FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Year of St. Ignatius EUCHARISTIC EXERCISE

Dear Parish Family:



In the Third Week of *The Spiritual Exercises*, St. Ignatius of Loyola writes, "What does He give us in uniting Himself to us? He gives us all He has and all He is – His body, His soul, His divinity, and with this every grace. He is generous even to exhaustion; and what is most admirable is, that He gives Himself, thus entirely, not only once, but every day if we wish it. Every fresh communion is a new gift that Jesus Christ makes of Himself to us" (195,4).

We celebrate this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Ignatian Year. The Church calls us to recognize special virtues, saints, and devotions in a year. We began the Year of St. Joseph on December 8th for example. The Ignatian Year marks the 500th anniversary of the conversion of St. Ignatius from a pretty wretched life to one that sought to transform the world with God's love.

I have great affection for the Society of Jesus, particularly since I prayed 28 day silent retreat of the *Spiritual Exercises* in preparation for ordination to sacred priesthood nearly ten years ago. I turn back to those moments and to the writings of *The Spiritual Exercises* again and again. Often, it is in times of failure and despair when I find myself not living up to the ideals of what is "to praise, to reverence and to serve the Lord (our) God and by this means to arrive at enteral salvation" (First Principle and Foundation, 23).

I hope in the year ahead we will be able to reflect on the life and work of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Pope Francis, a Jesuit himself, and Bishop Barres have offered some good reflections. You can visit drvc.org for a copy of his letter or <u>click here</u>. Bishop Barres has invited some clergy – including our own Seminarian Louis Cona – to offer reflections about the life of St. Ignatius. We'll try to include some excerpts here. I also hope as a parish we will be able to do some work on the life of St. Ignatius. Pay attention for more details in the weeks ahead.



In the beginning of my going through *The Spiritual Exercises*, the retreat director I worked with asked me to look back in my own life—to childhood—and see after reflecting on all that God has done what I would



say to that 6 year old as a then 35 year old. Well good news—I have a picture!

The picture is from my First Holy Communion and I have shared it with some of the First Holy Communion candidates this year. Needless to say they got a few laughs and they probably realized if they were feeling awkward about themselves it could be worse :)! I don't remember the day of that picture but I do remember my First Holy Communion. It was filled with a lot of excitement and, honestly, from that day sprung a great desire to be involved in the life of the Church. From that day, the seeds of priesthood were planted. Of this, I have no doubt.

St. Ignatius further writes, "How does he unite Himself to us in the Eucharist? By the nearest and most intimate union....with what sentiments does He unite Himself to us? With

sentiments of the most ardent love; and this love He reveals by his desires" (*The Spiritual Exercises* 195, 1-2). The Eucharist is this outpouring of God's love for us. If only I (and maybe you) would act like that were true? If we could ever see each Mass as this incredible outpouring of God's love, would not we be different, would not the church be different, would not the world be different? Instead, we easily can get caught in the routine and the ritual (all good) and lose sight of the Real Love offered to us in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ.

I suppose the measure of our understanding of this Real Love is how we embody that Love in the world in which we live. Do we seek with the "most ardent love" our brothers and sisters among us, most especially the poor and vulnerable? Jesus does. May we do the same.

Please say a prayer for me.

- Submit the action alert you should have received in your email once you signed the petition. If you don't see your action alert within a few minutes, check your spam folders! Or, if you don't want to wait, you can go directly to <u>www.bit.ly/no-taxpayerabortion-action</u>.
- 3. Follow up with your Members of Congress. You can find out who they are and how to contact them personally by going to <u>www.bit.ly/find-officials</u> and putting in your mailing address. FYI, your address is not shared with anyone—we just ask for it so we can show you who represents you.
- Tell your family and friends to do steps 1-3.
- Raise awareness in your parish. Resources are available at <u>www.respectlife.org/notaxpayer-abortion</u>.

regardless of party, think it is a bad idea. Taxpayer-funded abortion is not a popular, winning issue. Members of Congress know this, but it needs to be reinforced by hearing from their constituents!

- Hearing strong opposition to taxpayer-funded abortion could make them worried about keeping their seats if they vote in favor of it.
- Members of Congress talk to each other. Yours might discuss what they're hearing from you and other constituents with other Members, or even their party's leadership. What they say could make other Members in their party back away from taxpayer-funded abortion.



WHAT TO SAY TO YOUR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS

(Remember... The squeaky wheel gets the grease, and you catch more flies with honey than vinegar. In other words, be a persistent, positive witness to the cause of life by being courteous and kind.)

- I'm a constituent of Representative / Senator ______
- Regardless of where one stands on abortion, there's been a long-standing, bipartisan agreement that taxpayers shouldn't have to pay for it.
- I urge Representative / Senator ______ to protect the Hyde Amendment and to oppose any bill, including appropriation bills, that expand taxpayer funding of abortion.



ACTIVATING YOUR PARISH

(Target for rollout: First week of June or earlier)

- Start with prayer.

- Think creatively about where, how, and who can help get the word out.

Discussion Questions

1. "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you." Why was blood so significant in those ancient ceremonies? Why was it used to seal solemn agreements? Is there a relationship between blood and life? Between blood and death?

2. Elsewhere, in John 17:24 Jesus says "I wish that where I am they also may be with me. ... " In today's reading Jesus "entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption." Did he bring us along [redeemed now though his love] into the sanctuary with him?

3. Is anyone "worthy" to receive Christ in the Eucharist? Where should the "worthy" decision lie? In the conscience of the receiver? In the conscience of the priest or Eucharistic minister?

For some, the sound and the acoustics in the Church make it hard to hear. For others of us, it's just hard to hear! We have small listening devices that are available for parishioner use. They work if you have hearing aids and if you do not.

See one of our sacristans -usually wearing a Ca-


