#### A NEW "DAWN" AT OLQA

Dear Parish Family:

I am very happy to announce that on Saturday, August 1, 2020, **Mrs. Dawn Waller** will become the new principal of Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional Catholic School.

This March, we formed a search committee, led by Sister Kathy Schleuter, CSJ, which consisted of nearly ten individuals from a variety of backgrounds inside and outside of OLQA. Nearly ten candidates applied from up and down the eastern coast of the United States. Candidates went through an extensive process including responding to simulations, communication strategies, interviews and more. It was not an easy process and it should not be. This is important work. Of the candidates, Mrs. Waller was recommended to the pastors of the four supporting parishes. After final interviews, Mrs. Waller was offered and accepted the position.

This is an extraordinarily trying time to be an educational leader, particularly in Catholic eduction. Mrs. Waller has shown the passion and the desire to take on this role in this time. She is a parishioner at St. John the Evangelist and has served as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Her presence ensures a good tradition and stability for the school. She has taught at OLQA for many years and in other Catholic schools before coming to OLQA and has served as the Assistant Principal in the 2019-20 school year at OLQA and on the leadership team since 2018. Mrs. Waller is a dedicated teacher with

special focuses in the area of special education and technology. She will bring all of this experience to this unique time in Catholic education. As you supported, encouraged, and prayed for me over the past two years as principal, I ask that you do the same for Mrs. Waller. I am excited for all she is going to bring to the students and families at OLQA. Great things are in store for the Catholic School in Center Moriches.

As you know I became the principal of OLQA in August 2018 after the resignation of the previous principal. With a lot of guidance, support, and encouragement (particularly of Bishop Brennan—how could I say no?), I took on this position in addition to serving as the Pastor at St. John the Evangelist R.C. Church. I would be dishonest if I said it has not been a lot. It has been a lot! I would also be dishonest if I said I did not love it. What an honor and privilege for me!

You know I spent 13 years working in a Catholic high school before entering the seminary. Those were great years, too. I presumed that leaving to enter seminary also meant the end of my work in schools. Never did I imagine I would be back in the ministry of education, working with young people and their families, teachers and incredible staff each day. I have learned a great deal in these two years

and I hope, in some way, I have been able to offer something to the life and tradition of the Catholic School in Center Moriches.

When I started in this role, I started to pick up the phrase "always gratitude". I think it came from a place of anxiety to be honest. I needed to remember in the midst of some pretty tough times and days that there were always reasons for gratitude, particularly the students at OLQA. I am indebted to those incredible students and families who were open to new ideas and ways and so supportive. The present faculty of OLQA

understand the mission and the vocation of a Catholic school teacher. They get it! I am also grateful to the staffs of both SJE and OLQA who have had to take on more due to my lesser presence in both places. The leadership team at SJE and the leadership team I formed at OLQA took on a great deal for



which they did not necessarily sign up! In a special way, I must thank Mrs. Grace Halversen, the Administrative Assistant at OLQA. "Miss Grace" offered great wisdom and support, welcomed new ideas and directions, and poured (and pours) out her heart to all at OLQA. What a gift to our community!

We are in the midst of changing times in education and Catholic education in our diocese, in particular. The Morning Star Initiative, in coordination with the Education Department, is working hard to make our existing Catholic schools as strong and vital as they can be in these days. We are looking forward to a new school year— IN SCHOOL—but mindful of and prepared for any public health issues that come our way. We are working to form young people in the Catholic faith in the midst of a world that struggles to accept the value and sacredness of life, the dignity of all people, the commitment to the poor and marginalized and the care of earth. We go through these times confident that God walks with us for "we know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Please continue to support and pray for the work of Catholic schools, particularly Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional Catholic School. Please pray for Mrs. Waller and, if you can, please say a prayer for me.



#### FROM THE DESK OF SISTER ANN—NOT ONLY FOR THE YOUNG AT HEART



This year, we Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, are celebrating the 175th Anniversary of our founding. Unfortunately, we had to postpone the big celebration that was planned with our other two IHM communities: the IHMs in Philadelphia, PA, and the one in Monroe, MI, as well as the OSPs (Oblate Sisters of Providence, Baltimore, MD.)

Our foundress, Theresa Maxis Duchemin, along with our co-founder, Fr. Louis Florent Gillet, a member of the Redemptionist Fathers, started a mission with three of our newly formed IHMs in Monroe to educate the young women emigrating from Canada. It was an interesting beginning that is too long to explain now but I will at a future date.

Many of you who have lived in Suffolk County had never heard of the IHMs until Sister Helen Ann Charlebois came to St. John's to serve as a principal after Sister Eileen Martin retired. Our congregation never made it beyond route 110! We had an offer by a pastor to open a school farther out east, but it never materialized. We, however, served in many schools in Nassau County, three in which I had taught – St Mary's Manhasset (my Alma Mater K-12); St. Raymonds, East Rockaway; and St. Dominic's, Oyster Bay. The other school where our community served but has unfortunately closed was St. Peter's, Port Washington. We also had schools in Queens and Brooklyn as well as in New York City. St. Ephrem's in Brooklyn is still open but only three of our Sisters reside there. One teaches in the school; the rest of the convent is occupied as a retirement home for, I believe, the Brooklyn Sisters of St. Joseph. The convent was constructed with an elevator, so there was little renovation needed.

I think that our first convent and school in Nassau was St. Peter's c. 1925; the following was St. Mary's in 1926. My parents moved into that parish on November 1, 1927; My sister was born November 28th that same month!

Sometimes I feel guilty that many of you never had the chance to meet our Sisters. We were well known for our hospitality and education. Our College (now Marywood University) was the first Catholic college for women in the North East (founded in 1915), and the first to have a web site. We educated Sisters from many different congregations and countries and still do. Now what my point is in all this? Well, as many of you know, the Sisters worked in parishes and schools without receiving any retirement benefits. In fact, when we first applied for Social Security, we had to pay the government for 5 years back pay, which was a very difficult thing to do. As a result, we are constantly being challenged to raise funds for our sick and elderly, which is increasing almost daily, PLEASE READ THE SHORT NOTE BELOW






