

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

From the Principals' Desk

SUMMER SCHOOL

Dear Parish Family:

So I'm in summer school. I don't like it. I didn't fail – I don't think I did. I am at a two day workshop sponsored by the Catholic Leadership Institute. OLQA, The Catholic School in Center Moriches, was one of seven schools selected to be part of a pilot program as part of the strategic planning efforts of the Diocese of Rockville Centre. This relates to the Disciple Maker Index we took part in during March and April.

The work of these days is ultimately part of an effort to make our Catholic school even stronger. It is not necessarily focused on enrollment, fundraising or academic initiatives. It is pushing us, as a school community, to become even more mission focused within – among students, parents and families – so we may become stronger in our missionary and evangelizing work.

Honestly, I find this frustrating. Since becoming the Principal of the school, I have been overwhelmed by important practical realities. Enrollment is always a challenge in a Catholic school and with declining population in this area even more challenging. Budgeting and finances are constant areas of concern while trying to offer the best we can for our students. I found myself saying, "Come on, we have a lot more important things to work on."



Then, I prepared to celebrate Mass today at 12 Noon. The Gospel sort of hit me in the head (Matthew 10:1-7). Jesus sends out the disciples first to lost sheep of Israel before "making disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Work within. Build up your strength. Then go out.

As we have taken time to pray and reflect in these days, I guess we have tried to do this at the Catholic School in Center Moriches. Over the past year, many stakeholders worked hard (and continue to work hard) to sure up our strengths in so many areas and address areas of concern. We are in the midst of going out to let even more people know about the good work happening here at OLOA. (Honestly, I'm counting on you to help spread that word!)

Maybe it's a good time for summer school for each of us, related to schools or not. Can these summer weeks help us to grow stronger and stronger in our relationship with Jesus? Maybe a little summer school in faith? Here are some classes/courses/activities I'm suggesting:

- Can we try to take a little more time in quiet prayer here on the grounds of SJE, in your home or in another place of solitude?
- Can we read a book about the spiritual life or a favorite saint?
- Are you thinking about preparing for the Total Consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary?
- How about Daily Mass or trying to make some time to pray the Rosary as a family or by yourself? •
- Maybe visit the Shrine for a quiet day?
- How about taking time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (here or somewhere else)?
- Can you take some time on Monday evenings, Thursday afternoons or Friday mornings for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in Seton Chapel?

SJE – as you can tell from this bulletin – does not slow down in the summer. We continue to celebrate, to pray, to form, to serve and to renovate and repair. (It's part of the reason we need to do things like the Summer Appeal.) The volume of things so many ministries offer and activities that happen here is overwhelming to me. I am in awe. Yet, if we are just "doing things" or "having events" or carrying out works, we risk becoming great "doers" while not creating room for God to do great things with us. (Can you tell I'm writing to myself too?)

To be honest, I'm writing this letter during my summer school class. I hope I don't get caught. These days are a reminder to me that I need to keep trying to slow it down and move deeper and deeper wherever the Lord is calling me. I probably need some more time in summer school. Maybe you too?

Please say a prayer for me.

Catholic Schools Shine During Commencement Season

Like many of you, I've spent the last couple of weeks attending graduations. My Mom even went to the kindergarten graduation of my grandnephew Charlie!

Me? I was at the commencements for Dominican College, St. Barnabas High School, Cardinal Hayes High School, and St. Theresa's grade school (for the region in the Bronx.)

I loved and enjoyed them all!

What's even better, my passion for Catholic education was intensified.

See, sometimes I give in to temptations to discouragement as I wonder if our Catholic schools are worth all the blood, sweat, and tears they require. Some of the buildings need repair and modernization; enrollment in some places is down; only about 30 percent of our kids attend them; critics seem to multiply; and the costs keep going up.

Are they worth it?

