FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Wisdom and Grace

Senior Ministry

Now that I am old and gray, do not forsake me, God, that I may proclaim your might to all generations yet to come. Your power and justice, God, to the highest heaven. You have done great things... My lips will shout for joy as I sing your praise; my soul, too, which you have redeemed. —**Psalm 71**

Dear Parish Family:

I have spent most of ministerial life working with young people. To this day, I commit a tremendous amount of time here to the work of OLQA and Faith Formation and do the best I can to be present to the youth ministry activities of the parish. Prior to entering the seminary, I worked as a campus minister at a high school and a youth minister in the parish. As a social worker, my primary work is with young people. As a parish and a church, we commit a great amount of resources and time to the work of youth ministry and we should and we must!

At the same time, I have always struggled with the comparable lack of resources to those at the other end of life—those persons of wisdom who are the foundation of the Church here at St. John's and everywhere else. For sure, the needs are different. I find that we rely tremendously on older parishioners for their financial support, leadership, experience, wisdom and participation (and we should and we must!). At the same time, I do not know that we always provide enough support and encouragement, presence and resources for the seniors of the Church and, specifically, at St. John's. I fear, sometimes, we may take older people for granted. We shouldn't and we can't.

Over the past few months, I have been talking regularly with Sister Ann about the possibility of starting a more official senior ministry here at St. John the Evangelist. I am excited to announce that beginning today, July 15th, Sister Ann is the new Director of Senior Ministry at St. John the Evangelist. She is excited too! This will be a great opportunity for our parish as we seek to develop new ways to better engage, involve and support those people of wisdom in our parish.

In my two years at St. John's, I have been overwhelmed by the wisdom and grace of Sister Ann. Because of her tremendous experience and deep love for the Church, I have come to rely on her advice and her presence. What a gift she is going to continue to be as she charts a new path for our parish's future.





In taking on this new position, Sister Ann will be step-

ping away from the day to day of parish social ministry. Beginning today, Alex Finta (pictured left with his fiancé) who has served as the Associate Director of Parish Social Ministry will be the Director of Parish Social Ministry. In the time Alex has been here as a social work intern, Associate Director of Parish Social Ministry and the School Social Worker, he has gained a great deal from his experience here and has brought many great gifts to the life of our parish. He has

worked hand in hand with Sister Ann on many projects and I have great hope that even more good things are on the horizon! And good news for him—a person of wisdom and grace will continue to be working with him in this new role (and keeping her eye on him too!).

REBUILD + REPAIR + RESTORE QUESTIONS! QUESTIONS! QUESTIONS!

As we return to the church building so many have expressed great praise to God for the many beautiful things that are part of the restoration work. Like anything new, we have some "kinks" to work out and we are in the process of doing this! A few regular questions have come up and over the next few weeks, I'll try to address them here. If you have additional questions, please e-mail them to jsureau@sjecm.org or leave a message in the Parish Office so we can respond.

"I thought the sound would be better in all parts of the church. It can still be tough for me, at times."

Many have commented about the improved sound in the church building yet it will take us a few weeks to get all of the levels correct. A concern in the church building before the restoration was the volume and echo. We are in the process of finding the right settings for different celebrations – weekday Mass versus Sunday Mass, etc. Unfortunately, you know the best time to do this? When people are in the church building itself. There is a trial and error process to this and that will take us some time.

If you struggle to hear, please consider sitting in the center sections of the church building. Providing sound for transepts is never easy. Already, we have added small speakers in the transepts to address some of the initial concerns and we are still working at it. New listening assistance devices should arrive soon.

"Where's that piano?"

It's coming! The restoration work for the piano has taken longer than anticipated because the damage to the instrument was severe. We are hoping in the next week or two – perhaps even by the time you are reading this answer that the restored piano will be in place.

"Why are we missing bookracks on the north side of the Church?"

The pew company sent us incorrect pew racks. New ones are being constructed and should be here in the next few weeks.

SAINT SURVEY SAYS!

In the midst of all of the restoration work, I failed to let everyone know about the new saints that will be part of the reredos in the sanctuary.





First, as noted previously, we will change the statue of the Blessed Mother presently in the reredos. We are in the process of having an

image of **Our Lady Queen of Apostles** created (there are not many of them!) so this is taking a little time. Thanks to the Legion of Mary for their support and encouragement with this. This statue will serve as a great link to our regional school. The present statue will then move to the Mary wall in the Parish Office.

The two "new" saints for the reredos are....drumroll please!....

St. Francis of Assisi and St. Jude!

I have reached out to Fr. Ryan at St. Jude's and he says they have a restored statue they would like to give us. Once we are settled with the image of Our Lady Queen of Apostles we will place all three statues in the reredos at the same time. More details to come!

Dear St. John the Evangelist Family:

We write today to share good news with you about all that is happening here and, as you might suspect, ask your support for a project that will benefit our school and local community.

There are many signs of joy and hope in our community. Our enrollment is healthy and our finances stable. We are in the process of establishing a middle school academy and the work of updating and improving our school building is continuing. With a committed faculty and staff, now including a school social worker and campus minister, we are looking forward many great years of service.

We write today to seek your help and financial support for a project that is both a necessity and an opportunity. We are remaking the David Turpin Sports Complex – the playground area behind the school. David Turpin was a young man who tragically died too young. His family supported this project years ago and are supporting our efforts now as well. The sports field was created and named in his honor as a place where young people could gather – as school and community. Over the years, some of the work of this area has become, to be honest, more of nightmare than a field of dreams. The field and playgrounds have lost some of their luster and have fallen into disrepair. There are safety and security issues we need to address immediately as well some environmental issues that we would like to take on this summer. While efforts have been made, more is needed!

Over the past few months we have called together a working group of parents and parishioners to assist us in setting a direction that will improve the area, respect our financial realities and make the sports complex an even more vibrant part of the life here. It is our hope to regrade the entire field, put in a half-court basketball court, begin the work of repairing and improving the playgrounds as well putting in place an effective maintenance effort for the years ahead.

To do this, we need your help. Would you consider assisting by making a one-time donation to this effort? You can make the donation electronically at olqany.org or by completing this form and returning it in the collection over the next few Sundays. In the next few weeks, we will be contacting all of our known alumni and reaching out to them for support as well.

So many from both our parish and our school still find the playground a place of community, of sport and connection. We want this to be even more the case in the years ahead as we restore this field in memory of a young person who lost his life too soon! Thank you for your support in helping to make our "Field of Dreams" a reality for the students and community of Our Lady Queen of Apostles and St. John the Evangelist!
