A Message from Fr. Felix...

Prayer of thanksgiving:

We tend to take our blessings for granted. We consider the things we have as givens rather than as gifts. We ought to overcome this tendency by often giving thanks to God for His goodness and for the many gifts He has given to us. "Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving" (psalm 95:2). God loves our expressions of gratitude, which show our appreciation and recognition that all good things come from Him. The Sacred Scripture is filled with counsels to give thanks to God and with examples of thanksgiving. In the same way prayer of thanksgiving flows naturally from prayer of praise. Many of the Biblical prayers of praise are also prayers of thanksgiving. The following are some prayers from sacred scripture that focus on thanksgiving and showing appreciation:

Old Testament canticles

First Samuel 2:1-10 (Canticle of Hannah) Tobit 12:6-10 (Raphael's Exhortation) Isaiah 12:1-6 (song of Thanksgiving) and the psalms include the following 23 (the Good Shepherd), 40, 62, 65, 66, 103, and 107 just to mention few. The epistles of St. Paul often begin and end with thanksgiving. Most importantly the Eucharist is the Church's supreme act of thanksgiving. Eucharist is the Greek word for thanksgiving. When Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, He gave thanks. The sacrifice of the cross, which was the paramount act of gratitude to God is re-presented every time the Holy Sacrifice of the mass is offered. The Eucharistic prayer of the mass opens with thanksgiving to God. "Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all that he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification" (canon 1360).

Origins of Father's Day

The campaign to celebrate the nation's fathers did not meet with the same enthusiasm – perhaps because, as one florist explained, "fathers haven't the same sentimental appeal that mothers have". On July 5th, 1908, a West Virgina church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers, that Sunday sermon in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont coal company mines in Monongah, but it was a one -time commemoration



and not an annual holiday. The nation's first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910, in the State of Washington. However, it was not until 1972 –58 years after President Woodrow Wilson made Mother's Day official --- that the day honoring fathers became a nationwide holiday in the United. The fourth commandment says honor your father and mother. "Children, listen to me your father, act accordingly, that you may be safe. For the Lord sets a father in honor over his children and confirms a mother's authority over her sons. Those who honor their father atone for sins; they store up riches who respect their mother. Those who honor their father will have joy in their own children, and when they pray, they are heard. Those who respect their father will live a long life; those who obey the lord honor their mother" (Sirach 3:1-6).

Let us seek to live in God's love, which covers a multitude of sins; and wear His love like cloak of light, covering us from head to toe. Have no fear, for perfect love decimates fear. Look at other people through lenses of love; see them from God's perspective. This is how you walk in the light, and it pleases God. Thankfulness is not some sort of magic formular; it is the language of love which enables us to communicate intimately with one another. You are here to shine in your own wonderful way, sharing your smile in the best way you can, and remembering all the while that a little light somewhere makes a brighter light everywhere. Thank you very much, you are so worthy of such an abundance... of friendship, joy and love.

Votive Candles/Altar Candles



The world-famous INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA will be on tour throughout our Diocese during the month of June 2024. On June 19th, The World Apostolate of Fatima-USA will bring the statue to our parish. This historic statue began its travels from Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1947, and has been around the world many times. Sculpted by Jose' Thedim, based on the description of Sister Lucia, one of the three seers, it was blessed by the Bishop of Fatima and commissioned to serve the Pilgrim Virgin, who would carry the blessings of Fatima throughout the world. The Bishop prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. The statue has visited more than 100 countries bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions of people. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled. This is a special opportunity to pray with Our Lady, learn Our Lady's messages and requests at Fatima, and present any special intentions you may have for yourself or others.


Here at St. John's ,there are so many opportunities to grow in faith, to serve others and to build up the Body of Christ. Take a look at what's coming up!




A Message from Msgr. Walden...

How far can you go if your relatives think you are crazy and those in authority want to eliminate you? That is the situation presented at the beginning of the Gospel for today's Mass (Mark 3:20-35): "Jesus came home with his disciples. Again the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to seize him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebub," and "By the prince of demons he drives demons." The question is not how far can Jesus go, but how far has He come and how much are we part of who He is and what He has done.

It is ignorance and close mindedness that fuels hatred and consumes our time energy and thoughts. There is no peace in our hearts when hatred, anger, and ignorance are raging. Yet faced with the reality of the skepticism of His relatives and the rejection of the religious leaders, Jesus not only persevered, but redeemed, enriched and brought us into His life with Father, Holy and the Spirit, mother. These words at the end of today's Gospel make that very clear: "A crowd seated around him told him, "Your mother and your brothers and your sisters are outside asking for you." But he said to them in reply, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Any commitment we make takes only grows when jump in with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Jesus not only found joy and life in proclaiming the Good News of God's love. He also found joy in being God's love. His love went beyond inner satisfaction that He willing died on the cross to redeem us from our sins to the joy of being grateful to love us. It is very encouraging to love and be loved in return, as well as being told how grateful others are for our love. But the final step is the step Jesus so willingly took and how grateful He was to have the opportunity to love us. Romans 5:8: "But God proves his

love for us in that, while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." He did not look for results beforehand, He simply embraced

They are more to be desired than gold, than the purest of gold and sweeter are they than honey, than honey from the comb.

So in them your servant finds instruction; great reward is in their keeping.
But who can detect all his errors?
From hidden faults acquit me.

From presumption restrain your servant and let it not rule me.

Then shall I be blameless, clean from grave sin.

May the spoken words of my mouth, the thoughts of my heart, win favor in your sight, O Lord, my rescuer, my rock! Glory...

Psalm Prayer:

May our words in praise of your commandments find favor with you, Lord. May our faith prove we are not slaves, but sons, not so much subjected to your law as sharing your power.




