A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

Martha & Mary ~ A Gospel Reflection (Luke 10:38-42)

Each time I hear today's gospel, I realize that I have a long way to go. I probably identify more with Martha rather than Mary. It does not take long for me to become anxious and preoccupied with worldly agendas or concerns. I do my best to start off each day in prayer. Several times a week I pray for a few hours early in the morning before celebrating mass. But once the day gets started, I can find myself getting anxious at times or preoccupied with all the demands and expectations that are placed on me. It does not take me long to lose my way. Yes, there are better days than others. But I can easily relate

with Martha more than Mary throughout most of the day.

of the day.

As I get older, I do make the effort to pray longer and to sit in silence. However, there are times even when I pray, that I worry about what I have to do and all that needs to be done. Yet when I trust more in God's saving power, my days flow so much better. My days become more grace-filled and fulfilling in the Lord. For the most part, I think that we can all easily identify with Martha because of all the demands and pressures of life. It is so easy for us to get anxious and worried over so many things, especially those which we have no control over, instead of relying more on the goodness of the Lord.

No question that Martha did the right thing in providing hospitality and in turning to Jesus when she felt neglected and overwhelmed with the demands of life. For me, I find this gospel story relevant because, like Martha, we can become anxious so easily. We get so busy so fast and easily preoccupied with so many things that we forget about why we are doing the things we are doing in the first place. We sadly forget about the importance and the presence of Christ in our lives

Jesus tells Martha that Mary chose the better part, not the easier part. We know it is not easy to be still and silent in today's world. It is no different today than back then. And today we have more technology and resources that pull us away or distract us from spending more time in prayer with God! Yet in today's gospel, Jesus is reminding us how to begin each day. We need to begin each day with Him and place more of our trust and understanding in His saving power and Word. We need to be more attentive to His Word in the silence of our hearts. We just need to be still and focused on His Divine presence so that He can refresh our souls with His wisdom and grace, and renew us in His spirit and love. We need to trust more in His Word and commands and rely on Him more often for peace and understanding.

The truth is that it is so easy for us to get caught up in so many worldly matters. No wonder why this gospel is so real and relevant for us, because it is so easy for us to become busy-bodies all the time. It is not that the Lord does not appreciate or value Martha's hospitality and service towards Him. The problem is she is not enjoying her time with the Lord. In last weekend's gospel, the Parable of the Good Samaritan focused on the service aspect of our faith, and today's gospel story of Martha and Mary focuses more on the contemplative nature of our faith. Today's gospel focuses more on the primacy of

God's Word in our lives! Today's encounter that Martha and Mary have with the Lord reminds us of the importance of God's Word in our lives—how God's Word gives our lives direction, purpose and meaning. It sets crooked ways straight. It lifts us up. It transforms us and reassures us of God's promise for humanity. God's Word is our road map in life and our pathway to eternity. It is clear in today's gospel that God's Word leads us into ministry. Ministry loses it meaning without reflecting on God's Word. It is evident that ministry, prayer and contemplation go hand in hand. However, ministry is

subordinate to God's Word. In other words, the proclamation of God's Word must be superior. It must come first, if we are going to bear fruit and be effective in continuing the work of redemption in being of service to one another!

In choosing the better part, Mary was able to spend more time with her guest. She was able to spend more time with Jesus contemplating on His Word. She really made the conscious effort to stop everything she was doing to just be still and silent when the Lord was in her midst. She knew how important it was to listen to Jesus. It is one thing to hear the Word of God; it is another thing to reflect on what He is sharing with us. This is where silence and discipline come in. We need to set time apart each day to be one with the Lord in prayer

among the busyness of life. We need to remember that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life, and that He alone has the words of everlasting life. We need to remember that Jesus is our hope and joy in life — that He alone is sufficient and the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings. He alone can bring us rest from our labors.

When reflecting on this gospel passage, I do not doubt that Mary assisted Martha in preparing for Jesus' visit to their home, as it was custom to do so. But once the Lord arrived, she was able to connect with Him more and settle down a bit knowing of His wisdom and redemptive power. The challenge for us each day is to try to do the same. The challenge for us is finding balance in our lives when it comes to hospitality and prayer. If we are going to be effective in advancing the Kingdom of God in humble service to one another, then we need to place ourselves before the Lord with complete faith and trust in God's will.

In the end, today's gospel is telling us to slow down a bit. It tells us to take some quiet time each day to be still and silent before the Lord. Today's gospel is telling us to stop rushing around all the time and to be still and silent more often. Living the Christian life is learning how to prioritize. What is clear in today's gospel is the importance and primacy of God's Word. Even in the busyness of life and worldly responsibilities, we need to find that time to be alone and still before the Lord who refreshes our souls and reassures us of the importance of keeping God first before all things. Once we turn to Jesus in greater faith and understanding of His Lordship and keep Him first and at the center of our lives, everything else begins to fall into its proper place. Life itself becomes so much more joyful and meaningful with all the people God has placed in our lives. Everything we do begins to make more sense once we make more time for Jesus in our lives!





