When will it end?

IT TOOK A RIOT

I almost missed it. I heard the story of the death of an African American man involving a police officer. I heard something. I didn't stick with it for too long. I sort of shrugged my shoulders and said to myself, "Oh, again...there was a story a few weeks ago about a guy in Georgia, right?"

Then I heard about protests in cities throughout the country, even here in our region. I saw the images of violence and destructive and defeating crime in response. I saw anger in the stories of those who were outraged at this killing. I saw the sadness in those who were seeing their communities torn apart and now another person who looks like them killed.

Shame on me. I missed it.

It took a riot to get my attention.

You see I am part of the problem. I have become numb to a lot of things, even the life ending impact of violence and racism doesn't initially shake me. We are so saturated these days by scandal and violence and evil and death that we have become numb. Some of the actions, statements, and events that would have caused shock a few years ago barely raise an eyebrow. So distracted I forgot about the value of a life. I know I have. I have forgotten the value of life regardless of age, race, sexual orientation, economic status and, even history. I almost gave the whole thing a pass.

I need to look within. From where I live and what I do, I am not the "other", the "them", part of the "you people". I can quickly point out those individuals. I have to look within. I must try and see where and how the bias and prejudice shows itself even if I can be pretty good at not showing it. I must pray for the Holy Spirit to purify me from it.

I can convince myself that is enough. I'll work on me. I'll get better. Good for me! It's a start. It's just not Catholic.

I have a responsibility and a mission to look beyond, a responsibility and a mission to see beyond myself and work to bring about the transformation of the world. I cannot only look at the death of an African American man as a single incident. I have to look deeper. How has this developed? How is it gotten this far? Why is it still going on? I must face some of the tough questions like why certain races suffer more economically or from diseases like COVID-19? I have to



face those questions because I am failing to be part of the building of the Kingdom of God if I don't. I need to look at law and housing and crime and jails and health care and insurance and privilege and all of those things that make me – not the other – uncomfortable and even afraid. In writing about systemic racism, Archbishop Blaise Cupich of Chicago writes, "I know there is a way to fix it. And the fix begins when we stop talking about the proportionality of 'their' response and

start talking about the proportionality of 'ours.' Surely a nation that could put a man in space, his safety assured by the brilliance of black women, can create a fair legal system, equitable education and employment opportunities and ready access to health care. Laws do not solve problems, but they create a system where racism in all its forms is punished and playing fields are leveled." That change is probably going to make me uncomfortable. I guess if the Gospel doesn't make me I'm just not reading. Time to break open my Bible.

I spoke to the brother of a student in our school today. I reached out to this student's

family and a few others after the death of George Floyd in Minnesota and the protests and violence since. I did not know what to say and didn't have anything planned. I just listened. He spoke about living on Long Island. He said, "You know, Fr. John, we are pretty sheltered here. I feel like we live in a bubble. Something like this shakes you up." He spoke about going to protests and thanking the cops who were there. He voice quivered as he spoke. "Fr. John, I had to talk to my little brother today about all of this. What if it were him? What if it were me?"

I can't relate and maybe I don't want to relate. It is easy to shrug my shoulders and say,

"Oh, yeah, it happened again...what are you going to do?

I needed a riot to wake me up. What will it be for you?






DRIVE IN MASS

Mass Book 2020

Many of you have reached out about Mass intentions. I want to let you know a few things:

1)The requested offering for a Mass Intention is \$20.00.

2)We offer two Masses a day here as a parish.

a) The first Mass is offered at 8 a.m. via Livestream.

b) The second Mass, at the present time, is offered by one of the priests private-

1y.

c) In general, priests celebrate Mass each day. If not, they usually concelebrate at a Mass.

3)We have added a Sunday evening Mass. Our Weekend Mass schedule is Saturday evening 5 p.m., Sunday morning 8 a.m. and Sunday evening at 5:30 p.m.

a) Existing Mass intentions will be assigned between the Saturday evening, Sunday morning and Sunday evening Masses.

b) If you have requested an intention to pray for at Mass, you have been or will be contacted.

4)We will now "Open the Mass Book" for the rest of 2020.

a) Sunday Mass Intentions: After July 1st intentions will be taken for six Sunday (including Saturday evening) Masses. (2 on Saturday evening; 3 on Sunday morning; 1 on Sunday evening)

i. PLEASE NOTE: We will NOT be able to give exact times for the Sunday morning Masses at this time. Again, because of precautions related to distance, cleaning, etc. it is likely we will need to have more time in between Masses. It is just not clear at this time how that will look.

ii. We will also need to account for baptisms as well as some weddings.

b) Daily Mass Intentions will continue to be offered Monday – Friday. For now, the first Mass will be at 8 a.m. and the second one privately.
