FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Faith Formation, Children's Liturgy of the Word and Family Liturgy

SEARCHING FOR GOOD SHEPHERDS

Dear Parish Family:

This week, we are putting some focus on our Faith Formation program and asking you to consider becoming a part of this vital ministry in our parish. What a weekend to talk about it too as both the first reading and the Gospel speak of the need for “good shepherds”. This means me and you!

I have been a catechist since I was in 8th grade. So for about 32 years I have attempted to serve in this role in working in special education in my home parish when I was 13, teaching 6th grade religion when I was 14, working with the RCIA and youth ministry all the way up to leading a small group in our Level 7 Faith Formation program last year. Each year with all of its opportunities for encounter certainly had its challenges but ultimately is a life giving experience.

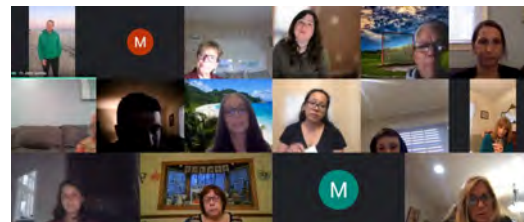
We are blessed in our parish to have an incredible Director of Faith Formation in Michelle Pirraglia. In the nearly five years Michelle has been at this work she has redesigned curriculums, helped implement a vision of parent engagement, adapted to changing circumstances, trained and guided catechists, and handles the conflicts and challenges that come with change (and has to put up with me). This past year, particularly, Michelle helped to design an online Confirmation preparation program while moving our faith formation program to its next step—a family faith formation program—while adapting to celebrating the sacraments in different ways to keep everyone as safe as possible. SJE is pretty blessed to have Michelle in this crucial role for our parish.

As we begin to “open up” again for a new year of faith formation, we need your help! We need parents, grandparents, young people, and parishioners from all walks of life to consider “pitching in” to serve. And...there are plenty of ways to do this so if you're afraid of standing up in front of a classroom before 15-20 kids, don't worry.

Confirmation Preparation. Our Level 7, Level 8 and Confirmation Candidate Preparation program (that takes place in the Fall) are all based on the Gospel of and Letters of John. We need parishioners to serve—even at times with another person—as small group leaders. You would work to share faith with our young people based on a presentation or lesson presented to the entire large group. Then, you would try to stay connected in the weeks we don't meet. The goal is not only to transmit faith but to form a small Christian community allowing young people to know they belong to the Church and are valued and beloved.

Family in Faith Program. Families in Grade 1-6 participate in the Family in Faith program. Here parents come once a month to learn about important topics in our faith and then share that information with their children. (It's not quite that simple....but it attempts to bring families together in faith.) We are in need of volunteers to assist at some of these events and to assist when we have events and moments that bring parents and children together, particularly in preparing our young people for Reconciliation and Eucharist. The commitment in this part of faith formation varies so reach out to learn more. Rest assured that you are wanted and needed! As there is no “home-study” program in Faith Formation, a great deal of help and support is needed.

In addition to our Faith Formation program, we are in need of additional parishioners to assist with **Children's Liturgy of the Word**. Through this ministry, parishioners serve as shepherds by leading young people through the Liturgy of the Word at Mass. They lead children out to the school after the Opening Prayer and then bring them back after the Universal Prayer. In between, they work to bring the Word alive for our young people. Our **Family Life Ministry** is another way to assist in forming young people and their families in our parish. Through a variety of efforts and initiatives—from breakfasts to sandwich making to service experiences to so much more—the members of this ministry work to bring families together in the work and service of the Church. So you can see we have great hopes to engage and empower families in the year ahead. What will make the difference? YOU! Perhaps you are a teacher (retired or active) or work with young people in another settings (Social worker, counselor, aide, support, nurse, doctor)? Maybe you have a great love of the faith? Maybe you are a grandparent who has walked the road of faith for many years? Believe me, young people need your wisdom and witness. Perhaps you're involved in ministry already and are looking for something new? Maybe none of these and maybe all of these! Please give it some thought in the weeks ahead.

Why did I start teaching all these years ago? I thought I wanted to be a teacher and wanted to try and make a difference in the lives of other people. I still keep in touch with students and families from that first class 32 years ago and they with me. Community formed! Why did I stay? That opportunity to form community—to help lead it and to be helped by it—made a difference in my life and in the lives of those I sought to assist.

It is real easy to become jaded and cynical about young people and their families and the Church. It's easy to say "kids today..." or "parents today..." and there is truth to some of this frustration. Instead of that causing us to be filled with frustration or ring our hands, how about doing something about it? Becoming part of our Faith Formation program is one of those ways! Here the Lord is appointing you to serve our young people and their families "so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and none shall be missing" (Jeremiah 23:4).

Please pray for me.

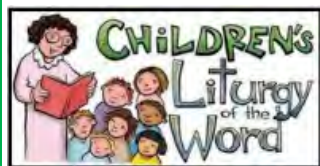

My name is Louis Mattiolo working on my Eagle Scout. My project is the creation of a **memorial** at the **Center Moriches VFW** to honor our veteran service and display the military conflicts. The fundraiser will be the replacement of the current uneven walkway with a **"Walkway of Heroes"** using personalized engraved pavers representing veterans. Discussion Questions

1. Imagine being a caretaker of people in a way that a shepherd is for sheep. What can you do about the fear people experience all over the world due to injustice? Can you do anything to remedy any of the injustice? Is there anything you can do about unfair situations in your own living area?
2. "In Christ Jesus you who once were far off have become near by the blood of Christ." If we are one in the body of Christ, is the Eucharist an important means for breaking down dividing walls among us?
3. What does Jesus do in this Gospel story that is an example of good shepherding? Doesn't he have pity and teach? Discuss compassion versus power as attributes of leadership.
