A Reflection on the Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

“Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.”

Jesus sent the Twelve out (two by two) so that each would have a witness for their testimony.

Shaking the dust off their feet symbolizes that even the earth (the dust from their feet) would be a witness against the ones who would refuse the testimony of those Jesus sent to preach the gospel.

Even now, at the end of every mass during the concluding rite, we are also sent forth to bear witness to the gospel; a reminder that there is still much to be spoken about, and that God wants us to be involved in the mission. If we look for humble opportunities to share Jesus' words with others, we will find them. It's amazing how the slightest hint of God in a simple conversation almost anywhere reveals most people's thirst for Him.

This life is short, but Heaven is forever. We're merely passing through an existence which is not our true home. So 'travel light,' do good things, and concentrate on what's important.

It's not important what you wear on your back, but what you bear in your heart.

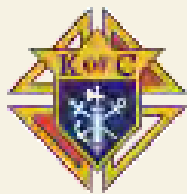

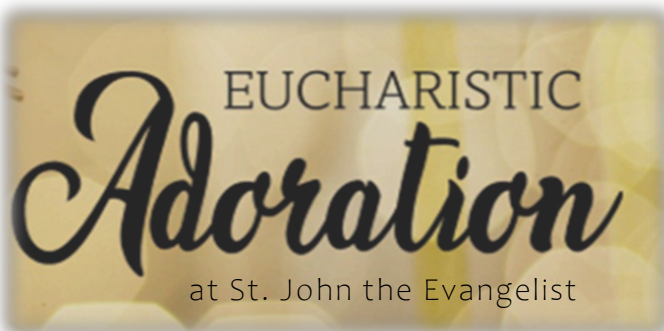

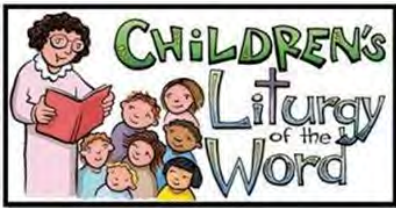
REGISTRATION FOR 2024-2025: NOW THRU AUGUST 23

A Message from Msgr. Walden...



Now that we are in the 21st century, spelling words is not so important any more. How good it was in grammar school to get 100% on a spelling test. We have gone from RSVP, BYOB, and BOGO to TTYL, LOL, IMHO, to who knows what is next. Last week I spoke about one of the key issues that is wreaking havoc in our nation today, abortion, and how it casts a pall of anger, division, and negativity over us. Anytime we take the lives of others or dismiss others for our own convenience or perceived good, we enter into the realm of sin. If we were to take the letters of the word sin and make it SIN, the three letters would give us the words Separation, Insecurity, Negativity.

First of all sin is any act on our personal part that separates us from God, one another, and our very selves. In the first reading at today's Mass (Amos 7:12-15), the prophet Amos is told by one of the priests of where he is prophesying to take himself and his message of calling the people to turn away from sin and turn back to God to get lost. They do not want to hear it. Jesus never walked away from confrontation nor did he fear to confront people who were openly sinful. Two very important verses come to mind: Romans 5:8 - "While we were still sinners Christ died for us" and Luke 5:30-32 - "The Pharisees and their scribes complained to his disciples, saying, 'Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?' Jesus said to them in reply, 'Those who are healthy do not need a physician, but the sick do. I have not come to call the righteous to repentance but sinners.'" Being created in the image and likeness of God by God Himself means we only find the path to the fullness of life with God, ourselves and one another when we put our faith and trust in Him, seeking His life giving forgiveness when we sin and allowing Him to be who He truly is for us: the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

The Catholic Church in our nation is seen by the media and many in our government, starting with the President who claims to be Catholic, as out of step with twenty-first century America. It is not God who is out of step with us, but we who are out of step with Him and in that process have deep divisions, distrust, and anger, all fomenting havoc, division, and hatred. When all these negative words describe our current situation, sin is at work and the devil is delighted. How desperately we need the light of God's wisdom, love, and truth.

We can use the word SIN as an acronym. The first letter - "S" stands for separation. As a nation we are certainly divided in many way politically and personally. Where is our hope for unity? God who created, redeemed, and shares His love, life, and truth

with us is our only true hope. To separate ourselves for God inevitably leads to separation from one another - "I'm right, you are wrong!"

The second letter of SIN - "I" connotes insecurity. We are made in God's image and can only find peace and security when we live in union with Him. Only true faith that Jesus is the Way, Truth, and Life brings peace. That peace has been offered and shared with us as the Church which Jesus established 2000 years ago when He said to St. Peter: "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven.* Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16:1-19). True security comes only when we put our trust in Jesus and His presence to us and through us. Nothing else can substitute for that. When we seek security in other ways, places, and people, the devil is delighted with the division we have in defending and promoting sinful actions, words, and programs.

The final letter in the word SIN - "N". That stands for Negativity. We certainly live in a very negative climate in our world, our nation, and in our communities. Horns are ever honking with impatience, opinions of those who disturb us are blasted verbally and through the social media, and protests are ever in the news. Is there anything hopeful and life-giving in our midst? I hope we can each say we live with people who are great sources of goodness, love, generosity, kindness, and we are the same for them. In my seven months here at St. John the Evangelist with you, I am touched everyday by so many people of goodness, love, faith, mercy, and generosity. How good it is be the antidote to SIN. How good it is when we overcome Separation, Insecurity, and Negativity with Sincerity, Integrity, and Nurturing, all coming from hearts embraced by Jesus who is our Way, Truth, and Life.

I offer this prayer from St. Mother Teresa that I pray everyday and invite you to do also. It got her to heaven and will do the same for us.

He is the Life I want to live.

He is the Light I want to radiate.

He is the Way to the Father.

He is the Love with which I want to love.

He is the joy I want to share.

He is the Peace I want to sow.

Jesus is Everything to me.

Without Him, I can do nothing.

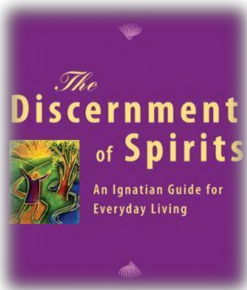

SJE Safe Environment Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional billing purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.