Then I visit one of them, or meet a grateful alumnus, or attend a graduation ceremony, and shout out, *"You bet they are!"*

Last Thursday we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension. As Jesus returned to his Father in heaven, He gave His disciples one last mandate: "Go, teach all nations!"

For 2,000 years His Church has heeded His ultimate command. And perhaps the most effective way we do that here is through our Catholic schools.

We worry about a lot of problems in our society today: violence, drugs, broken families, disinterested citizens.

Research tells us that graduates of Catholic schools are far less likely to get involved in drugs, crimes, or violence; enter into more lasting marriages with unified families; and are very involved as leaders in the community.

We also worry about our Church: people who do not know the faith, hardly ever pray, do not go to Sunday Mass; then there are problems with not enough priests and sisters, and not enough money or volunteering to keep our parishes and ministries thriving.

Guess what? Research again shows that those who have attended Catholic schools know their religion

better, pray more often, and are more regular at Sunday Mass; not only that, they are more likely to become priests or sisters, and are more with generous their sharing time, talent, and treasure.



Get it? You want to improve our society and our Church? Send your kids to Catholic schools!

Ok, but—I hate to say it—most parents don't. The public schools in my district, they argue, are not bad, and, even better, they're free! Why sacrifice to put my kids in a Catholic school and pay, in buildings that might not have all the "bells and whistles" of the public one?

We can point out that last year's state test scores put our Catholic schools first among public, charter, and most expensive private ones. That alone, we would argue, makes them worth it.

But, the most compelling reason to sacrifice to put our kids into a Catholic school came in a comment to me from a mom, an immigrant from Albania, whose son had just graduated from a Catholic school:

"It was God's mercy that brought me to America; it was God's grace that has gotten me through here," she told me in broken English. "I was not going to send my son to a school where God and faith was not part of his everyday learning."

An education without God is an education deficient.

Right now, some parents are wondering where to enroll their child for school next September.

Put them in a school that is part of a 2,000-year success story: a Catholic school.

There, they will learn not only how to get into college or get a good job. They'll learn how to get to *heaven*.

To be reminded of that is why I enjoy going to so many graduations!

Totus Tuus

It's hard to believe that I've been at St. John's for two years already. They say time flies when you're having fun! One of the first "things" I tried to start up when I first arrived here was the Consecration to Jesus through Mary (a.k.a. Marian Consecration). We did it as a parish on October 13, 2017, do you remember? Marian Consecration is, in the words of St. Louis de Montfort, "the surest, easiest and most perfect way of becoming a saint" and boy does our Church and our world need saints now more than ever!

Every year on August 15 we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the highest solemnities of the liturgical year in honor of Our Lady. This year, August 15 also happens to coincide with the passing of some legislation, which will likely have a great impact on the mission of the Church here in New York. In some ways, we as a Church will be going into uncharted territory and providentially we go there on this great feast day of Our Lady, always seeking to be ever more under her care and closer to her Son. So I'd like to invite you whether you did the Marian Consecration back in 2017, some other time in your life, or if it's the first time you've ever heard of this to make consecration on August 15, 2019.

So what do you have to do? First, get one of the booklets of Fr. Michael Gaitley's 33 Days to Morning Glory, which we will be distributing for FREE. There are still some copies available. It's like a DIY retreat for a month that really explains itself. It's not a big-time commitment, probably about 5 minutes a day, and the reflections are very substantial. Second, start the reflections today! We started on Saturday but you can still catch up. Make the commitment to give God those few minutes every day. Third, make the consecration on your own or with the parish on August 15 (more to come on this).

I hope to join you spiritually in making this Consecration to Jesus through Mary this summer. Pope St. John Paul II, whose motto was Totus Tuus ("Totally Yours (Mary)"), once said that making this consecration marked a decisive turning point in his life. Perhaps for us personally and as a parish, this consecration to Jesus through Mary might mark a decisive turning point for our lives too. Disclaimer, this is not for the faint of heart, this is for those who want to take their relationship with God to the next level. This is for those who want to be saints.
