, and desire to endure whatever is done to Him all the while knowing that only in union with Him will we ever find true peace, hope, meaning, and purpose in our lives. He knows us better than we know ourselves. After all He is our creator and even more became one with us so we could clearly become one with

Him. All we have to do is take the time to be with Him in prayer. The challenges we face we carry in our pockets and have in our homes with



our TVs, phones and computers. Our phones have programs that tell us how much screen time we spend on them. How much "screen time" do were give God each day. Just 2% of 24 hours is only 28 minutes. The key is to put the phone down or turn it off and find a quiet place to pray slowly and speak to God from our hearts. We literally take the Body of Christ into our very bodies and being every time we receive Jesus in Holy Communion. We can come to church to pray in His presence. We are blessed with the chapel in the convent in our parish where Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar Monday through Friday from 3:00 PM to 7:00 PM. Time spent with those who love us is so life giving. Give just 2% (28 minutes) or more of your day to quiet prayer, reading the Bible or a spiritual book and you will find peace, hope, purpose, and joy far beyond the noise of public opinion and constant texts and sites on our electronic devices. You will come to know the One who is truly our Way, Truth, and Life.

I share the Renew 2000 prayer with you that I use everyday in my prayers:

Gracious God, we are your people embraced by your love. We thank you for your presence with us throughout all time. Create us anew, liberate us from that which keeps us from you. Enable us to recreate our world and restore justice. Heal us from every form of sin and violence. Transform us to live your Word more profoundly. Reconcile us so enemies become friends. Awaken us to the sacred; nurture our relationships; enliven our parishes; reunite our families. Fill us with joy to celebrate the fullness of life. Empower us to be a community of love growing in your likeness. Amen.

## WWII. Korean War Hero...



## ★ Finally Laid to Rest

On May 31, 2024, Army Sargent George Moje Jr will be laid to rest at Calverton National Cemetery after 58 years of waiting. Sqt Moje served in both WWII and the Korean War with the 3rd Infantry Division and was awarded the Bronze Star, combat infantry badge, WWII Victory Medal.


Born May 12, 1929, Sqt. Moje enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1946, at the age of 17, completed basic training and advance individual training, and was sent to Japan, which was still occupied by Allied Forces. Sqt. Moje was honorably discharged in 1952. He returned from war and struggled for years with medical complications because of combat injuries, until he succumbed to illness on April 15, 1965. Distraught over his untimely death, his family could never accept finality and as a result, Sqt. Moje's cremated remains were never received after the funeral service. To honor him, his brother William carried the poem "Just for Today" with him in his wallet until his own death in 2019.

After William's death his daughter Diane came across paperwork from the funeral home that handled Sqt. Moje's services in 1965. Knowing that his remains were never received, she contacted the Queens funeral home hoping she could learn of her uncle's final disposition. To her surprise, the funeral home had kept her uncles cremated remains for 58 years and was able to return them to the family.

On May 31st, Sqt. Moje will finally receive the honor he so rightly deserves.

A Catholic Mass was held at 10:45 a.m. at St. John The Evangelist R.C. Church, 25 Ocean Avenue, Center Moriches with interment following at 12:30 pm at Calverton National Cemetery. The family requested assistance in honoring Sqt. Moje and asked all veteran organizations and motorcycle clubs (in recognition honor of his love of motorcycles) to join in the funeral procession from the church to Calverton National Cemetery.


