

Dear Parish Family:

I prepare this letter on July 8th as our region of New York State enters Phase 4 of reopening. These are trying times and we want to take each step as carefully as possible. 
I want to write today about some phases and transition in the life of our parish and those who have touched the life of our community. In the midst of all this happening in our country and world, the work of the Church continues.



Please keep Fr. Michael and our parish in your prayers. This change in phase in the life of a priest is tough especially taking leave of your first priestly assignment. It is a beautiful opportunity for Fr. Michael and a gift for the young people of families of St. Anthony's High School. The in-between time is a tough

phase to be in, for sure!

Welcome Fr. Jaime! This week, I learned we will be assigned a new priest to SJE. Fr. Jaime Calderon-Hernandez will come to SJE from St. Mary's in East Islip. I met Fr. Jaime (pronounced Hi-mee) a few weeks ago. I can tell you he is very excited to be coming here. In addition to this full-time work here at St. John's, Fr. Jaime will continue his work with the Spanish community at St. Jude's in Mastic Beach. Fr. Jaime and I will work with Fr. Ryan at St. Jude's and Bishop Henning and Bishop Romero to see how we can work more closely in this area in the months ahead.







Congratulations Fr. Raf! On June 20, Seminarian Raf became Fr. Raf! We are so happy for him. Fr. Rafal has been assigned to Our Lady of Victory in Floral Park. His first pastor, Fr. Tom Fusco, is one of the finest pastors in the diocese. He is in good hands! (And he's around good Polish food in Floral Park.) As things move forward, I will invite Fr. He saw the power of a Christ-centered community and learned so much from it. This, too, is a tough time for Paul and a tough transition, for sure. Discernment is not for the weak. I ask that you keep Paul and his family in your thoughts and prayers. If you would like to reach out to Paul, you can send any cards or notes to my attention here at St. John's and I'll make sure he receives them. We remember Paul's great devotion to Mary. Let's ask the Blessed Mother to continue to comfort



and encourage him in these times as he continues to discern all the Lord has in store for him.

This week's Gospel is one we probably know pretty well. It is the parable of the sower and the seed, a parable that invites us to consider God's outpouring of love and how open we are to allowing it to take root in us. As I consider all the phases and transitions our parish has embraced in these years, I think it is pretty clear that we have the potential of being good ground for those discerning God's call to Holy Orders and those doing their best to live it out! This is a credit to you. By your witness and worship, your prayer and presence, you provide support, encouragement, good challenge, and great grace to all who serve here, especially me.

Let's continue to pray God will give us - as individuals and as parish - what we need to be good ground for all who come our way.

"Not infrequently a kind of opposition is constructed between theology and pastoral care, as if they were two opposite, separate realities that have nothing to do with one another. Not infrequently, we identify doctrine with the conservative, the retrograde; and, on the other side, we think that pastoral care is an adaptation, a reduction, and an accommodation, as if they had nothing to do with each other. Thus, we create a false opposition between theology and pastoral care; between the believer's reflection and the believer's life; life, then has no space for reflection and reflection finds no space in life. The great fathers of the church, Irenaeus, Augustine, Basil, and Ambrose, to name a few, were great theologians because they were great pastors. One of the contributions of the Second Vatican Council was seeking a way to overcome this divorce of theology and pastoral care, between faith and life. I dare to say that it revolutionized, to some extent, the status of theology – the believer's way of doing and thinking."



#### PHASE IV UPDATES

As of today, our region of New York State enters a new phase in our state's reopening in this time of pandemic. This is not a time to be less vigilant. It's actually a time to be even more vigilant as we want to keep everyone safe and not have to shut back down because of any increase in illness.

- Church capacity will now be at 50%, approximately 300 people.
- Masks are NOT optional.
  - o If you do not wear a mask, you will be asked to leave the church building. Please do not put anyone in the uncomfortable position of asking you to leave the building.
  - o Masks are worn as means of protection, more for the people around you than you. If you struggle wearing one as I do, offer it up and consider it an act of charity.
- Our Cana Care Crew will continue to be present but with more open pews we will need to work more independently.
  - All must maintain a six foot distance, unless you live with the people you are sitting next too...so this might mean..
     -In one row, two individuals or groups may sit at either

end of the pew. In the next open row, an individual or group should sit in the center of that row.