Moms on the Journey



PILGRIMS OF HOPE

To be a godparent (or a sponsor for someone who is receiving Confirmation) a Catholic must meet the following requirements. Thes are not "guidelines" here at St. John's. These are the requirements of the universal Catholic Church and are the same all over the world. Different parishes may choose to document these requirements differently. The role of sponsor is an important one!The godparent (sponsor) must be a fully initiated Catholic who supports the person receiving the sacrament through their own example of Catholic living and a desire to help the person learn more about the Catholic faith through prayer, discussion and instruction. The Catholic Church has the following requirements for godparents/sponsors:

- The sponsor must be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church which means he or she has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist (Communion) and Confirmation.
- The godparent/sponsor must be at least 16 years of age (a person younger than 16 must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church)
- The godparent/sponsor must have an active life of faith in the Catholic Church and provide good example of Catholic Living.
- If the godparent/sponsor is married, he/she must be married in the Catholic Church
- The godparent/sponsor cannot be either parent of the person being Baptized or Confirmed.

Now that you know a little more about Baptism... spread the word! We have a wonderful parish at St. John's and we are growing every day!



He holds a doctorate in Sacred Theology from Boston College and until his appointment as an Assistant to the Superior General of his Order, he taught Systematic Theology and Liturgy at Hekima University College, a Jesuit School of Theology, Peace and International Relations in Nairobi, Kenya. Sobornost is honored and looking forward to partnering with Fr. Felix in this retreat day.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

We are touched in many ways by the people we encounter everyday. It is always a good, and even a great touch when we are welcomed into their presence and they are just happy to see us. That is magnified when we have the same feeling in return - being welcoming, accepting, and appreciating who they are. To spend quality time with others we give our attention, ears, and heart. At times, we can have difficult issues or situations to resolve, but the way to peace, hope, and a strengthening bond is to make our welcome full wholehearted.

This past week I read and reflected on this quote from Pope Benedict XVI: "We become truly human when we are touched by God." In today's Gospel (Luke 10:38-42) we have the familiar passage where Jesus is welcomed into the house of two sisters, Martha and Mary. Martha was busy with preparing for his presence and felt her sister was not helping her, she was just sitting at the feet of Jesus, welcoming Him with her undivided attention. While both sisters were so grateful for Jesus' presence in their home, Mary gave Him her undivided, personal attention. While Martha focused on the physical actions of preparing food and an atmosphere of welcome, Mary saw the gift Jesus was to her as well as to her sister. Jesus made it clear that "Mary chose the better part and it shall not be taken from her."

Everyday is an opportunity to welcome Jesus into our presence as we give Him our time, attention, and gratitude in prayer. Our faith, hope, and love are strengthened when we can recognize who this Jesus is that is listening to us. But it is so easy to get distracted in prayer and say the words without allowing our attentiveness to Jesus who is listening to us speak to Him and appreciating our presence to

Him. We have to "turn off" our electronic devices as well as our fixation on the past,



present, and future, and focus on the Jesus we are talking to and spending time with. The same is true as we come to celebrate Mass together. Through rituals, spoken words from scripture, and songs and prayers of thanks, praise, sorrow and petition, we are enriched by knowing that our presence allows God to hear our prayers, calm our fears, forgive our failures and inspire us to see the gift of who God is to us by becoming that welcome gift to one another. The words of Jesus to Martha about her sister Mary in today's Gospel are not a rebuke, but an invitation to find and experience the wonder and joy of Mary. Jesus says to us each time we pray, "Thank you for giving me your time, attention, concerns, and thoughts. Yes, as Pope Benedict said: "We become truly human when we are touched by God."

I close with this simple prayer from St. Mother Teresa:

Jesus is the Sacrifice offered at the Holy Mass for the sins and the world and mine. Jesus is the Word - to be spoken. Jesus is the Truth - to be told. Jesus is the Way - to be walked. Jesus is the Light - to be lit. Jesus is the Life - to be lived. Jesus is the Love - to be loved. Jesus is the Joy - to be shared. Jesus is the Sacrifice - to be offered. Jesus is the Peace - to be given. Jesus is the Bread of Life - to be eaten Jesus is the Hungry - to be fed. Jesus is the Thirsty - to be satiated. Jesus is the Naked - to be clothed. Jesus is the Homeless - to be taken in. Jesus is the Sick - to be healed.

Jesus is the Lonely - to be loved.


