# A Message from Grand Knight Fames O'Connor...





The scriptures reveal to us that Jesus is indeed the Good Shepherd. In today's first reading, we hear the Lord say, "woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pastures." Jesus gets Himself in trouble by calling out the priests and pharisees who were selfishly tending their own needs

rather than shepherding the Jewish people who were lost, misled, anxious, depressed and hungry. In today's gospel, Jesus welcomes back the twelve Apostles from their mission of sharing the good news after being sent out with no food, money or change of clothes. Note, after hearing all they had done and taught during their travels, Jesus doesn't coddle them by telling them that they did great and answered every question, he instead invites them to simply go to a secluded place and rest. They boarded a boat to cross the Sea of Galilee for much deserved respite. Jesus and the Apostles arrive only to find that a mass of people, a new "Exodus", so desperate for a Shepherd who will feed and nurture them, reached the secluded place before the boat did. Jesus was "moved with pity" we are told, and "began to teach them many things." There would be no rest this day after all.

Sometimes, even after a job well done and we have earned a rest, circumstances too important to ignore, spur us back to action. This is what happened on the shore that day, and this happens to us now and then. I spent nearly thirty years as an FDNY Firefighter and there have been countless times that first responders mitigate one emergency only to be called out to immediately respond to another. It is the nature of the job, I suppose.

I joined the Knights of Columbus to help

out in the community and the Parish. I became a catechist when my children began their faith formation classes. I recognized that more men were needed to spread the Gospel. Our K of C Council is full of men of all backgrounds interested in making a difference. My faith has strengthened as a result of being in the company of fellow Catholic gentlemen who are resolute in their faith. We strive to set an example that prayer, faith, charity and actions improve our community. Our recent Food Drive that helped Ernie's place stock up for the summer, and improvements to the Prayer garden with the Blessed McGivney statue and prayer bench, dedicated in honor of Fr. Felix, are examples of our commitment to prayer and the Parish. The blue blazers we wear at Mass and many functions show our solidarity and commitment to one another; the volunteer work we do within the Parish shows our commitment to all of you. Come socialize with us at our Lobsterfest on August 24th.

The K of C will be hosting a Patriotic Rosary at 7 PM in Seton Chapel on July 24th and every month until the election to pray for our Country and that our elected leaders trust God to guide their hearts. I welcome you to join us for one or more of our Rosaries. Prayer is especially needed now. Life is busy and putting another date on the schedule is challenging. We can all use more rest. This is one of those times however, when rest may have to take a backseat to the important work at hand. Perhaps recent events will "spur us to action" as well. Come pray with us as a community.

Gentlemen, please consider responding to Jesus' call to shepherd those in our community who are today as desperate and misled as the multitude of those who were standing on the seashore awaiting Jesus and the Apostles. 





# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"Being up in arms about everyone and everything contaminates the ground of the soul and turns it into a barren land." That is a quote from Cardinal Ratzinger, who later became Pope Benedict XVI. Today, it is all too easy to get "up in arms" with so many people and so many situations that trouble us. With that thought in mind, I was particularly struck by the Gospel at Mass this past Monday (Matthew 10:34-11:1) where Jesus says: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Light was shed on this passage by these words of St. Bonaventure who lived 1221-1243 and whose feast day we celebrated last Monday: "Jesus both invites us to the summit of virtue and shows us the way there." His summit was freely, willingly, and lovingly giving His life on the cross for us. He who is pure goodness, love, and truth allowed those created in the image and likeness of God, as we all are, to inflict an unjust and terrible death on Him. Jesus did not get up in arms. We know His words on cross were not words of anger, condemnation, or revenge. Even there He lived the summit of virtue through the hopeful o f mercy, love, words compassion. Jesus' last words to His mother were words of perfect filial love: "When Jesus saw his mother\* and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to mother, "Woman, behold, son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour, the disciple took her into his home." (John 19:26-27)

The point that jumps out here is that if

we take Jesus and His love seriously, we will find ourselves living on the summit of virtue with love not



only for our mother, father, son, and daughter, but for all whose lives we encounter everyday and throughout our lives. On the cross, Jesus not only showed concern for His mother but also for those who crucified Him (Luke 23:34): "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." And to the "good thief" He said, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23:43)

How patient, hopeful, and loving am I everyday? Most news reports we read or watch present bad or negative news. Jesus was true good news in the world he lived in 2000 years ago. For us who embrace Him and put our trust in Him, He is the light in the darkness that is illuminated by His presence and Spirit in our lives.

I close with this simple prayer from St. Mother Teresa, a prayer I pray everyday:

Jesus is the Sacrifice offered at the Holy Mass for the sins of the world and mine.

Jesus is the Word - to be spoken.

Jesus is the Truth - to be told.

Jesus is the Way - to be walked.

Jesus is the Light - to be lit. Jesus is the Life - to be lived.

*Iesus is the Love - to be loved.* 

Jesus is the Love - to be loved. Jesus is the Joy - to be shared.

Jesus is the Sacrifice - to be offered.

Jesus is the Peace - to be given.

Jesus is the Bread of Life - to be eaten.

Jesus is the Hungry - to be fed.

Jesus is the Thirsty - to be satiated.

Jesus is the Naked - to be clothed.

Jesus is the Homeless - to be taken in.

Jesus is the Sick - to be healed.

Jesus is the Lonely - to be loved.







# SJE Safe Environment Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional billing purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.