- o Please continue to use caution and prudence (and good humor) at all times!
- o We are still prepared to celebrate "overflow" Masses in the school auditorium on Saturday evenings and Sundays.
- We will add two additional communion stations at Sunday Mass.
  - o Please follow the directions of the Cana Care Crew members.
  - o Please keep a 6 foot distance when on the communion line.
  - o Please receive communion in the hand.
    - → Thank you to those who have made this sacrifice. While receiving communion on the tongue is not my experience, I so appreciate the offering those who regularly receive on the tongue have made in these weeks and months. It is another layer of protection and caution and eases anxiety for the ministers of communion, including this one.
- ★ The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still lifted.
  - o However, it might be good for some of us to take a step back to life of prayer here at SJE.
  - o If Sunday Mass might be too much right now, consider coming to Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 3-7 Monday Thursday which has a smaller crowd and a more room to spread out.

- o Consider coming to Daily Mass at 7 a.m. or 12 Noon or 8 a.m. on Saturday mornings.
- o Come to the Church or Seton Chapel during the day when it is emptier and enjoy the peace of these sacred spaces.
- o Come and sit on the convent deck, walk through the Peace Garden or visit one of our shrines to Mary.
- → If you are sick or ill, DO NOT COME TO THE CHURCH.
  - o We will continue to live stream one daily Mass and one Sunday Mass and the East End Holy Hour as well as funerals and weddings.
  - o In the next week or two, we will be upgrading our video technology to allow for better communication with you.
- o We have processes in place to celebrate Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals. Please reach out to the Parish Office.
- Our offices are staffed but not "open" to the public yet. I ask that you call ahead to make an appointment before coming on campus.

Dear Level 2 Families:

We hope you are all doing well during these challenging times. We find that we are always looking for some signs of hope in these days. We hope this letter becomes one of them!

We will celebrate First Holy Communions at St. John the Evangelist in late July and early August for our Level 2 students.

#### Details....Details!

There's a lot to go over here, so please read through this letter fully and carefully! We know you understand as we do that these are tentative times. We are all a little more careful and cautious in these days. So here are some things to note:

- First Holy Communions will be held on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday late afternoons and evenings. We will not have any First Holy Communions for SJE on Saturday mornings.
  - We are still working to schedule a number of funerals and memorial masses for families who lost loved ones during the height of the pandemic and were unable to celebrate funeral masses at that time. And...we have re-scheduled weddings.
- At present, we are limited to a 50% capacity in the Church. Each First Holy Communion candidate will be limited to seven (7) family members and friends.
- We have doubled the amount of First Holy Communion Masses so each group will be a bit smaller. (Students have been assigned by class).
- Masks are to be worn by every person in the church building and social distancing is required of those who do not live together.
  - o If you would like, make a special mask for First Holy Communion. Include a symbol of the Eucharist!
- It has been a tradition to make an offering at the time of First Holy Communion.
  - o If you are able, we are asking for a donation of \$25 per child. This helps cover some of the expenses associated with First Holy Communion.
  - All offerings may be made online by going to:

- Masses will be live streamed and then uploaded to our parish YouTube page. If there are family members or friends who cannot attend or do not feel they should, they may pray with us virtually. (Unfortunately, due to a number of factors, we are unable to have a video produced this year, but we will still have the Live Stream).

- You may wish to celebrate your child's First Holy Communion at a Sunday Mass. Options for this are listed below. (These are capped at 5 families). Options for this are as follows:
  - o Sunday 7/26; Sunday, 8/2; or Sunday, 8/9 @ 10AM, 12Noon or 6PM
  - O Spanish Mass-Saturday, 7/25; Saturday, 8/1; or Saturday 8/8 @ 7:30PM
  - o Rehearsal for all Weekend First Communions: Friday, 7/17 @ 4PM in the Church

#### Getting Ready! There are few things we need to do to get ready!

- Preparation
  - We need you to work together with your child in the weeks ahead. Here what we ask of your family:
    - Try to attend daily Mass or Sunday Mass in the weeks ahead.
    - Review Chapters 5 and 6 of the Eucharist workbook (blue) with your child.
    - We're going to be sending you a message each week to help you get ready for First Holy Communion.

# CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

#### **Planning Baptisms**

We are once again beginning the process of scheduling and planning baptisms. If you had a baptism scheduled, you will be (or have been contacted) to re-schedule your baptism. 
