We join this tradition of the Church to deepen our appreciation for the gift of the Eucharist and allow ourselves to fall deeper and deeper in love with the risen and glorified Lord, particularly as we prepare to

celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi. Please come and pray for at least one hour this week.

In time, we commit ourselves to pray for:

- The healing of our Church, country, and world
- Our parish during this time of transition

This time of communal prayer will be silent except for:

- After the 12 Noon Mass: The Rosary
- -3:00 p.m.: Divine Mercy Chaplet
- -6:00 p.m. Evening Prayer
- -7:45 p.m. Night Prayer and Benediction

FROM Fr. John's DESK

90 Days + 40 Hours

Dear Parish Family:

Today we celebrate the conclusion of the great 90 days! The 40 days of Lent and the 50 days of Easter have drawn us, I pray, into the depths of the Paschal Mystery—the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ. It has been quite a journey, no? In working on the bulletin this weekend (Yes, we still need a bulletin editor!), I had to go back to the Ash Wednesday bulletin to confirm some information. From that day to this one as individuals, parish, Church, and world we have not only remembered and recalled these moments in Jesus' life but hopefully allowed the Holy Spirit to change us in body, mind, and spirit.

Think of the journey of our parish in these days and weeks. From Ash Wednesday prayer services and reusable gifts for the poor to the 40 Ways for 40 Days to an incredible Sacred Paschal Triduum to the celebration of Easter that saw us welcome people to the table of the Lord for the first time, received others into the Church from other Christian faiths and accepted inquirers into the Order of the Catechumenate in preparation for full initiation next week to these days of the Novena to the Holy Spirit....all this while carrying on the every day work of prayer and service in the life of the community of faith.

We know, too, that our prayer and worship can never be far from the lives we lead and the world in which we dwell. We have seen war in Ukraine, the economic challenges of these days, the disregard for human life, the tragedy of violence not to mention this time of transition in our parish. As individuals, each one of us have faced ups and downs in our own lives and the lives of those we love.

We need the Holy Spirit to continue to dwell and we need express what we desire. In our prayer—as individuals and community— we pray as we have throughout these past 90 days like the Apostles and disciples did with Mary in the Upper Room for a greater awareness and appreciation of the Holy Spirit.

In the Spirit of the Church's prayer in these weeks, aware of our need for the Holy Spirit in our lives and the life of the world, and mindful of the realities of our communal life here, I ask that you join me in moving from 90 days to 40 hours. During the week of June 13-17, our parish will pray a 40 Hours Devotion from 12 Noon to 8 p.m. each day in preparation for Corpus Christi Sunday. (Our regular daily Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the Church this week.)

I hope and pray this can be a communal act of our prayer for our parish. We will pray together before the Blessed Sacrament at certain times vocally (Evening Prayer, Chaplet of Divine Mercy, etc.) and in silence. In that quiet before the Real Presence, I hope we will not only take time to adore Jesus but also allow him to do the same to us. Jesus desires your friendship and love and mine and is calling us to more.

The tradition of the 40 hours devotion has a 500 year history in the Church. Like all times of Exposition, it is a public prayer of the Church that extends from our celebration of the Eucharist. It is not a time of our own private devotion but another act of the Body of Christ that derives from the Mass, the summit and source of our prayer. In its beginnings in the 1500s, this devotion was prayed for the reparation of sins and for peace in times of war. During this week, our prayers are similar as we pray for a healing of the brokenness of our world, our country, and our Church—individually and communally—and we pray for our parish during this time of change and transition.

What do you need to do? Try to come and pray in the quiet for at least one hour during the week—maybe more than one hour? - and sit before the Lord. Sign up using the form on page 2 or email or call. Ininvite others you know to pray with us as well. This is not limited to SJE parishioners.

We will give some more details in the bulletin next week about what you can do at the Exposition if you don't regularly attend. For now, sign up for an hour or two or three or forty!

If you can, please say a prayer for me.


Solemn Evening Prayer

Vespers-Evening Prayer*

SATURDAYS & SUNDAYS AFTER THE EVENING MASSES

"Vespers is celebrated in the evening when the day is drawing to a close, so that 'we may give thanks for what has been given us during the day, or for the things we have done well during it".

-Introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours

We pray Evening Prayer after the 5 p.m. Saturday evening Mass and after the 6 p.m. Sunday Mass. We will gather in the seats by Our Lady's Chapel. You don't need to bring anything but you! The leader or presider of the prayer will guide through this prayer. Generally, Evening Prayer is about ten minutes in length.

CHURCH CLEANERS

Our dedicated volunteer cleaning staff members meet every Thursday at 12:30 (after Noon Mass).

At present, there are six of us who do light cleaning, i.e., window washing, vacuuming, dusting and mopping.

When we have a full crew, the job is completed in about an hour depending on weekly weather conditions that produce sand and salt, etc.

We, as a group, are proud of our lovely church and the continuous religious activities that emanate from it. If you wish to join us, just show up. We welcome you!

Remembering Loved Ones

SJE offers a number of ways to remember loved ones, or honor someone living.

Mass Intentions. Remembering one who has passed away at Mass is a most noble practice calling us to pray for one who has died at the most powerful prayer we know—the celebration of the Eucharist.

Altar Bread and Wine. Names will be listed in each bulletin during the course of that month.

Votive Candles/Altar Candles. A number of votive candles enlighten the beautiful statues in our church. You may have a particular devotion to one of these saints. These candles are next to the statues of the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, St. Teresa, St. Gerard Majella and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. They bring a certain light to the statues and, hopefully, inspire some deeper times of prayer and reflection.
